





FROM THE **GENERAL SECRETARY'S** DESK



Dear friends,

Day by day, the large areas of human reality such as philosophy, science, the arts, economics and politics have been as if handed over to the world view.

But now we are living in an age of explosion of music and performance where the art of music and other kinds of performance abounds in media including gospel music industry. As educators all of us will agree that these days the percentage of students enrolling for

specialised subjects like visual communication, sound engineering, culture and media keeps on increasing. We do agree that the art of music exists, as do all the arts, for the enjoyment of man. It occupies our thoughts through the stimulation of our senses to bring pleasure to man. That's the reason for music and drama in media cause spell bound viewers at all age group who become addictive to watch them as well.

As the body of the church, Christian educators and parents are called to Strengthen our Faith by Discovering Biblical basis for Art and Music. Unlike an atheist who has no creator nor a non-Christian who may be working towards man's glory ,only a believer in Christ will be able to create a meaningful art within the Biblical world view glorifying only God the creator. Only in the Christian worldview, can truth, beauty and laws be accounted as reflections of the character of the God of the Bible. The need for today are true artists who will permeate the music of our time and bring honour to the name of Christ. While concentrating on evangelism let us not forget that God is the God of life and that the Bible teaches people how to live, how to deal with our world, God's creation. A strong, biblically-based creational theology encourages us as Christians to get involved in all areas of life. For a believer in Christ , there is no sacred/secular divide. There's no area outside the Lordship of Jesus Christ, no exclusion zone, or secular territory. Whether it's Bible studies or musical studies, acts of service or acts of Shakespeare, church attendance or dance performance, he/she will be interested in all of it. Deeply rooted in the word of God, the Bible is the cultural mandate for them to communicate the truth through stories,

poetry and song and any kind of artistic forms. The faith life will enable a believer to be involved in dramatic art forms, telling stories, exploring deep themes of identity and what it means to be human.

In the faith journey of a performer, all of human culture and creativity like visual arts, music, and drama have proper place in their lives enabling them neither to idolise the arts/worship the arts nor reject them, rather returning them to God in praise. Otherwise, Christian faith becomes divorced from real life and the real influence as Christians in the world is lost.

For everything created by God is good, and nothing is to be rejected if it is received with thanksgiving, for it is made holy by the word of God and prayer.

- 1 Timothy 4:4-5

Like any field of work, art in its many forms can certainly glorify evil, and that is what makes a lot of Christians and believers fear and disdain the arts in general. In contrast, music, dance, drama in a believer's mind will not be merelv an entertainment which have little spiritual value distracting people but rather a real work of evangelism. While toiling with hard work of practising, developing to bring out a good art as a good work ,the believer as a performer will not be confused by wondering whether it is a waste of time or feel guilty of enjoyment and performance. Instead their performance will display the image of God the Creator, highlighting the truth that the arts cannot by themselves bring anyone into relationship with God but can only point to God. The arts cannot deal with one's sin, only the cross can.

Any good work which glorify God must proceed from true faith and be done according to God's Word.

(Rom. 14:23; Pr. 21:4).

Secondly, we are called to Sharpen our Focus to Develop and nurture good art. While we aspire to involve in Christian music industry or interested in any kind of performance or when we come across the youngsters who are struggling with such passion, we have to be extremely conscious about the quality of the performance. Dr. Calvin Jones is a concert and recording artist and a member of the Emmaus Orthodox Presbyterian Church in Fort Collins, Colorado. Calvin has four piano albums released internationally as well as many soundtrack credits. I am sure the following characteristics highlighted in his article will edify us to focus on the eternal values rather than on earthly values.

- Absolute Truth has to be manifested in music or any kind of performance including the lyrics in the Christian music industry against the half truths and the lie of devil like denying the characteristic of God as creator, humanism or self salvation or compromising with the place of sin and its effects projected in media. It is very important to project the truth that real world is eternal and the guilt of any kind of sin will be judged by God and burned with fire on the last day.
- Beware of the emotions of love and sentimentalism abound in both pop and Christian music while the actions of love defined by God's laws are conspicuously absent. The easy love deception has had severe conseq- uences like broken families and many being unfaithful in their

- marriages. Love is keeping God's commandments with respect to God and to our neighbour. "If you love me you will keep my commandments" (Jn.14:15). It is quite important to highlight that the choice of permanent salvation experienced as a gift of grace by the unchangeable God of the universe includes His true and unfailing love for us.
- The God given aesthetic standards of music will exhibit outstanding qualities like good order in melody, arrangement and instrumentation which flow easily and logically from the melody to produce songs that are lovely and beautiful. Such well crafted art when performed with excellence, are readily accessible, and memorable inspiring the hearts of the listeners to courage, faithfulness, love, persistence, selfsacrifice, hard work, and other noble and godly traits. Christian artists have to avoid shallow and simplistic performance of any kind. It must not be mediocre, unpolished, poorly crafted, of trivial subject matter, etc. Excellence in the art of music achieved by professing Christians will do much more in exalting the name of Christ than evangelization with mediocrity.
- The lyrics and scripts of music and any kind of performance by Christian artists must highlight what is right, good and just from Biblical perspective reflecting the perfect justice of God found in His law since God's justice demands that the evildoer is punished and the righteous rewarded. Most artists today are socialist, egalitarian, and environmentalist in their thinking and many are also drug-addicts and perverts. As a result, contents of

most of the modern music consistently reflect the wrong ideas of our culture or the unjust notion of calling good evil and evil good and relativism of humanism and propagate suicidal music.

The contents of good music must promote purity in thought, word, and deed. While the devil is vigilant in attracting millions of people for momentary pleasures through unethical, impure, vulgar, violent and chaotic scenes promoting sex and death through pop videos, the Christian music industry has to communicate through modest dress and beautiful scenes to portray God's laws for human relationships.

Finally, we are called to be **Successful** in a Fruitful performance which is **Directional** towards art as a good work.

When Adam and Eve were created in the image of God .the best works of art and music were also created in sinless perfection before their fall. When man sinned and fell by wanting to be God, the image of God in sinful man and specifically his works of art and music were marred by sin and hence were no longer accurately reflect the perfect order, beauty, and purity of God and His creation. Both good art and bad art started existing in this world because of sin. As the consequence of sin, one must now work and struggle to produce good art and music. This is too often reflected in the Christian's art which qualify neither as a good art nor as a good work. Sometimes there may be good artists but their work may not be good. Unlike a carpenter or farmer who does his work with excellence to receive his/her earthly reward or appreciation, we are called for excellent art as a good work to

be rewarded in heaven. Hence in this wicked world, there's a vital need for God's children to be driven by the divine revelation and move forward to interpret and understand the general revelation of this world to judge good art from bad. Sometimes it may not be easy to learn to say no to certain things when we need to do the work of focusing on what is good, pure, and worthy of praise. Through our redemption in Christ we are not only called to regenerate people who produce good fruit by producing good art that is also a good work, but also to unregenerate people who produce bad fruit (Mt. 7:17).

"Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men..." Colossians 3:23.

"Faith in the science Classroom" by Dr. R.H.Duncan Lyngdoh encourage teachers to practice integrating the faith and values in any discipline including music and performance. 

As a university faculty, I have taught organic chemistry for decades to M.Sc. students, using the direct classroom teaching mode (before the pandemic necessitated online teaching). I have sometimes found opportunities to communicate elements of the theistic worldview (without any imposition) into my teaching, especially with reference to biochemistry and molecular biology. Being present before the students, and observing their reactions, it is possible to sense their deep interest in the mysteries of life itself. I have no idea if there are any atheists among them, but if so, one does hope that my humble presentations would lead them to think matters over. To be sure, these considerations go beyond mere molecules and chemical reactions to extend to biology, psychology, philosophy, and even questions regarding the meaning of life.

DNA is the key macromolecule of all life. When teaching about DNA and its role for the continuation and shaping of life, I have raised the question of to what extent the DNA content of our cells goes to determine the type of person we

become. There is a school of thought which supposes that human beings are the victims, so to say, of their DNA, and that DNA content is the primary force that moulds the nature and character of an individual. It's all in the genes, they say, and nothing can change this. When I put forward this line of thinking to the students, there may often be some feeling of dismay among many of them. After all, some scientists have linked certain genes in humans to undesirable traits like schizoid personality, psychopathy and even alcoholism. For some people, this may ring of fatalism and a passive surrender to a destiny predetermined by one's own DNA.

It is then that I remind my students that environment is a factor one cannot ignore. This is related to the old question of nature versus nurture. There is no doubt that loving parents and wise upbringing make a powerful impact on the formation of good character. The things that we experience in the course of life, whether good or bad, are bound to have an impact upon our life and personality. It is a sad fact that traumatic events, especially early in life, can affect a person's life and outlook in a very negative way. It is known that epigenetic events (external to DNA) are involved in the life of even a single cell at the molecular level. How much more do events around us interact with our psyche, with all its complexities through childhood and adolescence, and stamp themselves upon our lives and personalities!

And yet—is that all there is to it? Do nature (i.e., DNA) and nurture (environment and upbringing) have the last word as to the kind of person we are? Here it is that I bring up the element

of personal responsibility. Each human being can develop, often to a great degree, a sense of charge over one's own self. This helps a person to take steps that go to form and mould his character and personality. One's own decisions do matter in determining the type of person one turns out to be. Wrong decisions shape our character for the worse, while good and wise actions shape our character for the better. By assuming responsibility over our own selves, we can face the challenge of the laws of genetics, and also confront the issues that our upbringing and environment have imposed upon us. Such an attitude can go a long way to enable us to grow and develop as individuals along life's pathway. I do hope that incorporating such ideas in the course of my teaching chemistry has given some element of hope to the learners, and has challenged them to rise above the despair of pure determinism.

This is contrary to the philosophy of materialistic reductionism, which reduces the human person to a mere machine without a soul or will of his own. There are scientists who argue that the thoughts we think, the emotions we feel, and even the decisions we make are nothing more than molecules moving around in our brains. Such a bleak concept completely dehumanises us and robs life of all meaning. Yet, there is, so to say, a "ghost in the machine", where we are in fact greater than the sum of all our parts. As conscious beings, our consciousness goes beyond mere physical and chemical processes, particularly when it comes to consciousness of one's own self. This self-consciousness is a distinctive shared by all humans, and by nothing else in this universe.

Coming back to DNA, I often refer during my lectures to the Nobel laureate Francis Collins, the head of the Human Genome Project, who is a committed believer. He tackles the issue of the complexity of the DNA molecule, and the marvel of how it can store and replicate genetic information. He once ended a prestigious lecture on DNA by taking up his guitar and singing the hymn "How great Thou art!", thus testifying to his faith in the Creator God who designed and formed DNA. The chances that such a complex entity as life itself, with the wonder of DNA, could have all come into existence by itself are indeed infinitesimally small. This is freely acknowledged even by unbelievers.

The handiwork of God, present clearly in His creation, reflects His glory (Ps 19:1). It is all a matter of what attitude we adopt when faced with all this evidence. Even a humble platform like a chemistry classroom can be a place where the evidence presented can point one to God. If materialistic atheism is a preconceived axiom to which one decides to cling, the whole of life will turn out to be a matter of "pointless indifference" (Richard Dawkins). However, if we are open to the concept of a sovereign Creator, whose glory is evident in the universe and in all life, this can lead us on to greater light, and finally bring the true meaning of life to our hearts. The choice is ours to freely make.

A Letter from a teenager: "I often feel useless. I am not very intelligent. My brother always does better in school than I and I am hopeless in sports. But the worst thing is that I am ugly. At home and school, people call me nicknames and laugh at me. I have no true friend. I worry about these things a lot, and sometimes I wish I had never been born. My birth was a mistake anyway; I mean my parents never wanted me."

These feelings of loneliness, being unwanted, uselessness, etc. are not uncommon. They are looking for understanding friendships. Mother Theresa said, "Loneliness and feeling of being unwanted is the most terrible poverty."

Everyone deserves a caring friend:

Friends prevent isolation and loneliness and give the person a chance to experience needed companionship. Friends can also increase your sense of belonging and purpose, boost our happiness and reduce your stress. Friends bring more happiness into our lives than virtually anything else. Friendships have a huge impact on our mental health and happiness. Good friends relieve stress, provide comfort and joy, prevent loneliness and isolation. Developing close friendships can also have a powerful impact on your physical health.

Good friends improve our selfconfidence and self-worth and help us cope

with trauma and avoid unhealthy lifestyle habits, such as excessive drinking, smoking or lack of exercise. Friends can help you celebrate good times and provide support during bad times. King Solomon said, "A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for a time of adversity" Pro.17:17. Jesus called his disciples friends. "I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you" John 15: 15.

Our situation:

Studies indicate that about 9.8 million Indians aged 13-17 years suffer from serious mental illness. According to the World Health Organisation (WHO), every 3 seconds a person somewhere in the world tries to kill themselves and every 40 seconds one succeeds. Around 8.00.000 people die due to suicide every year. The unfortunate truth is that onethird of them happens in India.

School is the second home of a child and plays an important part in the development of their life. Along with academic development, schools must also be equipped to care for their emotional health. Trauma and mental distress in children and adolescence can leave a lasting impact on their lives. They can cause serious handicaps in emotional well-being, healthy relationships, vocational pursuits, etc.

Whether a child had to live through the disturbing event witnessed it, or experienced traumatic stress in the aftermath, we must acknowledge the fact that children are very the most vulnerable. Timely healing, therefore, is essential. Schools can be the best avenues to offer care and healing and teachers have a pivotal role.

What should concern parents, teachers, counsellors and psychologists, are the number of children, especially teenagers, showing behavioural problems. They are increasingly turning aggressive after getting addicted to harmful substances. Psychiatrists and psychologists say that parents are bringing children for treatment following a drastic change in their behaviour and their academic performance going down significantly.

Children from affluent families are getting addicted to e-cigarettes and other drugs. Those from the middle class are said to be inhaling aerosols by burning petrol, diesel and paint thinners, among other easily available substances. "Many children from the age of 13 are experimenting with these.... and are slowly moving towards nicotine-based products and alcohol," said Dr. Anitha Are, a Clinical Psychologist at the Bhaskar Medical College. Dr. Anitha said that on average she sees about three to four school students addicted to various substances in her daily practice. "We find that children who have low selfesteem and are weak-minded are easily getting addicted to these substances because of peer pressure," she added. In a majority of cases, parents are unaware that their children are addicted to substances. And experts have said that many children are using these substances as they are given too much freedom and money.

As the body of Christ, we should be at the forefront of alleviating distress and suffering, whatever the cause. Many Christians have led the way when it comes to pioneering compassionate healthcare all over the world. There is no reason why we cannot be "agents of healing" in this "broken" world of ours. How can we create a generation of people who have learnt to process pain with the help of trained caregivers and ultimately they themselves become caregivers in their sphere of influence? Projects like Saathi: Fellow Traveller has been functioning under Transform4Life (T4L) with a goal to establish communities of trained caregivers who provide emotional care and relief to those in their sphere of influence. Such projects recognise, for any child, teachers and parents as the most significant, appropriate and best avenue of support and

DRAMA

but not a **HYPOCRISY**

It is very interesting to know that the word hypocrisy has a Greek origin which means 'to play a role' and has been derived from the world of drama. Yes! In the acting world one pretends to play a role. The actor may not have anything to do with the character at all. That may be the reason, the words 'acting' and 'drama' have become synonym of pretending. We usually say, 'you are acting' or 'stop all this drama' and so on. What do we mean by these sentences? The former means you are 'pretending' while through the latter one snubs at someone to stop acting or pretending.

If one goes back to the history of English literature and especially of Drama one would find that the story of drama started in the early churches. Various groups or guilds took up different stories from the Bible especially with regard to Jesus' Birth and death and resurrection and staged them

for the people. But later drama or acting moved out from the church into a secular world. We the church have a peculiar understanding of what is 'secular' and what is 'spiritual'. Since drama has gone into a secular world, we do not have good opinion about drama. Even if we do not consider it as unspiritual, we are very cold towards the use of drama in churches. The churches have not fully grasped the importance of Christian drama in a ministry. Drama is a very powerful ministry tool. It can be used to impact the church and the world for Christ. Drama needs to be redeemed from 'secular' world and brought and used in the church service.

Drama is a powerful method of communication. In communication we teach that almost more than 70 per cent of our communication is non-verbal communication. Only ten to thirty per cent of our communication is verbal

communication. In our entire communication, words constitute only ten to thirty per cent while seventy to ninety per cent of our communication comes from the Non-verbal cues like body posture, facial expressions, body movements, eye contact, etc. In other words, greater part of any communication is like performance. Therefore, the effectiveness of our communication depends on how powerfully make use of non-verbal cues. Drama includes non-verbal cues very well. Drama acts out a passage which can make it more real and come alive to the audience. For example, if you act out the passage on Luke 7:1-10 (Faith of the Centurion), one would perform the life of a centurion, his power and his nobility and yet how he valued his servant/servants. The centurion's compassion would be displayed on the stage. How good he was with the public/Israelites. It would show how seriously ill was the servant. What are some of the ways the centurion might have tried to get his servant cured. Centurion's character of humility would be made alive in his approach to Jesus and his faith as he says he is unworthy to come to Jesus. His faith is next. How Jesus was amazed at his faith. Etc. Thus.

Drama is not only an effective method of communication of Biblical message, it has a greater value of bringing and attracting people of all ages, whether educated or illiterate.

life and character imagined through these characters can bring the text alive and drive through the Biblical message so powerfully. I cannot imagine Jesus telling a boring story. Either village, synagogue, mountain or field, or dinner table, or somebody's house, or even stormy sea were his places of teaching and preaching. Always Jesus acted out what he spoke. In addition to these natural scenes, Jesus must have livened up his stories with different gestures, facial expressions, voice tones. Oscar Wilde, a very successful playwright once said, "I regard the theatre as the greatest of all art forms, the most immediate way in which a human being can share with another the sense of what it is to be a human being." Therefore, if drama is integrated into a worship service, the message can touch people more powerfully. Drama is not only an effective method of communication of Biblical message, it has a greater value of bringing and attracting people of all ages, whether educated or illiterate.

When the movie, The Passion of Christ was made, millions of people worldwide were impacted by its message. It is still impacting the world with its powerful way of acting out Jesus' crucifixion and making it look so real.

Honestly speaking though I like drama and have tried writing drama and directing drama in youth camp, I haven't used this potential as I could have. But this is my heart desire that I often use drama as a method to communicate more effectively. Once I wrote a drama on the prodigal son way back in 2002 and I acted in the play the character of the prodigal son. I still remember the way I acted out the role of younger son, everyone was into tears understanding

God's unconditional love and connecting themselves with the younger son. Many of my friends and church members who have participated in the youth camp, still cherish that memory. Since then I have been writing plays for our church programmes and directing them. Young people who have played various characters in the plays, still talk about their roles and remember their dialogue even if they may not remember any other thing from the camp. A young man played the role of Jesus. He was a new believer. As Jesus when he was speaking to the Samaritan woman about the worship, this young man who was playing the role of Jesus, he himself received much grace about the true worship and true worshippers. He was in fact struggling with this idea of worship. But this drama and the word he spoke several times helped him to imagine and bring clarity about his faith and worship. This has impacted him so much that

many times I have heard him remember this drama which impacted him a lot. Many times, when I hear young people, what they remember from the youth camps is the drama and the dialogue they have heard.

Therefore, I am convinced churches and church leaders must understand the significance of communicating Biblical messages through drama. It will galvanise the world of evangelism. It will impact the world in a big way if drama is integrated with the church service and programmes. We should encourage more Christians and churches to be involved in drama ministries.

The Role of Music



Introduction

Music at a core level is a melange of one or more of melody, rhythm and harmony. The influence of music on a living organism is so profound. In humans, over the ages, music has been found to have even therapeutic effects. Throughout history, music has been an integral part of human lives across different civilizations playing a key role in evolving cultures. It is thus no surprise that music plays a vital role in "worship" across most if not all religions or spiritual beliefs. Specific to Christian Worship, it is then necessary to judiciously perceive and interpret the similarities and differences in roles that music plays within it vis-a-vis outside of it.

Within the limited scope of this short research paper, I will be doing a walk through three areas and present view points from a theological (Bible-centred) understanding as well as personal experiences. Firstly, I will use the framework of the three levels of listening to

music: sensuous, expressive, and sheerly musical presented by Aaron Copland in his 1939 book, What to listen for in music 1. In this section, I will then briefly touch upon linguistic and cultural elements, and the added dimension in worship. In the second section, I will then present my thoughtful reflections and analysis of how music has been used and evolved through time periods in Christian Worship and where it stands today. In the final section, I will then present my arguments con-, victions and call as to how every believer, especially those anointed with music associated gifts, must seek to further Christian Worship employing the gift.

Musical Framework

In his 1939 book, What to listen for in music ¹, Aaron Copland discusses three levels of listening to music: sensuous, expressive, and sheerly musical. The first level is the sensuous level. It is the appreciation of music at the most basic level - to derive pleasure or be entertained by it. There is no serious engage-

ment of mental processing at this stage. Ambient music that just fills silence would fall into this category. This is also the most abused of musical listening intention as per the author since the listener just uses that as an "escape route" to wander into dreamland thereby devaluing music into a mere distractory influence. The author presents that there needs to be a greater conscious intent even at this stage. At a slightly higher level lies the expressive plane. At this stage, the listener employs further mental faculty to surface the underlying emotion communicated in the musical work by the composer's intricately woven sound design. Music is inherently and undeniably expressive. Inasmuch can be debated about what the true meaning of the expression in a particular musical piece is, and whether the intent of the composer supersedes that of the understood expression of the listener, it is important to understand the necessity of understanding the importance of keenly engaging with music at an expressive level. At the pinnacle of musical listening experience is the sheerly musical plane. Professional musicians typically listen to music in this plane giving a mindful ear to "the notes themselves and their manipulation" as mentioned in the book. A caveat here though for professional musicians is that this de facto mode can also become a disservice robbing them of the ability to enjoy at a sensual level.

The compositional process described in this book also would be meaningful to the exploration and understanding of the role of music in Christian Worship and I will refer to this section later in the study. According to Copland, and observed widely, the inspirational aspect of composition is sometimes overhyped at the expense of the actual systematic process

involved in the compositional process. Most musical composers start with an idea or theme supplemented by a melodic line or rhythmic beat. Harmonies and accompaniments are then added with various sounds that the composer feels inspired about and congruent to the theme. Dynamics, tempos, and embellishments are added to the rhythm and harmonic sections in a similar manner to "express" the artist's message. The author and composer also presents a classification for composers: the spontaneously inspired, the constructive, the traditionalist, and the pioneer. In a nutshell, the author presents composers as storytellers using the medium of music.

Given this understanding, we can look at this framework to infer a relationship between an abstract appearance and the concrete reality embedded in music. The first two planes, the sensual and expressive, cater to the "feeling" aspect of music that is an abstract appearance. The sheerly musical plane however presents the objective reality of musical notes, their manipulations and interpretations. In a gist, Copland calls for musical listeners to engage more consciously with an active listening process and he puts it this way:"a more conscious and aware listener-not someone who is just listening, but someone who is listening for somethina"

He also admits that these planes of listening don't function in a mutually exclusive manner, more so with a keen listener who would constantly switch planes through the course of the musical work.

Now how does this musical framework pertain to our topic? I view Aaron Copland's well expressed framework as a 3D model. But for me, as a child of God I am aware of a fourth dimension, I would call it the Holy Spirit plane. That is the plane in which the believer experiences His Presence realised or reaffirmed, music being the enabler.

A brief personal biography and experience pertaining to this discussion would shed further light on my position stated above. My first name is Judah Jebadas. Judah means "Praise be to God" in Hebrew. Jebadas means "Prayer Warrior". The acts of praising God and praying are often accompanied by music in the Scripture. I was born and raised in a Christian family, with a strong foundation on the Word of God and prayer. I've been involved in various ministries since childhood, and many contexts that involved music. I am an avid dramatist with experience of stage and television. I have also been blessed with the gift of writing lyrics, poems and other creative writing from a tender age of five.

Thus, to me music was always associated with God. Music was an integral part in my imbibing and reflecting the Word of God and prayer. I remember reading Psalms (and other poetic literature in the Bible) as a child in English while reading through the Bible and feeling that something was robbed in the translation. And this was in all three translations I read in those years, NKJV, Good News Translation and NIV. The language wasn't able to communicate certain 'essence' for lack of words, the difference in poetic structures used by the Psalmist in Hebrew and also the lack of the original music score. So I visualised poetic versions with music, and borrowed better words from my mother tongue Tamil, considered the oldest language in the world, translated to English to revitalize the text.

This highlights the role of language and culture in musical works and vice versa. This is true both in secular music and in Christian Worship music. Even in the secular space, it is seen that music plays many common roles in different cultures. It is seen in various life events such as weddings, coronation ceremonies, funerals or last rites, battles and many more. However, the role of music also has differences or different appropriations and expressions across cultures. An example I can present from my Indian heritage is in certain sub-cultures, they use a siren like mournful trumpeting of death using a sea-shell, followed by an energetic happy music with lots of drums and dancing during the death procession which is then accompanied by designated wailing women at the bereaved residence. This is in stark contrast to the mourning in black attire accompanied by solemn music that is played in such ceremonies seen in western cultures.

Role of Music in Christian Worship Past and Present

In this second section. I am going to discuss in a dipstick approach the roles music has played in Christian Worship and the associated approaches and interpretations. To begin with, let us use a reasonable definition of Christian Worship. Worship is a lifestyle or action that reflects the worthiness of God. It is an exchange that involves two way communication. It can also be expressed as the "rhythm of adoration and action"² or a "response to God's self revelation"2. It involves selfsurrender, sacrifice and a humble posture to ascribe all glory to God. How then does God desire us to worship Him. Jesus explains to the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well in John 4:23.24.

"But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for such the Father seeks to worship him. God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth"

It is clear to see then that worship is a spiritual exercise expressed in our physical bodies.

It is then imperative to understand "corporate worship".

Psalm 132:7 says: "Let us go to his dwelling place; let us worship at his footstool"

Several times, the Scriptures call the believers to worship God together and it is often accompanied with direct or indirect references to the use of music in corporate worship.

We also see the prevalence of liturgical usage throughout the history of the Church. Liturgy stems from the Greek word "leitourgia" which referred to a public gathering. In Christain usage, it means the order of service used in corporate worship.

In, Christianity and Beauty: Music in Christian Worship⁴, Dr. H. K. Andrews, a church organist himself discusses the role of music in Christian Worship touching on certain aesthetical elements that music is bestowed with. Even in an English setting in mid 20th century, Andrews feels that the role of music as an offering in itself, as an act of praise (or prayer) and as a help to worship⁴ is unable to find it's true high level of beauty due to a lack in providing musicians with necessary resources to develop skill and to perform.

Wholesome Role of Music in Christian Worship

In light of the discussions made in this article, one can observe the lack prevalent in the role music plays in Christian Worship today. This is observed at various levels and needs to be addressed in each of them. Firstly, there is a lack of understanding of a wholesome role for music in Christian worship. Secondly, even when there is a reasonable level of understanding, there is a lack of teaching. Thirdly, there is a lack of progressive plan of action. And finally there is a lack of implementation.

In Music for Worship, Evangelism, and Christian Education⁵, Donald P. Hustad, speaks of the three functional roles that music can play in Christianity. Using music in such functional roles would create the wholesomeness that is lacking in Churches today. It is to be noted that Hustad despite the classification in the title, reasons the role of "Corporate Worship" synonymous with the original term "liturgy" in the opening paragraph

It is difficult to separate the three principal activities of the local church mentioned in our subject. But, for all practical purposes, we usually concentrate on them one at a time. In one service we provide an opportunity for corporate Christian worship. At another time we give special emphasis to evangelism. And on other occasions our principal desire is the training of believers.⁵

Anderson, E. Byron wrote, "Music in Christian Worship: At the Service of Liturgy." on the premise that the quality of our worship is threatened by the general lack of understanding of the nature of the arts, and of their relationship to theology and religious practice.

As a musical artist, I love to express my artistic vision by drawing parallel ideas from King David. What I am inspired from David was as an artist and specifically as a musician, David amalgamated his musicianship as a powerful tool in his kit to effectively execute various offices that God called him into. Music was a key component of David's faith life personally and corporately irrespective of his stage or circumstance in life - shepherd, court musician, king, worship leader, broken father, hunted fugitive and a repentant sinner convicted of adultery and murder. Personally David, and through his artistic works, people in his time and for generations, even now have been able to flow through the three musical planes (discussed in the previous section) seamlessly before they transcend to a space of spiritual vulnerability to let the Holy Spirit work in them. It helped David and others, including me, overcome fear, loss, guilt, doubts of identity and value of self and shun self glory.

In David's use of music in worship, we also observe that it never lacked in expressions, emotions or exploration. It also involved an authentic usage of cultural incorporation in lyrical composition and even instrumentation. This teaches us a valuable lesson in our understanding and subsequently creation of worship music. We need to appreciate the relevance, importance and necessity of music from different genres, cultures and messages as long as it is in accordance with God's Word and brings glory to Him. This outlook then helps us to explore different ideas creatively to utilise music as a persuasive tool that brings life to the messages burning within each anointed musician to surface and overflow into a channel of blessing and exhortation that edifies others in worship. Versatility is thus to be fostered. David also encouraged others with musical giftings, provided resources for them and established systems in place towards an wholesome musical experience in worship.

Although, there has been a growing acceptance of a theatrical visual and sonic presentation that provides licence for the artist's personality to shine through, one needs to be discerning of the thin line when that crosses the line of taking away all glory due to God. There also needs to be conscious discernment of the material rewards and the business model infrastructure built around certain worship styles and genres that propagate or advance that particular model as something to be emulated by the universal Church not accounting for all the other aspects discussed in this article (and more).

Every believer and especially the musically gifted ones, I believe is then called to be an artist with a heart to use music as a persuasive tool to glorify God through effective storytelling to evangelize, educate and harmonize the spirit in corporate worship. Thus music would play a wholesome role in Christian Worship building faith in the lives and souls of the listener, even minuscule as a seed but that which is transformative and ever growing and leading them to Jesus.
