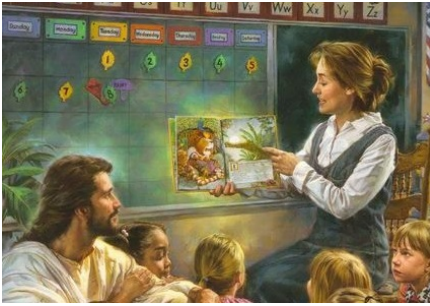

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FROM THE GENERAL SECRETARY'S DESK

Dear Friends,

I greet you all in the matchless name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. In this year, through the various issues of *Chalk & Chai*, we are journeying together through the integrated themes: *The Discipling Teacher*, *The Anointed Teacher*, *The Kingdom Teacher*, and *The Eternal Teacher*.

As educational institutions reopen with new hopes and expectations, much attention is given to academic qualifications, achievements, experience, and professional competence. While these are essential, the deeper and eternal question remains: *What does it mean to be a Kingdom Teacher?* The attributes of a Kingdom Teacher include:

A Kingdom Teacher is Personally Called by God

A Kingdom Teacher is more than an educator or professional instructor who merely imparts information. Teaching is not viewed merely as a job, career, or profession, but as a divine calling and ministry entrusted by God. Beyond academic instruction, they understand that teaching carries an eternal purpose. Such teachers recognize that they are placed within educational institutions to

participate in God's Kingdom purposes by influencing lives through truth, character, wisdom, compassion, and godly values. Like Abraham, Moses, the prophets in the Old Testament, and the disciples in the New Testament, Kingdom Teachers recognize that they are personally called by God to fulfill His purposes in their workplace. Through this sacred calling, the Kingdom Teacher becomes an instrument in establishing the Kingdom of God in the lives of people. Their teaching, conduct, relationships, and witness reflect Christ and become channels through which God touches students, colleagues, institutions, and society.

A Kingdom Teacher is a Praying Teacher

A praying teacher recognizes that human ability alone is not sufficient to shape lives eternally. Prayer becomes the lifeline that connects the teacher to the heart and power of God. Through prayer, the teacher receives renewed vision, patience, compassion, wisdom, and understanding to minister to students with love and sensitivity. The dependence of a Kingdom Teacher on God naturally leads to a life of intercession. They bring before God their students, classrooms, colleagues, administrators, institutions, families, comm-

unities, and nations with faith and compassion. They pray not only for academic excellence, but also for the transformation of lives, character, values, relationships, and destinies.

Like Nehemiah, Daniel, and Paul, Kingdom Teachers understand that prayer is not separate from their mission — it is central to their calling. In quiet moments before entering the classroom, while preparing lessons, during seasons of difficulty, and even in times of success, they seek God earnestly. Their prayers invite God's presence into the learning environment and create opportunities for healing, hope, reconciliation, encouragement, and spiritual growth. A praying teacher becomes a channel of God's grace. Though often unseen by the world, their prayers can influence generations, strengthen institutions, transform communities, and shape the future of society according to the purposes of God.

A Kingdom Teacher is a Professional Teacher

A Kingdom Teacher is a professional teacher who pursues excellence in knowledge, teaching, character, creativity, and spiritual maturity. As lifelong learners, they continually grow in wisdom, remain open to innovative teaching methods, and faithfully carry out their responsibilities with integrity, discipline, and dedication. Their classrooms are learner-centered and transformational, encouraging participation, creativity, critical thinking, and holistic growth. Beyond academic achievement, they seek to nurture values, faith, integrity, compassion, and godly character in students. Like Jesus, who taught with authority and compassion, Kingdom Teachers combine academic excellence

with spiritual insight. Depending on the Holy Spirit for guidance, they view teaching as both a profession and a ministry, using their lives and work to influence students, institutions, and society for the glory of God and the advancement of His Kingdom.

A Kingdom Teacher is a Proclaiming Teacher

A Kingdom Teacher is a proclaiming teacher who advances God's Kingdom through both teaching and daily life. A proclaiming teacher communicates truth, righteousness, hope, integrity, compassion, and godly values through words, actions, relationships, and conduct. A Journey from being a Clay to a Catalyst



I greet you in the name of our Living Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We tread the path of teaching not by chance, but by God's purposeful decree to this noble vocation.

For thirty six years, I served as a teacher and counselor across the lands of Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, and Karnataka. Many people kindled the flame within me, forging me to become an efficient teacher.

1. My Mother, the Beacon of Compassion

When I was 5 years old, my parents entrusted me to my grandparents' care, venturing into the tribal hills for missionary toil. Every summer break I had the opportunity to spend time in the hills with my parents. I beheld my mother as a shepherdess of souls. In government and forest schools, children wandered like lost lambs: irregular in attendance, toiling in their fields and disinterested in learning or studying higher education.

Undeterred, she journeyed to remote villages, or dispatched village elders, to summon them. By streams, she bathed the children, laundered their clothes, tending their health by providing nutritious meal with mother's fierce tenderness and constantly sharing to them the importance of education. I, envied this care and boundless love given by her to those children. Years later, I understood that her service was a hymn of sacrifice which resulted in many children accepting Jesus as their personal Savior, got excellent grades and had embarked on good careers in India and Abroad.

My mother made it a point for me to engage and teach in the Summer Vacation Bible School that was held for those children and also coach those who were weak in studies every summer break. This training developed in me a heart to serve the needy, underprivileged and pass on God's amazing love. Even my daughters drew inspiration from this legacy passed on through my mother in their lives by working in places of need as teachers in North India.

2. My Teachers, Pillars of Righteous Molding

My teachers stood as paragons in my student days. Their corrections were bitter at that season of life but I obeyed it with an unwilling heart. Those were the refining fire which shaped me to be the person whom I am today. I render thanks to our Lord for these sculptors who steered my spirit true. As Proverbs says "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old, he will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22:6).

Post-college in 1980, I was posted in a girls' hostel of seven hundred rural children as a warden and teacher. My manager, a missionary from America's heartland, embodied passion, sincerity, humility, punctuality, and her life molded me to labor with fervent passion. "Not to be served, but to serve," Christ-like creed resounded through her life. She role molded to me, to say what means to be an useful vessel. Under her administration I learnt skills which were useful where ever I worked in.

I got married to a Pastor who worked in Mumbai's slums. I got an opportunity to work alongside him sharing Christ's love and counseling the people according to their needs. Later, I studied Theology in Bangalore and began working as a counsellor and teacher in a school where I taught Science and Environmental science. As a counsellor of the school God opened doors to students who belonged to fragmented homes, homes with various problems. Spending time with the students in their difficult times enabled me to uplift their spirits. Now, when I meet these children its amazing to see what an encouragement, a counsel, a smile or even a cheer could bring and what a huge difference it could make. God also gave me an opportunity to work for the hostellers who were from the under privileged background in academics and personality development. The times spent with them unveiled dialogues, to share about the hope and future God has purposed for every individual.

Working under the leadership of twenty principals in different schools gave me exposure to various approaches and how to deal with every student. I thank God for all the teachers and administrators whom I worked with.

3. My Savior, my Ultimate Model Teacher

Jesus our Rabbi is my supreme exemplar. In ancient days, children were society's overlooked and seen as unimportant (Mark 10:13-16). "Let the little ones come unto me; hinder them not, for of such is the Kingdom of God. Verily, whosoever receives not the Kingdom as a child shall not enter there in." He cradled them in arms of mercy, bestowing time, love, blessings, values and worth. This teaches us that every child is precious in the sight of God.

Thus, modeling to me to invest as much as I as could in every child and embody what he did and to teach with passion, encourage the student who has a problem with memory retention, journey with a slow learner etc..A rising challenge for every teacher in this day and age is children have more knowledge than the elders because of exposure by different social media. So, we should equip ourselves to stand before them by updating our subjects so that we will be effective in what we do.

I followed these five principles during my teaching career. Firstly, I prayed for myself, that God would give me wisdom to understand the situations of all the students to whom I teach. (James 1:5). Secondly, I pre - planned everything well in advance before doing anything whether it was teaching, ministry or family. Thirdly, I updated my subjects and prepared well for the lessons I taught. Fourthly, presented the lessons with simple examples. Fifthly, I thanked God for the work I completed throughout the day. This made me to complete my profession successfully with the help of God. I retired from service as an ISC Teacher and Chief Examiner. Proverb 22:29 " Do you see a man skillful in his work. He will stand before king he will not stand before obscure man." God blesses those who depend on Him and makes them as a blessing to many. This is my story!

May God continue to write your story and make you as a blessing to many.

Called to TEACH, Chosen to SERVE

Fifteen years ago, when I began my journey as a professional teacher in a reputed higher secondary school as a senior Geography teacher, I never imagined that teaching would become my calling. To me, it was simply a profession — a respectable job and a means of livelihood. But God had a much greater purpose hidden behind the classroom walls.

As a young boy, I was timid and shy. Public speaking was something I avoided whenever possible. Yet deep within me, there was always a passion to teach. I loved helping my siblings and classmates understand lessons, even though I lacked the confidence to stand before people and speak openly.

Looking back today, I realize that God often begins His work in the smallest and most unexpected ways. I still remember my Sunday school teacher, a foreign missionary teacher, who trusted me enough to help her with translations during Sunday school classes. What seemed like a simple responsibility at that time became a turning point in my life. Her encouragement gave me confidence and opened a door I had never considered before. Through that opportunity, God slowly planted in my heart the desire to teach for His Kingdom.

Soon, I started taking Sunday school

classes for children and later became involved in Vacation Bible School ministry. Those experiences transformed me. Teaching children about God's love, singing with them, storytelling, and guiding them spiritually not only improved my teaching skills but also shaped my character and purpose. Slowly, I discovered that teaching was not just about transferring knowledge — it was about touching lives.

Proverbs 22:6 reminds us, “Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it.” This verse beautifully reflects the responsibility and privilege given to every teacher.

Over the years, there were many opportunities to leave the profession. Financial struggles, increasing responsibilities, pressure, and uncertainty often made the journey difficult. There were moments when choosing another career path might have seemed easier and more rewarding financially. But through every season, I thank God that He never placed an excessive love for money in my heart. Instead, He gave me peace and joy in serving children and working in the field of education.

One of the biggest turning points in my life came when I left my job and joined a school that was working for the Kingdom of God and aligned with the vision God

had placed in my heart. It was not an easy decision. Human understanding would have questioned such a step, but sometimes God calls us to walk by faith and not by comfort.

That journey taught me an important truth: a Kingdom Teacher is not driven merely by salary, recognition, or position. A Kingdom Teacher is driven by purpose.

Colossians 3:23 became a guiding principle in my life: “Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters.” Teaching with this mindset changes ordinary work into meaningful ministry.

In today's world, teachers are often under tremendous pressure to produce academic results, maintain records, complete targets, and fulfill endless responsibilities. While all these are important, the true calling of a Kingdom Teacher goes beyond academics. It is about nurturing hearts, building character, and reflecting Christ through everyday actions.

One important lesson for today's teachers is that teaching must be seen as a calling and not merely as a career. When teaching becomes only a job, it may lead to frustration and exhaustion. But when it is viewed as a mission to shape lives, every challenge gains meaning and purpose.

Another important lesson is that every child needs encouragement more than perfection. Students may forget lessons and examinations, but they always remember the teachers who believed in them, encouraged them, and stood beside them during difficult moments. A

few kind words from a teacher can change the direction of a child's life forever.

A third lesson for educators today is to remain faithful even during challenges and pressures. Modern education often comes with stress, expectations, and sacrifices, but teachers who continue serving with integrity, patience, and compassion leave a lasting impact far beyond the classroom.

Galatians 6:9 gives strength to every weary teacher: “Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.”

Students today are not only looking for teachers who can explain subjects well; they are searching for mentors they can trust and role models they can follow. Children may forget formulas, definitions, and notes, but they never forget kindness, encouragement, or the teacher who believed in them during their difficult days.

As educators, we stand in a powerful position to shape lives. Sometimes a single word of encouragement from a teacher becomes the reason a child gains confidence. Sometimes a prayer offered quietly for a struggling student changes a life forever.

I have learned that classrooms are not merely rooms filled with desks and blackboards; they are mission fields. Every child who enters carries a story, a struggle, a dream, or a hidden wound. Some need guidance, some need discipline, some need love, and many simply need someone who believes in them.

The journey has not always been easy, but it has been meaningful. Through every challenge, God has remained faithful. He has used ordinary moments, ordinary classrooms, and ordinary conversations to accomplish extraordinary things.

Today, when I look back at the shy young boy who once feared public speaking, I can only thank God for His grace. The same God who called Moses despite his weakness still calls imperfect people to serve His purpose. Teaching became more than my profession — it became my ministry.

Isaiah 41:10 has often reminded me of God's faithfulness through every season: "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you."

A Kingdom Teacher is not perfect, but faithful. Not merely qualified, but compassionate. Not only skilled, but surrendered to God's purpose.

As teachers, may we never forget that our work carries eternal value. We are not just preparing students for examinations; we are preparing them for life. We are shaping future leaders, parents, citizens, and servants of society.

The world needs teachers who teach with wisdom, lead with humility, and serve with love. The world needs Kingdom Teachers.

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A Teacher's HEART

Whether by choice, compulsion or accident, we find ourselves as teachers, at different levels. It is also a well-known fact that Jesus was and is the greatest teacher ever. And we, as Christians, ought to follow our Master Teacher. How can we do so? If our character is aligned with that of God, we can get the heart of God, and that my dear friends, is how the heart of a teacher is supposed to be.

Driven by Compassion

We read that Jesus had compassion on the crowds. Why did compassion stem forth from Him? It was so because He saw that they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd (Matt. 9.36).

We have crowds with us. In fact, we are thrust into the midst of crowds every single day that we work. How do we approach them? Very often we hear our colleagues whine about the lack of discipline and culture among the students of this era! Why are the students so? Aren't they harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd? Do we dare complain that they lack the decorum and sincerity shown by students of our era? Hasn't God given these hapless sheep into our care because we are the shepherds chosen by God for them?

When we go to teach or deliver a lecture in a class, what is our objective? If showcasing our ability or knowledge in our field is our primary aim, we fail terribly. The objective of a shepherd

must be to safeguard the sheep at any cost. The souls of our students must be saved, even if it means being plucked out of the jaws of the Devourer. So, with the souls on our mind, let us accomplish our duties. When the students observe us, they must see a shepherd who takes care of them, prepares them for their career, guides them towards their future, all because of the compassionate heart throbbing for their welfare.

It is important that a teacher must love the students more than their own lecture. When students are unruly, disrespectful and irksome, does compassion stem from us or irritation? If we have compassion on them, we will pray for them. Yes. For them. For all of them. You heard me right. *We are duty-bound to pray for all of them because we are shepherds to all of them. Remember the Parable of the Sheep in which the shepherd leaves the 99 and searches for the single lost sheep. How many students have we lost so far?*

If you have troublemakers as your students, rejoice. It is so because that is a sheep raring to go astray. But it cannot go because you as its shepherd will be praying for it and guiding it with compassion in your heart. You will not let go of even a single sheep. For, aren't you emulating the Master Teacher and Shepherd? He had compassion on the crowds. Do you follow Him? Are your thoughts aligned with that of God? If the answer is yes, your focus hereafter in your class will be on the souls of students and you will be driven by compassion, just as Jesus Christ was.

went home on 31st May at 3pm at the age of 93 years. Death finally brought an end to his passionate and unflagging involvement in many ministries, associations, and patronship to faith and education that reached beyond Mizoram.

My father-in-law was associated with UESI, EGF, and ETFI through personal friendship with their pioneers like Rev. P.T. Chandapilla (UESI), Dr. G. Devapaul (ETFI) from their inception years. He might have become Dr. Devapaul's successor to the ETFI had he not become the Executive Secretary of Interserve India from January 1987. While in Interserve, he created a working relationship between ETFI and Interserve with Dr. Devapaul in May 1987. From those days till his death, Dr. Tluanga was Staff Consultant to ETFI, and in that capacity he published three books for ETFI- ***Teacher's Challenge*** -1989; ***Teacher Speaks*** -1995; ***The Making of a Christian Teacher*** -1998 UESI and ETFI which greatly shaped our personal lives, gave us a shared passion. What distinguished Dr. Tluanga was not the numerous awards and recognition that followed him even after his death but his love for the LORD and His people everywhere that greatly impressed me. His funeral was a testimony to the glory of going home!

The respect UESI and ETFI enjoy in Mizoram is also due to people like Dr. Tluanga, ***Pastor Hepuni Kayina , Mao Baptist Church, Delhi.***

My association with Dr.Tluanga began in 1997 before resigning and joining ETF. He stayed with us in Hyderabad a couple of times. I met him in Aizawl a few times later, the last in 2019. He encouraged me to join Interserve in 1999 and had the privilege to associate with him in several ways. Many good memories of our association. He was indeed a strong and inspiring leader.

His enthusiasm and fervor for the

Lord's ministry through ETF were truly challenging and inspiring. Even in his advanced years, age never hindered his passion for serving God. He continued to write and contribute meaningfully to the ministry with remarkable dedication. One of his significant contributions was the translation of *The Making of a Christian Teacher* (published in 1998) into the Mizo language. The e-copy of this valuable work was published and dedicated during the 22nd Biennial National Conference of ETF, held from 14–16 October 2021 in Chennai, Tamil Nadu. On behalf of the ETF family across India, we praise God for Dr. Tluanga's life, testimony, and faithful ministry. His legacy of commitment to Christian education and Kingdom service will continue to inspire generations of educators. We extend our heartfelt condolences to the bereaved family and pray that our loving Lord will comfort, strengthen, and sustain them during this time of loss.

First North West Zone ETF Christian

Teachers' Conference

We praise God for the successful conduct of the First North West Zone ETF Christian Teachers' Conference, graciously hosted at **Golden Cypress, Dehradun, Uttarkhand**. The conference was held from **1st to 3rd May 2026** with the theme, ***“Teachers – Shepherds of God's Flock”*** (1 Peter 5:2). It was a blessed time of spiritual renewal, meaningful learning, enriching fellowship, and joyful interaction. A total of *36 delegates*, including facilitators, participated in the conference. Delegates represented four districts of Uttarakhand, along with seven other states — Bihar, Delhi, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, and Uttar Pradesh. The diversity of participation was both encouraging and deeply enriching.

Inaugural Session

The conference began with a vibrant time of singing, joyfully led by the delegates from Grace Academy. A warm welcome was extended by *Mr. Emmanuel Ratnaraj*, followed by inspiring words from *Dr. Caroline Michael*, General Secretary of ETF, who officially declared the conference open. An engaging ice-breaker activity titled ***“Let's Feed the Lambs”***, creatively led by Dr. Caroline Michael, set a joyful and unifying tone for the days ahead.

Bible Studies and Devotions

The Bible study sessions, led by *Mr. Andiyas Singh*, were deeply thought-provoking and spiritually challenging, inspiring participants to cultivate a prayer life that draws them closer to God. The morning devotions, led by *Dr. Caroline Michael* from Psalm 23 and other Scripture portions, offered rich moments of introspection, encouragement, and renewal, preparing hearts for each day's sessions.

Special Sessions

The sessions by *Mrs. Neelima Kanthi* and *Ms. Meghna Nathon* on “Pathshala” offered a profound perspective on the need to educate every child, highlighting opportunities through non-formal schools. *Mr. Emmanuel Ratnaraj* also led the delegates to a deeper understanding of the inner needs of children.

Beyond the formal sessions, participants enjoyed refreshing informal moments — riverside walks, group prayers, sharing sessions, and a lively Talent Night — all of which deepened relationships, fostered unity, and created cherished memories.
