

# Challenges of a CHRISTIAN TEACHER in a Changing Society

Many are the challenges faced by teachers today and especially Christian teachers who have to constantly set a high and divine standard for their students without compromising on their moral ethics and commandments of the Holy Word of God. While the students are on one side of the gamut, the fellow teaching community secures a place on the other side of the gamut. Constant scrutiny, during these times when people are blamed for converting others to Christianity, is on the rise. It is indeed a huge challenge to stand firm and profess God's love not only in words but also in deed.

The Word of God places on record that we are preview to a Changing Society as recorded in the book of 1 Timothy 3: 1-17.

### 1. Prophetic words regarding the changing society (2 Timothy 3:1-9)

Paul warns of the collapse of values in 1Timothy 4:1-3. This term included the entire period between the first century and the return of Christ.

What could be the reasons for this social degeneration?

Paul lists them down in Romans 1:28-32.

#### 19 General Characteristics

- 1. Lovers of themselves: self-centered not God-centric, Narcissistic
- 2. Lovers of money (1 Timothy 6:9, 10).
- 3. Boastful, self exalting And glorifying (Jeremiah 9:23,24/ Galatians 6:14)
- 4. Proud, arrogant (Proverbs 6:16-19/1 Peter 5:5,6).
- 5. Disobedient, Disrespectful to parents
- 6. Ungrateful, Thanklessness attitude of "I deserve it"

- 7. Abusive, Blasphemers absence of designated virtue
- 8. Unholy, Not wanting to be different from the crowd around
- 9. Without Love, heartless, Inability to give themselves for the highest best of others.
- 10. Unforgiving, Diabolical in character devilish
- 11. Slanderous destroying other's reputation
- 12. Without self-control- no restraint permissive
- 13. Brutal untamed opposite of being civilized
- 14. Not Lovers of the good-Perverted -evil bent -wrong inclination
- 15. Treacherously Disposed towards betrayal
- 16. Rash. Reckless in words and deed
- 17. Conceited and Puffed up, thinking too highly of oneself
- 18. Lovers of pleasure- sensuous-hedonic-no love for God or man
- 19. Having a form of Godliness but denying its power-Fanatically religious only an outward veneer.

Though these characteristics are listed under the auspices of last days, they were present in Ephesus in seed form to be intensified with time.

Timothy was a different teacher and his teaching was different from the false teachers of that time and their false teaching. The carnal immature (vulnerable and gullible) become easy targets for false teachers (2 Timothy 3:Vs. 6, 7) for they are ever learning and never experiencing reality.

The problem was in the so called openness to learn. In doing so, teachers started embracing heresies that came along. They lacked discernment to recognize these false heresies and hence were powerless to acknowledge the truth.

Verses 8 & 9 reference James and Jambres and their opposition to Moses which is drawn out not only in the Old Testament but in the widespread Jewish legend about two of Pharaoh's magicians who competed against Moses and lost (Exodus 7:11/9:11).

Folly will not get very far.... Eventually the folly will be clear to everyone!

### II. CHALLENGES TO FAITHFULNESS (2 Timothy 3:10-17)

Verses 10 & 14 exhorts and challenges us to uphold the teachings taught us.( <sup>10</sup>You, however, know all about my teaching, my way of life, my purpose, faith, patience, love, endurance <sup>14</sup>But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it).

Paul as a role model educates us by informing us about his Teaching, Lifestyle, Purpose, Faith, Patience, Love, Endurance, Persecutions and Sufferings at Antioch, Iconium and Lystra (Acts 13:14,51/14:6,21/16:1). It is important that we are,

### 1. Standing firm in the face of opposition (Vs. 10-13)

Persecution awaits everyone who wants to live a Godly life in Christ. Things will go from bad to worse. Deceivers will be deceived.

### 2. Adhering to God's Word (Vs. 14-17)

It is important to continue in the Word and respond to the call to discipleship (John 8:31, 32,36).

### This gives us,

- 1. An assurance of salvation (Vs. 14,15)
- 2. Imparts a righteous character for God's Word shows what is right, what is not right, how to get things right and how to stay right (Vs. 16) and
- 3. Equips us for service (Vs. 17).

### III. APPLICATION

How can we apply these characteristics to ourselves?

- 1. Our Belief System determines our behavioral pattern.
- 2. Change in society is based on its belief system.
- 3. Belief and Behavior are inter-related (1 Timothy 4:16).

We need to establish a strong and grounded Belief system and believe that the changes in our society can be countered only if and when we are equipped with the Word of God.

### **GIVE A THOUGHT WITH THESE QUESTIONS**

If we are to move forward and establish a strong foundation, let us ask ourselves the following questions:

- 1. In what way does 2 Timothy 3 help us to understand the challenge of a Christian teacher in the changing society? How are we to face it and bring about change for the better?
- 2. If a belief system determines behavioral pattern, how should we go about in changing the belief system of the society that is changing for the worst?

### REMEMBER THE FOUR R'S

If we, as teachers are to fight the good fight and make a difference, we need:

- Revelation from God
- Reconciliation with God


- 3. Regeneration of God
- 4. Repentance and a change of Self-will

Teachers, we need to take the first step forward and reject the wrong belief system and abandon it for the right way adhering to the Holy Word of God every step of the way. 

Greetings to you in the matchless name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. It is a privilege and a pleasure to share with you the amazing Biblical Truth with Scientific Proofs.

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."

We could all learn something from this well-known Bible verse. Looking beyond the religious overtones, there is a message to be found in this for everyone. Everything begins with a word. Words consist of vibrations and sound. These vibrations create the very reality that surrounds us. Words are the creator; the creator of our universe, our lives, our reality. Without words, a thought can never become a reality. When God said 'Let

there be light', the light came. If our words and thoughts are the very tools with which we create our reality, then surely are they not our most powerful tool yet? Shouldn't we only pick up on the very best words in order to create our very best reality?

Our thoughts also impact what is manifested in our lives and it is our words that provide a bold affirmation of our inner most thoughts. They are a confirmation to the world of how we see others, our lives and ourselves. It is this powerful affirmation that our words provide which enables our thoughts to manifest into a reality. So why do we choose to misuse our most powerful asset? So by that admission, when we moan or complain about our lives to others, we are putting those negative words out

there to become a reality. When you say something out loud enough times, your words become the truth not only in your own mind but in the minds of everyone you are saying them to. If this is really so, then ask yourself: do you really want to tell yourself and everybody else that you know that you are unlucky in love/unsuccessful/miserable/bored or whatever you have been complaining about? Especially now that you know that it is these exact words that are creating the life that you live. Begin to choose the words that you speak consciously. Practice improved self-awareness over the words that you use to describe yourself and your life. Negative powerless words, such as can't, shouldn't, won't, foolish, tupid, I hate you and you are crazy, should all be avoided. They strip you of your ability to manifest a life that you want to live. Bible says in Proverb 18:27 "Death and life are in the power of the tongue: and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof." Your tongue is powerful - what you say creates life (or good outcomes) or death (bad or undesirable outcomes). In other words, you can manifest God's blessings by speaking life into your situation or you can call in those things that you really don't want to happen by speaking negatively or saying things that are opposite to God's promises. Speaking life simply means that you are confessing God's promises - you are speaking out loud the outcome that you already have by the grace of God those things you would like to see manifested in your life.

As the creator of your universe, what you say goes. Therefore, next time you catch yourself about to use negative words, regain control and frame your word choices so that they have a more positive impact on your world. For example, if you would usually say something such as 'I am unhealthy and overweight' then why not turn this into a more positive. constructive statement such as 'I am in the process of becoming healthier and every day I get closer and closer to my ideal weight'. Your words are the paint with which you paint your reality. Choose them wisely and positively to create a reality that is good for you. Andrea Gardner said Change your words, change your world. We use words every day to communicate, to express our feelings and thoughts, but we often forget how powerful they can be and how important it is to choose them with care if we wish to attract love, happiness and success.


What you See/Read/Hear will lead to thoughts; what you think about gets into your heart; what is in your heart is expressed through your words; words become your action; repeated action becomes your habit and finally it become your life style.

Proverbs 23:7 says, "For as he thinketh in his heart, so is he".

Scientist Dr. Masaru Emoto was a Japanese author, researcher, photographer and entrepreneur, who claimed that human consciousness has an effect on the molecular structure of water. Emoto's assumption evolved over the years and his early work explored his belief that water could react to positive

thoughts and words and that polluted water could be cleaned through prayer and positive visualization.

Emoto believed that water was a "blueprint for our reality and that emotional "energies" and "vibrations" could change the physical structure of water. Emoto's water crystal experiments consisted of exposing water in glasses to different words, pictures or music and then freezing and examining the properties of the resulting crystals with microscopic photography. Emoto claimed that water exposed to positive speech and thoughts would result in visually "pleasing" crystals being formed when that water was frozen and that negative words or intentions would yield "ugly" frozen crystal formations as follows:





### Dr. Masaru Emoto's Rice & Water Experiment







"Thank You"

"You're An Idiot"

Ignored

Dr. Emoto conducted simple rice experiments by placing one cup of cooked rice into two separate containers. He then placed a lid on each container and marked one container with a positive phrase, e.g., "Thank You", marked the other container with a negative phrase, e.g., "You're An Idiot" and another container "Ignored". Following this, he placed them at least 12 inches apart and every day for 30 days, once or more times. he said aloud to each rice container the phrase written on it with genuine feelings- saying "thank you" from a place of gratitude and "stupid" from a place of anger and frustration. And after thirty days, what do you think happened? Well, the "Thank You!" rice "began to ferment, giving off a strong, pleasant aroma." The "You're An Idiot" rice turned mostly black and the "Ignored" rice "began to rot," turning into a disgusting green-blue color. According to Emoto, the "ignored" rice fared the worst because of negligence and indifference which are the absolute worst things we can do to water, rice...and ourselves. He goes on to explain that "we should converse with children" - a piece of monumental parenting advice, that is sure to forever be attributed to this rice experiment. "Indifference, our

narrator tells us, "does the greatest harm."

So, the average human body contains 75% water and it will react to the actual good or bad words we speak and thoughts we think and it reaches to all our trillion cells. Negative thoughts can also damage our DNA. Positive words with good intentions behind them, nurture and encourage growth. Negative words with negative emotions literally rot and destroy.

Bible says in **Proverb 4:23**, " **Keep thy heart with all diligence;**for out of it are the issues of life".

Deuteronomy 30:19 reads, "This day I call the heavens and the earth as witnesses against you that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Now choose life, so that you and your children may live".

In Matthew 12:38 we read, "For by your words you will be justified and by your words you will be condemned".

Listening to music with bad lyrics (separation, heart break, loneliness and sadness) will also destroy the water structure in our body. The Bible says in *Mark 4:24, "And He said to* 

them, Be careful what you are hearing. The measure [of thought and study] you give [to the truth you hear] will be the measure [of virtue and knowledge] that comes back to you-and more [beside] will be given to you who hear".

Water can also be treated through prayer. They took the polluted sample which showed no structure before prayer and the same polluted water after prayer showed good water crystal.

Finally, my dear brothers and sisters in Christ, I would like to beseech you to use your words carefully. They can either construct your life or destroy it. According to book of *Proverb18:21* "Words carry power"; *James 3:6* tells us that , "Words are like fire" and according to the book of *Jeremiah 23:29, "Words* are like fire & hammer".

Job 22:28 reads, "Thou shalt also decree a thing, and it shall be established unto thee: and the light shall shine upon thy ways".

Psalm 34:11-14 tells us, "Come, my children, listen to me; I will teach you the fear of the Lord. Whoever of you loves life and desires to see many good days, keep your tongue from evil and your lips from telling lies. Turn from evil and do good; seek peace and pursue it".

Romans 12:2 cautions us saying, "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is his good, pleasing and perfect will".

Ephesians 4:24 tells us, "And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness".

In Romans 5:17, we read, "For if by the one man's offense death reigned through the one, much more those who receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ".

### What are the 2 most powerful words in the world?

The 2 most powerful words are "I AM". It is the name of God revealed to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM. and what you speak after "I AM", what you BELIEVE after "I AM" will control your decisions and shape your life.

Let us renew our mind, put on the new man and keep confessing who we are in Christ as much as possible. As we are destined to reign in life, so let us sow the good seed (Word of God) in our life and reap 60, 70 and 100 fold blessings. God Bless You All.

### **Ratio Learning Model**

There are a lot of articles and discussions on the different ways of effective learning that are employed and advocated by respective proponents, such that there is an array of teaching technologies at our disposal as never before! There is also such a wealth of resources available and this will keep on growing as different situations continue to spawn innovative ideas- ideas to encourage and promote learning in a particular setting. I believe the perpetual concern of a good teacher is taking on the question of what could motivate learning in one's pupils, and therefore the desire to see this happening is the mother of invention.

I am a teacher who cannot teach if my students pay no attention in class. The sight of even one student not caught up with the lesson is equal to losing one learner, and it gives me a sense of having failed that student. Unrealistic expectations? Maybe, but this is what also makes me reassess myself and my lesson to understand what I may be doing wrong or not doing that their interest is not pricked at all. It is because of this unease and the idea of getting every pupil engaged that led me to experiment

and to learn from others as well, till I came up with a customized version of what I call the 50-50 ratio learning model.

To be honest, the 50-50 ratio is not originally my idea. When I joined the English Language Institute China (ELIC), an organization of professional teachers, we were introduced to this idea at orientation. What it simply means is that a good teacher talks at maximum only about 50% of class time and uses the other half for comprehension, application and reinforcement activities that are carried out by learners. This is opposed to the traditional concept of viewing a pupil as an empty vessel to be filled by the teacher who takes up the entire class hour lecturing or working out solutions and making pupils copy-cat them as they work on exercises. In the former mode of learning, the learner is required to be responsible for his/her own learning through active participation: whereas, the latter mode of learning requires the learner to passively sponge up what is being poured into him/her. It is no mystery which of the two becomes a creative learner.

We know the proverb that goes, "Give a man a fish and he eats for a day. Teach him to fish and he will eat his lifetime". This is another way of looking at the two opposing approaches of teaching. The difference between the two is the wisdom of knowing how much to teach so that learning can take place. A revealing truth is that spoon feeding only lasts as long as infancy.

So the 50-50 ratio idea is about learning being co-owned by the instructor and the instructed which is not just about splitting up the time between them. The instructor tells where potato is likeliest to be found, and the instructed uses the information to zero in on the location and digs out the potato himself/herself. The instructor is satisfied his instructions were accurate, and the instructed enjoys the excitement of locating and digging out food! This excitement whets his appetite for more searches. Stretch this analogy to learning and you have pupils who discover knowledge (of course with leads received from the teacher) on their own effort experiencing increased excitement for more discoveries. This results in knowing knowledge as opposed to being told knowledge. And wide is the gap between the two.

In the gospel of Matthew chapter 16 verses 13 to 19, we see this 50-50 rationale being used by the Rabbi Himself. In this instance, the lesson is the question of the identity of their Teacher. He does not supply them the answer just for the having. He makes them find the answer. Of course the pertinent lead-question is raised by the teacher. This is the kind of leading every focused teacher has ready in order to direct meaningful discussion on an identified topic. Look at how He

prepared them to arrive at the answer. He asked, "Who do men say that I, the Son of Man, am?" In essence the question is, "What is the heardknowledge or the common knowledge you have about me?" The disciples reported what the knowledge regarding His identity was at that time. The Master-Teacher did not allow them to rest with that knowledge. He wanted more. Next He asked, "But who do you say that I am?" which translates, "But who do you know Me to be?" They had been with Him, observed Him and heard Him closer than anyone else and therefore ought to have had a formed opinion of their own and not parroted a social answer. It was only when they gave their own conclusion that the Teacher commended the right answer. This is the model of a good teacher-led learning, that is, making the pupil bring up a personalized answer.

This then is the principle we derive from this Caesarea episode: Learning is best when it is self-figured out.

Give the leading question, sit back and let them come after the answer themselves. Ask pupils to start with what is known information; get them to use self-obtained new data and personal observations; and finally make a studied conclusion. Affirm the right answer while allowing every other conceived answer to be expressed and giving encouraging comments if possible. This way the answer they have excavated themselves is owned by them, while a told answer belongs to someone else.

In my classroom I have tried several ways to implement this 50-50 ratio model, but the overriding principle is to speak as less as possible and allow the process of self-learning maximum time. It plays out in different ways depending

on what type of class it is, how much time is available, and how hard the topic is. Since giving leads is a key to the success of a maximum student activity class, it requires the teacher to spend significant time ahead of class to prepare engaging activities that will promote learning of the topic. One of my regular ways of starting discussion on a topic is to pair off students and ask them to ask each other what they know about the topic, encouraging them to ask for clarifications and reasons for their answer. This gets everyone to realize their own state of knowledge of the topic at that point. Besides, this exercise gets everyone engaged in thinking about the matter. Then I ask one or two pairs to give the class brief commentsthat will enlighten the class. Then after necessary definitions and meanings of the subject have been explained to the class, I assign every pair different questions/statements/tasks related to the topic to discuss and understand or solve. Or the same problem can be given to all the pairs. They are told that after a certain time of pair discussion, they will give their conclusions or answers to another team who will critically examine their solution or explanation. So the next step is to bring two pairs together to take turns showing or explaining their answers/solutions to one another. Each pair shares their explanation or solution to the other pair who have to be convinced and satisfied with the answer. They are told that the

purpose of two pairs coming together is to help each other improve or rectify each other's answers. At last, the teacher asks the groups of four to all give their unified answers in turns. In this way, the collective findings provide the points and also new ideas for the best answer or solution which the teacher writes out on the board. To wrap up the lesson, the teacher makes final comments and confirms the correct answer or answers. Interactive learning serves the 50-50 model well, and can involve a big class and even a small class well. It works with college and university students too.

The significance of the fifty-fifty rule is to make learning a 50-50 responsibility between the teacher and the students, and not put the onus entirely on the teacher. This not only takes the pressure off teachersto just fill up time, but, more importantly, encourages pupils to ignite up to enjoyable learning. The facts of the world are not explained by just one idea but with different ideas, so instead of asking learners to spout photocopy ideas, they should be encouraged to explore different ideas to add to the multi-faceted facts of life!

All of what I have been saying is summed up by William Arthur Ward:

"The mediocre teacher tells. The good teacher explains. The superior teacher demonstrates.

The great teacher inspires".

### ETF Local unit, Sholapur, Maharashtra



### The ABC of the RTE

# Open-minded adoption of the RTE Act's enabling provisions can radically transform school education

Free and compulsory education of children in the 6 to 14 age group in India became a fundamental right when, in 2002, Article 21-A was inserted in the 86th Amendment to the Constitution. This right was to be governed by law, as the state may determine, and the enforcing legislation for this came eight years later, as the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2010, or the RTEAct.

With examples from over a hundred countries having various and similar pieces of legislation or regulations already in place, there were practices drawn from similar experiences. Since its enactment, the RTE Act has been lauded and disparaged. But there has been concern not only over its provisions but also about the lacunae in the school education system. However, there are clauses in the Act which have enormous catalytic potential but

that have gone largely untouched and unnoticed. A focus on three of these provisions can result in an immediate and discernible impact.

The RTE Act is a game-changer in that it establishes that the onus to ensure free and compulsory education lies on the state. However, the 'compulsory' and 'state liability' part needs to be imbibed by the educational bureaucracy, which is now lacking.

### Focus on retention

Though the Act envisaged that the state, i.e. State governments and panchayats, would aggressively ensure that each child is brought into the schooling system and also "retained" for eight years, it has been business as usual. Unfortunately, tracking dropouts and preparing and mainstreaming them into ageappropriate classes has been subsumed into existing scheme activities. Even seven years after its enactment, there are still children on the streets, in fields and in homes. Therefore, the problem now is more about dropouts than children who were never enrolled. Strategies to ensure retention need to change from the earlier approach of enrolling the un-enrolled. As children out of the fold of schooling are the most hard to reach, such as girls, the disabled, orphans and those from single parent families, the solutions have to be localised and contextualised.

Though criticised as an elitist or input-driven approach, the RTE Act prescribes basic minimum standards for a school such as provision for toilets, drinking water and classrooms.

### **Pupil-Teacher ratio**

The most critical requirement, which has also got the least public attention, is the pupil-teacher ratio (PTR). It is impractical to expect quality education without this. According to the Education Department's data, under the Unified District Information System for Education (U-DISE) database 2015-16, 33% of the schools in the country did not have the requisite number of teachers, as prescribed in the RTE norms, for PTR at the school level. The percentage of schools that were PTR-compliant varied from 100% in Lakshadweep to 16.67% in Bihar. This did not factor in subject-wise teachers at the upper primary level as this is treated differently in each State. All other forward-looking provisions of the Act such as continuous assessment, a child learning at her own pace, and 'no detention' policy are contingent on a school with an adequate number of teachers. No meaningful teaching-learning is possible unless trained teachers are physically present at school. Teachers also need to avail of leave or undergo training, so that 'two teachers per school' is a basic requirement.

States shy away from recruiting or posting more teachers keeping in mind higher salaries and finances, but PTR at the school level is the most critical of all inputs. Teacher provisioning should be the first option to fund as no educationally developed country has built up a sound schooling foundation without a professionally-motivated teaching cadre in place. In States with an adequate overall number of teachers, their positioning or posting requires rationalisation according to the number of students. However, this


gets more lip service than attention as teacher transfers remain a grey area in most States.

The third provision is that the academic calendar will be decided by the local authority, which, for most States and Union Territories, is the panchayat. This provision recognises the vast cultural and regional diversities within the country such as local festivals, sowing and harvesting seasons, and even natural calamities as a result of which schools do not function academically. It is socially acceptable that priority will be given to such a local event and not schooling. Not all festivals and State holidays declared by the

State headquarters may be locally relevant. So if panchayats, perhaps at the district level, decide the working days and holidays, this would not only exponentially increase attendance and teaching-learning but also strengthen local panchayats, being closest to the field, to take ownership of their schools. They would be responsible in ensuring the functioning of the prescribed instruction days. For inexplicable reasons, the educational bureaucracy has not allowed the decentralisation of academic schedules even in districts.

A law is as good or as bad as its implementation. It is unfair to blame legislation alone for the sad state of affairs without implementing it in full measure, especially its enabling provisions. Open-minded adoption of these provisions, keeping the child in mind, can go a long way in radically transforming our school education sector.
