FROM THE **GENERAL SECRETARY'S** DESK

Gifted with a good voice by the Creator, having the privilege of learning music right from my childhood and being a Chorister from my school days, singing and music have become a part of my life in any situation. I have always enjoyed explaining the Physics principles which play a vital role in music and sound. Music sounds a little empty if notes are only played one at a time. Playing more than one note at the same time is called harmony and this interaction between different notes played together that gives music its richness and colour. Tuning of a guitar is one of the best examples to understand the Harmony. When the guitar is tuned perfectly and the chords are played accordingly, the combination of notes will be pleasant and sometimes a sweet sound to the ear. Similar pleasant effect of music (consonant sound) is experienced in Vocal Harmonies where multiple singers sing simultaneously on varying notes and pitches synchronising with the melody of the song.

Friends, in this issue of Chalk and Chai we have brought out the theme

"Teachers as co-labourers with Christ". The Bible says, "For we are God's co-workers in God's service: You God's field, God's building, By the grace God has given me, I laid a foundation as a wise builder, and someone else is building on it. But each one should build with care (1Cor.3:9.10).

I would like to share a few thoughts how the Harmony can explain the characteristics to be the co-labourers or co-workers with God.

H – We are called to work with Christ by being a co-labourer with Him. To merely be the Lord's servant is easier than being the Lord's co-worker like singing in unison is easier than vocal harmonies. We are called to work Hard. The multiple singers in vocal harmonies have strenuous practice working towards the varying notes and pitches synchronising with each other. We are called to be colabourers with Christ not with stunted work ethic with the expectation that very little work is required in the kingdom. To work with Christ as His co-labourer is a training process.

A - Harmony happens with varying notes and pitches which are bound to the melody or tune of the song. When we are called to be the co-labourers with Christ to build His kingdom on this earth, we are called to work with others as co-labourers. The efficiency and fruitfulness of our work is measured not only by our Availability to God but also with our availability to work with others who have different personalities, talents and skills. We may work together with others and yet still not be a co-worker. It is like walking together on four legs. It may be easier to serve a brother than it is to be his co-worker. To be a co-worker initiates a binding. It is similar to binding our legs together to have three legs and to walk together in a three legged race. It's quite hard unless and until we are bound together in Christ.

R - Relationship with God and with others

If the vocal harmonies are not in tune or the pitch assigned to them or if one string in a guitar is unturned, singing or music will not render a pleasing effect. The lesson on harmony with God is a simple way to be inside the government provided by the Lord to walk in tune with God by being in harmony with him and his Word. Two people cannot walk together unless they are in agreement. If they cannot walk together, they cannot work together. This is true not only with our relationship with God but also with our relationship with others. If we are not walking in harmony, we are not going in the same direction, our goals are different and the friction grows and communication deteriorates.

M – Melody of God's will

In vocal harmonies the melody or the tune of the song is never erased or removed. In fact harmony provides richness to the melody. As colabourers of Christ, we are called *at all times to* stay in life giving commission to fulfil the task in God's **will**, the **Melody**. We have to strive to accomplish it every single day.

O-Opportunities

Harmony in music honours each other .There are times when a particular instrument is given importance to be sounded uniquely or preference is given to the singers with certain notes to be sung explicitly and to be heard but no music instrument or singer is allowed to sing harshly or dominate suppressing others' tone and music. To be colabourers with Christ and others. means that not only are we committed to execute the responsibilities assigned to us but also are called to honour others and provide opportunities and responsibilities to the colabourers to complete the task of our Master. He who plants and he who waters are one in purpose and each will be rewarded according to his own labour.

N-No work

To bring richness in harmony, music allows entry points and exit points to have rest and intervals for certain instruments in an orchestra or certain voices in vocal harmonies. To be co-labourers with Christ reminds us not to be driven to be work-a-holics. Let us remember that Jesus with whom we are called to work as co-labourers called it the "good portion". (Luke 10:38-42). The

problem with Martha was not that she was working. The problem was that Martha was letting the work dominate her. She was distracted and anxious. She was mad at the world for not working as hard as she was. Her work didn't allow her a single moment to sit at the feet of Jesus. Let it not be so with us in our mission for God and in our family too. Let the work be filled with grace and health. Don't let the harsh, never-satisfied idol of achievement rob us of the good portion every day.

Y-Yoke of Christ

A voke is literally a wooden beam that connects two working animals. It keeps their pace in-step with one another. We are connected to Jesus in that way. We are connected to his rhythms. We are connected to his broad shoulders that carry the weight. His burden on us, is light. He said that His "yoke" is easy. Let Jesus take the weight. When God works, let us work. When God rests, let us have rest. When God withdraws, let us withdraw. When God goes on, let us go on because as co labourers we are connected and bounded by the yoke, Jesus Himself.

In this issue. Dr. John Zachariah brings out the essentials of images of Jesus in His Person as well in His Teachings to be adopted by teachers who wish to be the co-labourers with Christ, Mr. J. S. A. Julius highlights the significance of being the fellow workers with God. The testimony by Mr. Edison emphasises how obeving the voice of God and the word of God helped him to be a fellow worker with God in bringing souls into His kingdom and be a blessing. 'Reflections' by Mr. Ashish Daniel and "Are we led by Heart or Brain?" by Mr. Vijay brings out a few aspects to adopt when we work as co-labourers with Christ.

May God bless us to get tuned with the truth and flow in HARMONY with Him as we strive to work with Christ as His Co-labourers.



REFLECTIONS



INCIDENT 1

When I happened to interact with a teenager, he shared about a bitter experience which took place in his life. In an odd effort to describe the scenario, he expressed his hatred to be a part of the institution where his father worked. He went on to explain the kind of insult his father was subjected to by the leader who was his father's superior. He recounted how his dad stood in tears in front of him after being severely berated. While narrating this incident, I noticed his eyes turning red! This incident happened over a year ago; yet, he could not get himself out of this catastrophe.

Having experienced a very similar situation even during my teenage years, I could very certainly relate to him and help out but the negative impact on him due to the incident made me think a lot.

INCIDENT 2

This incident could be an eye opener!

The leader was retiring. All eyes welled up in tears on the day of his farewell. One of the employees said, "Sir, there is one thing we want to learn from you. You worked here for so many years. Leave aside scolding your subordinates but we have never seen you even shouting at them. We have scolded our subordinates at times when pressure builds around or for other reasons. We want to know about the seed of your patience.

The leader said, "All this materialized due to an incident that goes all the way back to my childhood. My father was working as a lower level employee in an office. He was a very nice person. He was respected very much in our family.

It happened one day that I had gone to my father's office for some

reason when I was in my 4th Standard. I saw that my father was not at his place. I waited outside. After some time, his boss' office door opened and my father came out through the door. I noticed that the fair face of my father had turned red. He went straight to a corner and stood there looking outside through a window. He had not seen me. I went to him and called him slowly. He was taken aback and surprised and turned back to look at me. I saw stream of tears flowing down his eyes. He was slightly disturbed seeing me. He did not find time to wipe away his tears.

Could my father cry anytime?

He was the strongest man in the world for me. It was beyond my wildest imagination that someone could hurt him. I ran straight to the room of the boss. My father kept calling me from behind. But, listening to nothing, I went inside and asked the boss, "Why did you make my father cry?" The boss was also surprised. Thereafter, my father tried to make me understand. But, that day I had decided to take revenge on the boss.

From that day on, I decided that I would study well and become a boss one day but I would not make my subordinates cry at anytime. This is because, they are not only just employees in my office but they are also respected and someone's dear father or brother or somebody in their families and they belong to someone important.

People say it is not possible to control others without scolding them. I say, what is love then for? As it goes beautifully in James 1:20 'Human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires'.

People who come to work are the ones who give their best and devote quality time of the day to work, leaving not much time for their families. They do deserve a better treatment from the people around them.

Ships don't sink because of the water around them; ships sink because of the water that gets into them. Don't let what's happening around you and your circumstances get into your mind and weigh you down.

Make your life count where peace becomes your priority with no negativity existing around you.

Just because you're angry that doesn't give you the right to be cruel.

Anger on the other hand doesn't solve anything, it builds nothing, rather it can destroy everything.

Neurologists claim that every time you resist acting on your anger, you're actually rewiring your brain to be calmer and more loving.

The less you respond to rude, critical, argumentative people, the more peaceful your life becomes.

Explain your anger instead of expressing it and you will come up with solutions instead of arguments.

Proverbs 29:11 puts it as 'Fools give full vent to their rage but the wise bring calm in the end'.

People don't quit organizations, they quit their Boss/Superior. As a leader, do I influence positively or boss around?

To my Teenage friends, I can boldly share my life as a testimony of how God can honour us in the same place if we don't sink. Although several incidents during my teenage phase are still afresh, it was not easy, yet I have never allowed them to sink me. Had I allowed myself to sink, I would never have been in God's bigger purpose for my life.

Let me close with one statement which I learnt from my leader.

Since the time I joined as a Project in-charge of a Polytechnic Construction unit and later as its Director, I have been directly reporting to Uncle Augustine Jebakumar. Whenever I shared issues about my subordinates and wanted to vent my anger by taking action, he would beautifully say "If there is a wound in your hand

or elsewhere in the body, would you cut off the hand or that part from the body and remove it or instead would try hard to treat it gently by applying ointment and medicine. Although it may seem that the cutting off is an easier option, on grounds of bringing in a solution, it fails to achieve the necessary. Treating the wound instead with patience and care is the wisest options to bring in a cure, even though it may take quite some time. This understanding has helped me a lot while handling people and reminds me of Proverbs 19:11: 'A person's wisdom yields patience; it is one's glory to overlook an offense'.

We are called to build lives, so let us not cut and throw them away for it is treatable.

Let us Build and not Break.

FELLOW WORKERS with GOD

A. WHO EXACTLY ARE CHRISTIANS ACCORDING TO PAUL?

CHRISTIANS ARE SERVANTS (1 Cor. 3: 5)

Paul asks two questions:

"What, after all, is Apollos? And what is Paul?" Paul and Apollos were only servants through whom the Corinthians had come to believe.

Jesus taught us to be servants, didn't he? Why would Paul want to emphasize that he and Apollos were only servants? How do we view ourselves—as people whom others should serve or as servants for the cause of Christ? Paul, of course, is discussing his and Apollos' service in helping the Corinthians to come to faith.

CHRISTIANS ARE LABOURERS (1 Cor. 3: 6-7)

Paul planted the seed, Apollos watered it; but God made it grow (v. 6)

Planting the seed obviously refers to Paul's work in establishing the church in Corinth and watering refers to Apollos' work with the congregation after Paul's departure. God made it grow.

Neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God. who makes things grow (v. 7)

Paul is making the point that because he and Apollos are nothing, they do not deserve the following as those in Corinth were giving to them. It is only God who makes things grow; therefore, only God deserves allegiance, not Paul and not Apollos. Sadly though, today in many congregations allegiance is given to the preacher and not to God.

CHRISTIANS ARE GOD'S FELLOW WORKERS (1 Cor.3: 8-9)

The man who plants and the man who waters have one purpose (v. 8a)

Although Paul and Apollos had slightly different roles in Corinth, they

had the same purpose: the advancement of the Gospel. They were not concerned with their own advancement; they were not concerned with getting a following; they were not concerned with splitting the church in Corinth.

Each man will be rewarded according to his own labour (v. 8b)

The idea of being rewarded or punished for our work on earth is a common theme in Scripture but scripture also clearly says, "according to his own labour."

We are God's fellow workers (1 Cor.3: 9)

It is uncertain what Paul means by God's fellow workers, for he could mean two things which are equally true:

- 1. Paul could mean that he and Apollos worked together for the cause of Christ—this is a point that he made previously when he said that he planted and Apollos watered.
- 2. Paul could also mean that he and Apollos worked together with God—this is also a point he had made previously when he says that he planted. Apollos watered, and God gave the growth.

Paul says that the Corinthians were God's field, God's building. Paul had already used the agricultural metaphor as he talked about the planting and watering he and Apollos had accomplished. Paul also refers to the Corinthians as God's building.

- We need to ask ourselves what kind of people are we?
- Do we have a servant heart? Do we have a humble heart realizing that the world does not revolve around us?
- Are we working with fellow believers and with God to spread His Word throughout this community?

B. GOD'S CALL TO BECOME FELLOW-WORKERS WITH GOD

I What is God's call for us believers?

He has called us:

(I) To Live a Holy Life

(1 Thess. 4:7,8).

1 Peter 1:16 is God telling us to be holy just like He is. Without Holiness, no one can see God. This is a general call after the call to repentance. All believers are called to be saints(Rom.1:17). The ultimate purpose of such a call is that we might be conformed in to the image of Jesus Christ (Rom. 8:30).

(ii) To be His Effective Witnesses

All believers in Christ are called to be God's fellow workers(1 Cor.3:9-15) or co-labourers. We are called to build the Church of God on the foundation which is Jesus Christ. Each man's work will be tested and rewarded by our Lord. Christians cannot just while away time and rest. There is a general call to all believers to be witnesses for Christ and win souls for the Kingdom of God.

(III) To Specific Christian Service

All Believers in Christ are called to be saints(Rom.1:7) and to be witnesses but not all are called to be Apostles(1 Cor. 12:29). Paul carefully points out that he was a genuine apostle(1Cor.9:1,2). He insisted that he was an apostle by the will of God(1 Cor.1:1) and by the call of God(Rom. 1:1). Paul did not choose this high calling(1Cor. 9:16-18). It was not conferred upon him by others(Gal. 1:1).

Hence the call for specific Christian Service is a very definite call. There has to be a definite and a clear-cut call from the Master to His service and no one can choose it as a profession. What work we are called is not important; but how we do the job is important. Mordecai was only a gate-keeper but he in volved whole heartedly. Let us remember what Jesus told his disciples in John 15:16, "You did not choose me, but I chose and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit.

What job we do is not the criteria in life, but how we do it that is important (Esther 4:13,14).

II How does one receive this call?

A person can receive this call at any time in his/her life after obeying the call to repentance. Most often, the call is a growing conviction based on certain well-defined principles laid down in the Word of God.

We need to have:

(I) An Open Mind to accept anything the Lord would tell us.

- (ii) An Attentive Ear that accompanies an open mind,
- (iii) A Pure Heart,
- (iv) Busy Hands because any person contemplating even the possibility of a call should begin by getting involved in some kind of a Christian Ministry such as Sunday School, taking Bible Studies for small groups, etc. Jesus said, "We must work the works of Him who sent me while it is day; night comes when no man can work".
- (v) Ready Feet to be ready to receive and obey the call of God at any time.

STEPS TO RESPONDING TO THIS CALL

#1 RECEIVE THE CALL AND OBEY THE CALL BY SAYING "YES" TO THE LORD

We need to take the first step and receive the call. The Lord will take the next while preparing you for the ministry, showing you what type of ministry you should be doing and where your ministry would be.

#2 ACTIVATION OF THIS CALL WHEN THE LORD STARTS WORKING IN US

This is a developmental process that may take months, even years to reach fulfillment and involves many stages in itself.

These are:


- a) CURIOSITY which is peaked through something we read in a book, or a causal remark by a friend, or a letter from a missionary, a hymn sung at church, etc.
- that caught his/her attention, thinking, probably for the first time about missions, attending mission camps, etc.
- **c) UNDERSTANDING** indepth the area of interest.
- d) ASSURANCE that is a product of understanding kindling one to share one's heart with others.
- conviction inspired by the Holy Spirit and the Word of God, propelling one forward towards the call.
- f) COMMITMENT to the particular call of God.
- g) ACTION that is the culmination of the commitment taken, leading to the individual taking preparatory steps to equip oneself for the God given call.

These 7 Steps involve the whole man. The first three – Curiosity, Interest & Understanding involve the MIND. The Next three – Assurance, Conviction & Commitment involve the HEART. The last one- Action involves the WILL.

The missionary will be blessed indeed whose mind, heart and will are all involved in his high calling. He will not fail, nor will be become a dropout. He will be a missionary by the Will of God, by the Call of Christ and by the leading of the Holy Spirit.



Brain and Heart



God our creator has wonderfully created the human beings and based on a few research papers on the heart, I would like to share a few thoughts about the Human Brain and the Human Heart from the Biblical perspective.

Although the **HEART** is always considered to be a vital organ to life, recent research on the heart shows that about 40000 neurons could be found in the heart along with a whole network of neurotransmitters with very specific functions making the heart responsible for thinking as a perfect extension of the brain. Moreover, research highlights that there are three unique characteristics of the heart. Firstly, about 67% of the cells in the heart are nerve cells and the heart is the only organ that can send information autonomously to the brain based on the organic stimuli it receives. Secondly, our hearts are responsible for homeostasis which is

one of the vital functions of the heart which guarantees our emotional balance. Thirdly, our hearts are characterized by electromagnetic vibrations (Positive attracting positive and negative attracting negative) found to be 5,000 times more powerful than the brain which makes the heart to function as a powerful communication system better than the brain. These recent research discoveries about the heart is leading the human race into a new understanding that the human heart is more than a rational organ, it's a purely a sensing organ that can make decisions for itself based on certain stimuli and like the neurologists, cardiologists also explain, the heart can act independently from the brain.

The **BRAIN** contains neurons which are responsible for thinking. Brain is responsible for the functions of the five sense organs (eyes, ears, nose, tongue, skin). Based on these

sense organs we live our daily lives. So our brain is responsible for our thinking (mind) and helps us to communicate with the world. Worldly wisdom, knowledge and understanding are the inputs to the brain from the world.

While Devil communicates to the Brain through worldly wisdom knowledge and understanding, the Lord ALWAYS communicates to heart through the heavenly wisdom, knowledge and understanding.

God's priority is always with respect to man's heart. I would like to quote a few examples from the Bible:

♦ In Matthew 4:1-11, we read, how satan was tempting Jesus for physical needs like food and social needs like materials and power. Here, while satan communicated to the brain, Jesus communicated to him from His heart and satan ran away.

"Positive attracts positive and Negative attracts negative" in the heart!

- "Be not deceived; God is not mocked; for whatsoever man sows that shall he also reap" (Gal 6:7)
- ◆ "As the man thinketh in his heart, so is he"(Proverbs 23:7).
- We are made righteous with God by Faith. (Rom 3:22).
 Faith is positive; being made right with God is positive

Communication to the heart:

Do not be shaped by the world.

- Instead be changed within by a new way of thinking. (Rom 12:2)
- Only the Lord gives wisdom, Knowledge and understanding come from Him. (Pro.2:10)
- You will have wisdom in your heart. And knowledge will be pleasing to you (Pro.3:5).
- Trust the Lord with all your heart.
 Don't depend on your own understanding (Pro.3:6).
- Don't depend on your own wisdom. Respect the Lord and refuse to do wrong(Pro.3:7)

For those who want to live according to the worldly views,

Brain is the master

and the heart is the slave.

But for those who want to live according to the Biblical view,

Heart is the Master (Jesus Christ)

and the brain is the slave.

When we are made right with God in our hearts, we begin to think right in our hearts, we begin to talk right and we begin to act right.

I would like to end with a story:

A king had a male servant who, under any circumstances said to him: My king, do not be discouraged because everything God does is perfect and He makes no mistakes. One day, they went hunting and a wild animal attacked the king. The servant managed to kill the animal but couldn't prevent his majesty from losing a finger. Furious and without showing any gratitude, the king said: "If God was good, I would not have been attacked and lose one finger". The servant replied: "Despite all things, I can only tell you that God is good and everything He does is

perfect; he is never wrong. Outraged by the response the king ordered that the servant be imprisoned.

Later, the king left for another hunt and was captured by savages who used human beings as sacrifice on the altar, the savages discovered that the king did not have one finger in place and released him because they considered him to be "incomplete" to be offered to their Gods. On returning to his palace, the king authorized the release of his servant and told his servant: "My friend, God was really good to me. Since I lacked a single finger, I was let go." "However, I have a question," the king added." If God is so good, why did he allow me to put you in prison?" The servant wisely replied: "My king, if I had gone with you, I would have been sacrificed because I have no missing finger."

Obey the Lord and Be a co-worker with Him

A Testimony by Prof. H.C. Edison

I am the eldest of ten children. My father was a headmaster in the Tirunelveli Diocese, I completed my schooling at Caldwell High school, Tuticorin, and my intermediate at St. John's College, Palayamcottai. At Presidency College, I secured a degree in Physics B.Sc. (Hons.) just scrapping through in 1957. I went on to work in two colleges and later worked in a College in Viruthunagar in 1960. I studied my Masters privately at Madurai Kamaraj University followed by M.Phil. as a regular student passing in First Class. My wife whom I married in 1963 is a home maker and we are blessed with three children, all of whom are married and well settled in

life and are blessed with children. My daughter has become a grand-mother! I have five grand children and one great grand-daughter.

I was a bad husband, father and a man not afraid of sin. Nevertheless, I was a regular church goer and was also a choir member: Being a very good teacher, I was respected and loved by my students.

But God touched me through my son's life. He had joined MCC at Tambaram to pursue his undergraduate studies in Physics. He was brilliant in higher secondary but was unable to pass any paper except English. I realised that this was not



normal and hence, consulted an evangelist. He advised me to call on the Lord. One midnight, I fell on my knees and prayed to the Lord. Jesus spoke to me and told me that my son's failure in life was not because of God but rather because of the sin in my life. The Lord asked me to read Job 21:19, "God layeth up his inquity for His children. He rewardeth him. and he shall know it". Jesus said that He permitted many failures in my life but that I was insensitive and never came to the Lord. Then I cried and asked Jesus to forgive me for all my sins.

The Lord said, "You obey; I am responsible for the consequences and will take the responsibility of rebuilding of your family".

I obeyed the Lord and He has rebuilt my family as He promised He would. My son is now a national manager in a reputed company at Chennai. My second daughter was a gold medallist in M.Com., MKU. My third daughter completed her doctorate in Bio-Chemistry while working at CMC Vellore and has successfully guided Ph.D. students.

After my conversion, a great change was seen in my life. Sincere in my duty, I was always willing to take class for others. There was perfect discipline in my classes. I was interested in my students and would help them clear their doubts. I played football and basketball with my students. For 19 years I was an NCC officer holding the rank of a MAJOR and even commanded 28TN Battalion NCC for 8 months.

By God's grace, I led the prayer cell for our college and Polytechnic students. God saved many of them and many have joined full time ministry.

After retirement. I became the Principal of Bishop Caldwell College in Tuticorin and started prayer groups for students and Bible study for teachers. One day, while taking a moral instruction class for students. I told them that the Bible was the Word of God. It had the power to change lives and I spoke about the love of God for man. Fifteen years later I met a sister by name Kalaichelvi in a Christian meeting. She said that her sister believed what I said and wanted a Bible. She belonged to a Hindu family and hence no one had a Bible. She had a Christian aunt and therefore got the Bible from her and started reading it. God spoke to her. She firmly believed that Jesus is the one true God: became a Christian and wanted to marry a believer. Looking at her life, obedience and love for the Lord, her father and mother became Christians. Through her, her elder sister (who told me about the girl) became a Christian and married a Hindu convert and both are involved in ministry.

Because I obeyed, God transformed many persons. *Commit yourself to God totally* and He will give you peace and prosperity and use you mightly for His Glory




Image Bearers of GOD

Introduction:

Teachers are the most influential section of the society, for the better or for the worse. In either case they are appreciated and followed by the students under their care. Hence the image and character of the teacher decides the future of the society.

Teacher doesn't refer to only the one who teaches in classrooms of schools or universities. Parents, siblings, friends and heroes or leaders of the society may also be regarded as teachers. But teachers are the most important section of the society who contribute to building up of individuals and the society at large. In the heritage of the Indian Gurukul culture, students were staying in the homes of the teachers to learn of the teacher (including the lifestyle and principles practiced by the Guru) more than from the mouth of the teachers.

When Jesus exhorted his disciples: "Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls" (AKJV), what He meant was more than learning from Him but learning of His practical life. He told them His image was 'meek and lowly' and that, in this learning process, they would find rest for their souls (not for the spirit but also for the soul which consists of the Mind or Intelligence, Emotions and Will).

GURU is from: Gu = darkness; Ru = Light. (One who leads from darkness into light)

SIR: derived from Sire = Father

'Sir' is used for teacher, to mean surrogate parent. No parent is fully

competent to 'train up the child': hence, the educational system and teachers help in addition to the parents. For some children, their parents may not be serving well. In these cases, the children should find a loving, caring, sharing, disciplining parent in the teacher. The influence of teachers for the better is not only limited to their students but will be extended to their families, if the teacher is really committed. So their image and integrity are most important for the world/ society at large.

Image lost and regained

God *created* man in His *own* image, in the image of God created He him; male and female created He them (Gen.1:27). Due to the Fall, man lost his image or glory of God and became naked (Rom.3:23). Jesus came to the world that we may regain the lost glory of God, in our Lord Jesus Christ (2 Thess.2:14).

No man hath seen God at any time; the only begotten Son, who is in the bosom of the Father, He hath declared Him (John 1:18); who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person (Heb.1:3); who is the image of the invisible God (Col.1:15). So God's plan of salvation for us is that "we all, with open face, beholding as in a glass, the Glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord" (2 Cor.3:18); He also did predestinate us to be conformed to the image of his Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren (Rom.8:29); it is for us to have the

image of the Lord Jesus Christ (Phil.2:5). This status is (to be) true about all believers.

We can never be perfect in attaining this goal; but we must aspire to be transformed by the daily renewing of our mind, that we may be confirmed to the image of God, Jesus Christ being our model (Rom. 12:2).

Teachers as image bearers of Jesus

Jesus was an effective preacher and a sought-after healer. But He was more so, a Master Teacher. In the gospels, we encounter a variety of teaching episodes and learning experiences from Jesus, not only for the twelve disciples but for groups of thousands or a single individual. In the Gospels He was called mostly as Guru (teacher) than anything else. So Jesus is our model Master Teacher. As Jesus said, "it is enough for the disciple that he be as his Master, and the servant as his Lord" (Mat.10:25). We, teachers, need to follow the Master Teacher steps, for the glory of God, for attaining the lost glory for ourselves and also to be channels of blessings to many reflecting the life of our Guru in us.

While we teach secular subjects, we are called to teach and train our students in the development of their personality and character to face and overcome the challenges and temptations in life and to empower them to serve the society at large over and above finding their (ours too) livelihood. These can be taught only by teachers who have acquired such a personality for themselves.

They will seek and find opportunities to mentor their students.

We will consider a few aspects of our bearing the image of Jesus:

A. HIS TEACHING MINISTRY B. HIS PERSON

A. HIS TEACHING MINISTRY

1. His Five-step teaching ministry we need to follow:

Jesus oriented His teaching to actively engage His students in the learning experience. To do this, He focused on the five steps:

Thinking Knowing Understanding Being and Doing.

We, as teachers, need to be trained in these five qualities that we help the students to follow these steps in their learning experience, whether in secular subjects or spiritual maturity.

Thinking: When teaching, Jesus would often ask His students, "What do you *think*?" In introducing the story of the good shepherd, for example, He extended an invitation to consider carefully the meaning of the story.

Knowing: For Christ, knowledge was important. When the Sadducees presented him with the "impossible riddle" of the woman who consecutively married seven brothers, Jesus replied, "You are in error because you do not **know** the

Scriptures or the power of God." Throughout his teaching, Jesus emphasized the importance of knowing the truth and of developing an experiential knowledge of God.

Understanding: Knowledge cannot stand alone. Christ also viewed understanding as crucial. Telling the parable of a farmer planting his field, He stated, "The one who received the seed that fell on good soil is the man who hears the word and *understands* it." At the close of His ministry, after washing the disciples' feet, Jesus asked them: "Do you *understand* what I have done for you?"

Being: On one occasion, an expert in the law asked Jesus: "Who is my neighbour?" Jesus told the story of the Good Samaritan, and then redirected the lawyer's question to a matter of *being*: "Which was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" Or simply, "Be ready." Jesus also spoke of the importance of exemplifying specific virtues in one's life. "Be merciful," He urged, "just as your Father is merciful." "Be as shrewd as snakes and as innocent as doves."

Doing: Christ highlighted the concept that knowledge should be put into practice and should be evident in what he or she does. "Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you **do** them." Furthermore, He taught that the actions of one's life influence destiny. "Not everyone who says to me, Lord, Lord, will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only he who **does** the will of my Father who is in heaven."

2. Follow His strategies

We need to learn the various strategies Jesus adopted in His teaching. His teachings were to transform the person and not just to impart some information. So the teacher must touch and influence the life of his students so as to realize and extract their maximum potential. The strategies Jesus adopted must be a subject of continuous study as well as application for the teacher in his teaching. A detailed study of His strategies is beyond the scope of this article. But let us highlight a few:

- ★ Jesus used **illustrations**: Many of these included vivid imagery like picking grapes from the thorn bushes, pouring new wine into old wineskins, a thief breaking unexpectedly into a house and the blind leading the blind.
- ★ Jesus also told stories of which some 40 are recorded; to make His lessons more easily remembered and to serve as the basis for future learning. These stories were generally brief—on average, just seven verses in length. Jesus' stories were not complex, with multiple meanings. Generally, He would focus on a key point.
- ★ Jesus used News items and Historical events. Frequently Jesus made use of similes and metaphors often extending these into well-developed analogies. Christ pointed out the hypocrisy and skin-deep religiosity of the scribes and Pharisees, likening them to "whitewashed tombs." In

similar ways, Christ used analogies of a fig tree in spring time and of a hen gathering her chicks.

 \star

★ Jesus used Tangible objects to bring His messages across convincingly to His disciples and the public. When He was asked, "Is it right to pay taxes to Caesar or not?" He used the portrait on the coin and told them to "Give then to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's."

 \star

★ Jesus asked Questions for a variety of reasons including,

To remember the known
To clarify concepts
To guide thinking
To correct erroneous ideas
To motivate personalthought
To affirm truth in the mind
To invite a faith response
For an answer from the listeners
in problem solving.

Jesus used Analysis and Reasoning: Jesus invited His listeners to engage in logical reasoning; Comparison and Contrast: On various occasions, Christ led His students through comparison and contrast. Anomalies: Christ wanted His students to grapple with conundrums and thereby engage in deep thinking. For example, the paradox that He used for this purpose: "Whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slave".

★ His Enacted teaching:

In prison, John the Baptist wondered if Jesus was truly the Messiah. He sent his disciples to ask. Jesus did not immediately reply but rather went about the activities of His ministry. At the end of the day, Jesus said to these disciples, "Go back and report to John what you hear and see: The blind receive sight, the lame walk...and the good news is preached to the poor."

* Active Learning: Jesus believed that it was important for His students to be actively involved in learning. Consider the issue of His paying tax questioned by tax collectors. Peter admitted that sons are exempted from tax payment. But Jesus told him to pay the tax so that we may not offend them.

★ Collaborative Learning:

Through His short period of ministry, Christ sent His students to individually apply what they had learned. In commissioning the 12 disciples, however, Jesus sent them out two by two. In like manner, He sent out some 70 others.

We will continue to know how to inherit the image of His person.

B. HIS PERSON:

More significant, however, was the person of the One who taught, over His strategies. It is true about us too; the teacher is more significant than what and how he teaches. The message is not independent of the Messenger. So we, teachers are to imitate Christ, not only the way we communicate and teach but also the way we live, the way we are.

A few important characteristics we need to reflect from the life and ministry of Jesus, the Guru are:

1. Context of Joy:

Jesus intentionally created a learning climate of joy. The scribes noted, for example, that John the Baptist's disciples often fasted and prayed, while Christ's disciples didn't. Jesus responded that it is appropriate for the guests at a wedding to celebrate when the bridegroom is with them. In His teaching, Christ spoke of great rejoicing in heaven over a single sinner who repents, of experiencing fullness of joy, and of living life to the full.

2. Invitation to Success:

When Jesus called Peter and his brother Andrew to join His ministry, He did not initially invite them to become public speakers or church leaders. Rather, He said, "Come, follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." Instead of concentrating on what His students could not do, Jesus chose to focus on their success in what they were acquainted with.

3. Tenderness and Sympathy:

As a teacher, Christ was caring and compassionate.

A few examples:

When He saw the crowds, He had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. He asked

the disciples to pray for mentors. Finally, He selected twelve of them to be the Caretakers of the helpless. Do we sense what others couldn't with the mind of Christ?

When the apostles reported to Him all they had done and taught, He asked them, "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest."

When they were terrified, seeing Him walking on the lake and thought He was a ghost, immediately He told them, "Take courage! It is I; don't be afraid."

Jesus straightened up and asked the woman presented before Him, caught in adultery, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" "No one, sir," she said. "Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "Go now and leave your life of sin."

When Mary fell at His feet, grieved by the death of her brother and said, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." When Jesus saw her and her friends weeping, He was deeply moved in spirit and troubled......and Jesus wept. Then the Jews said, "See how He loved him!"

4. His humility:

Christ's action as a servant, washing His disciples' feet, is a powerful testimony to His humble spirit. This was not, however, an isolated incident. When Jesus became aware that the Pharisees realised that His disciples had baptized more followers than John

the Baptist, He did not cite the fulfilment of John's words, "He must increase, but I must decrease." Rather, Jesus quietly left the setting of His overwhelming popularity and departed again to Galilee. "Humility is perfect quietness of heart.

It is to expect nothing, to wonder at nothing that is done to me, to feel nothing done against me.

It is to be at rest when nobody praises me, and when I am blamed or despised.

It is to have a blessed home in the Lord, where I can go in and shut the door, and kneel to my Father in secret, and am at peace as in a deep sea of calmness, when all around and above is trouble." Andrew Murray (1828-1917)

5. Conscious of Context:

Jesus was perceptive about His surroundings and that awareness guided His teaching. Once, Jesus asked them, "What were you arguing about on the road?" The disciples kept quiet because they had been arguing about who was the greatest. Sitting down, Jesus reminded them, "If anyone wants to be first, he must be the very last, and the servant of all."

Jesus was also sensitive to the "absorption level" of his learners. Mark indicates that Christ taught only as much as His learners could understand while John records that near the end of His ministry, Christ told his disciples, "I still have many things to say to you but you cannot bear them now." Each of these

incidents is an indicator that Christ was observant of the contexts and attuned to the needs of his students.

6. Personal Association:

Shortly after Christ's baptism, John the Baptist pointed to Christ and identified Him as the Lamb of God. Two of John's disciples heard the pronouncement and decided to follow Him. Jesus asked, "What do you want?" They replied, "Teacher, where are you staying?" "Come," Jesus said, "and you will see." So they went and spent that day with Him. Jesus was accessible and personable.

Early one morning, after His resurrection, Jesus stood on the shore of Galilee but the disciples in a fishing boat did not recognize Him. "Come," He called out, "let's have breakfast together." He was not there to rebuke them for their backsliding although after a while, He passionately and lovingly exhorted Peter to feed His sheep.

7. Differentiation:

Jesus cared deeply for each of His students and saw unlimited potential in each life. However, this did not imply that He treated everyone the same. Rather, He differentiated His instructions in order to meet His students' backgrounds, needs, abilities and dreams.

At a meal in Simon, the Pharisee's house, a woman of ill repute arrived uninvited and broke open an alabaster jar of ointment to anoint Jesus' feet. When Simon wondered to himself how Jesus could be a prophet and permit such a travesty,

Jesus told Simon a story of two debtors, one who owed much and the other but little. Although it might seem the perfect opportunity to expose Simon's own hypocrisy, Jesus used a "silk glove" approach in which none but Simon understood the true meaning of the story.

In contrast, consider the case of Simon Peter. When Jesus began to explain to His disciples of His impending death, Peter began to rebuke Him. In the presence of all the disciples, Jesus turned to Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan!" Here Jesus used "shock therapy." Two men, even with the same name, but a very different approach.

8. Held Children in High Regard:

When the disciples tried to turn away those who brought the children to be blessed, Jesus intervened, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." On another occasion, Jesus instructed His disciples, "See that you do not look down on one of these little ones. For I tell you that their angels in heaven always see the face of my Father." For those who abused children. Christ had stern words. "If anyone causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin. it would be better for him to be thrown into the sea with a large millstone tied around his neck."

9. Valued the Marginalised:

Jesus also reached out to those who were rejected by society. These included the poor, ethnic minorities and cultural outcasts. With these He associated — conversing, visiting

their homes, and touching the "untouchables." He was not worried about the criticism of others in these His actions.

When Jesus went to stay with Zacchaeus, all the people began to mutter, "He has gone to be the guest of a sinner."

The Samaritans, the nonassociable community to the Jews, came to Him and urged Him to stay with them, and He stayed with them for two days.

He appreciated the poor widow who put in two very small copper coins, worth only a fraction of a penny. He said to His disciples, "I tell you the truth, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others."

Jesus reached out His hand and touched the untouchable man with leprosy.

To the surprise of His disciples, Jesus associated not only with a Samaritan, member of non-associable community but also with a woman ostracized by her own community because of her ill reputation.

10. Centrality of Prayer:

Frequently, Jesus would seek out a quiet place to pray— sometimes early in the morning, or at evening, or through the entire night. He didn't pray just for Himself and for the work He had been given but also for His students. Perhaps the greatest characteristic of the greatest Teacher who ever lived was the importance of

prayer in His life. Jesus' prayer life so impressed His disciples that one day, when He finished praying, one of His students requested, "Lord, teach us to pray."

11. The influence of Jesus:

Jesus had a profound influence on His students. When He taught, His listeners were surprised by his teaching, because He spoke with confidence, in contrast to the teachers of the law. Turning to each other in amazement, they asked, "Where did this man get these things?" "Nothing like this has ever been seen in Israel."

One day, alarmed about Jesus' growing popularity, the chief priests sent the temple guards to arrest Him. At the end of the day, the guards returned empty-handed. "Why didn't you bring him in?" the priests raged. "No one ever spoke the way this man does," the guards declared.

After His resurrection, Christ appeared unrecognized to two of His disciples on the road to Emmaus and fell into conversation with them. Later that evening, when they finally realized who their Guest had been, they exclaimed, "Were not our hearts burning within us while He talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?"

The Teacher sent from God can also be experienced in our lives that we might teach as He taught.

12. His availability and differencing strategies to individuals:

For Nicodemus who came at night, outside of office hours!

- He challenged Him, "You, a teacher, do not know this?"
- Anomaly. "You must be born again."
- Analogy. Compared the Holy Spirit to the wind.
- Historical Event. Moses lifting up the serpent in the wilderness.
- Contrast. Light vs. darkness, condemnation vs. salvation.
- Transition. Concrete to abstract, physical to spiritual.
- Affective dimension. "For God so loved the world."
- Purpose. To experience salvation and enter into eternal life. The rest of the story. John 7:45-52; 19:38-40. For the Sam-aritan woman, He made himself available at noon time.

- Initiative. Jesus asked her, "Could you give me a drink?"
- Motivation. Begins with water, the student's immediate interest.
- Anomaly. "You will not be thirsty again."
- Transition. Known to unknown, physical to spiritual, immediate to eternal.
- Active learning. "Call your husband."
- Concept clarification. Worship is not a place, but a spiritual experience.
- Purpose. To know God and experience His transforming power. The rest of the story. John 4: 27-45

Jesus has called us to be His disciples, especially as teachers, as He was. We are to represent Him to the people around that they may see, meet and get taught and comforted by Him, through us His image-bearers. The attributes and character of Jesus shared above are to be assimilated and applied in our context and the people we are to disciple.



Teachers and parents may inadvertently play a role in a child developing the fear of numbers

Girls tend to be more affected by 'maths anxiety' than boys, according to a study which shows that teachers and parents may inadvertently play a role in a child developing the fear of numbers.

While mathematics is often considered a hard subject, not all difficulties with the subject result from cognitive difficulties. Many children and adults experience feelings of anxiety,



apprehension, tension or discomfort when confronted by a maths problem.

Scientists at the University of Cambridge explored the nature and resolution of 'mathematics anxiety'

In a sample of 1,000 Italian students, the researchers found that girls in both primary and secondary school had higher levels of both maths anxiety and general anxiety.

More detailed investigation in 1,700 U.K. schoolchildren found that a general feeling that maths was more difficult often contributed to maths anxiety, leading to a lack or loss of confidence.

Students pointed to poor results or negative comparisons to peers or siblings as reasons for feeling anxious.

"While every child's maths anxiety may be different, with unique origins and triggers, we found several common issues among both the primary and secondary school students that we interviewed," said Denes Szucs from the university.

Students often discussed the role that their teachers and parents played in their development of maths anxiety. Primary-aged children referred to instances where they had been confused by different teaching methods, while secondary students commented on poor interpersonal relations.

Secondary students indicated that the transition from primary to secondary school had been a cause of maths anxiety, as the work seemed harder and they could not cope. There was also greater pressure from tests and an homework load.

Teachers and parents also need to be aware that their own maths anxiety might influence the child's anxiety and that gendered stereotypes about mathematics suitability and ability might contribute to the gender gap in maths performance.
