May our good Lord help us to plant the seed of love for people and His creation in the hearts of the younger generation by teaching them with the love of God in our hearts.





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

There was no unreality in the teaching of the Lord Jesus.

Jesus taught about Salt and Light. Jesus taught about the law. Jesus taught about anger. Jesus taught about divorce. Jesus taught about vows. Jesus taught about revenge. Jesus taught about loving enemies. He taught about heaven. He taught about giving to the needy. All the four gospels describe His teaching.

Jesus felt the need for teaching the people. He felt the need for



people to be taught. These characteristics of Jesus say that the need to teach others is to build up their lives. Jesus has THE HEART to teach the people.

Often parents are asked what their children would be in future? Often students also are asked what they would want to be in future? The answers from parents as well as students are the same. guess, this is because of the good things that happen in my classroom.

A teacher wants to do more than iust inspire students to love academics. He also wants to make a real and lasting impact in their hearts and lives. He often takes extra care whether his communication has fallen flat or has not reached or connected to the entire class.

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He notices even one student among many who does not understand and makes an effort to communicate individually when necessary. Communication also involves explaining exactly what the assignments and expectations are. His communication skill makes students understand the content well.


In addition to being a good communicator, the teacher is also an excellent listener. Therefore, it is said that "If the speaking is silver then listening is gold"

Jesus is the role model for everyone to be a teacher. His character is to be followed to become a good teacher.






Introduction:

Greetings to all the readers in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ the greatest teacher!

The ministry of Jesus Christ can be bifurcated as the 'Ministry of Teaching' and 'Ministry of Preaching. The Teachers and the Preachers sail in the same Boat. The teachings of Jesus Christ were exemplary as he used various methodologies to drive home His point into the hearts of the multitudes. His Parables, Metaphors, Examples, Stories, Illustrations, Allegories drew crowds as His audience. He took the audience very seriously though they hail from Kuppams of Galilee, the rejects from Samaria, so called gentiles from Tyre and Sidon, literate Jews, and others. He taught them with authority asking them to consider the birds of the air. fish in the sea, pearls under the sea, the net, light, salt, leavened bread,



mustard seed, etc. He simplified a very confusing theme such as "Kingdom of God", "Faith", and "Deeds". The heart of a teacher must be like that of Jesus Christ respecting the audience and teaching with compassion and commitment.

Character the Kardia:

The word "Kardia" in Greek is Heart. The Heart is the central or innermost part of a human bodv. One's innermost Character, feelings or inclinations emerge from the Heart. A proverb says, 'Character is lost, everything is lost and hence the character of a teacher is the central point in his or her way of life. When Jesus saw the multitudes who came to listen to him, he saw them like sheep without a shepherd and 'His heart moved with compassion'. It is mandatory that a teacher in secular or sacred arena must inculcate the values of the Kingdom of God. At this pivotal point, usually a conflict emerges within a teacher between the Flesh and the Spirit. A teacher must imbibe the way of Christ and filled with the spirit of God. The Flesh will drag a teacher in the way of the world which would pressurize to reflect the values of the world which would be an 'Anti' to the values of the Spirit. All emerges from the heart. In Psalms 24 we read about a 'clean heart', which cannot be corrupted at any point of time.

When will this happen? Only if a teacher believes and affirms the following;

a) Being a teacher is not a Privilege but a Calling.

- b) Being a teacher is not to wear the crown but to carry the Cross.
- c) Being a teacher is not to be masters but to be servants.

If the above affirmations are strong in heart and mind, the Character automatically will be designed and shaped by God. The Call of God to carry out the Mission and Ministry of teaching in the World is a call for us to be facilitators. The character of a teacher is reflected in his or her holistic formation as a teacher. The character starting from the dress code, ethical behavior, morality, planned teaching, time management, focus on the subject, treating the audience unbiased, etc. everything comes in a nutshell as the 'Character of a Teacher'. If any one of these goes wrong, then a teacher will become a tool of mockery. The values that we read in the Beatitudes usually captioned as the sermon on the



mount emphatically Jesus teaches about being meek, thirst for righteousness, being merciful, pure in heart, being peacemakers, persecuted for righteousness, etc. In this greatest blessing tag attached in Mt 5:8 "Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God". The heart of the teacher must be pure because everything that is good and bad emerges from the heart. Thought become words, and words become actions.

As we read in Philippians 2:3ff, the Character of the teacher must express strongly the following:

- a) A teacher must count others more significant than oneself.
- b) Let a teacher look not only to his own interests but also to the interests of others.
- c) Let a teacher have the mind of Jesus Christ.

All the above verses conclude with a few statements, I would say as faith statements for a teacher are as follows:


- a) Self emptying (I am nothing)
- b) I am a servant,
- c) Reflect Humility,
- d) Be obedient to the point of death (Verses 5b-8).

These significant values in a teacher would definitely enable, equip, enrich and empower in all perspectives.

Conclusion:

The noblest vocation is being a teacher as one should remember always that the teachers are carrying the baton handed over to us by the great teacher, Jesus Christ. We have to be truthful to our calling as the teachers have no retirement. Till we die, we are called as teachers and after we die, we are remembered as teachers. The responsibility of creating a New Society is a difficult task for us, but despite all hurdles we have to run the race with Discipline and Character as Paul the Apostle says. May the Lord give all the Teachers strength and wisdom in all their endeavours and in all walks of life. Let us follow the footsteps of Jesus Christ and reflect, represent and resemble the great teacher in all our walk and talk. In our living situations, let our character in our ministry of teaching strongly express the values and virtues which Jesus had taught us. I am a survivor of a concentration camp. My eyes saw what no person should witness. Gas chambers built by learned engineers. Children poisoned by educated physicians. Infants killed by trained nurses. Women and babies shot and killed by high school and college graduates. My request is: help your students to be human. Your efforts should never produce learned monsters, skilled psycho paths, or educated maniacs. Reading and writing and spelling and history and arithmetic are only important if they serve to make our students more human.

- From a school principal who survived the Nazi Camp:

It has been a long time that an article from me has appeared in *Chalk & Chai* and so I find myself saying a few words about myself in this article [for which I trust I will be pardoned] which I am sure will be relevant to the subject as well. I had the privilege of being a first batch (1963-65) M. Tech. student from IIT, Madras. Our convocation speaker on July 1966 was Sir C V Raman. Here is an extract from his convocation speech: "Science has become the

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and of the

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hand maiden of the War Machine...... If you were in one of these countries [which manufactured destructive weapons of war], you would have to use its [knowledge of science] for unworthy ends, or you would lose your job. There are sensitive consciences in those countries, which revolt from this sort of misuse of science. Yet, the prostitution of science goes on."

I had been President of Madras EU when I was in IIT, but this statement of C V Raman went above my head. Although the statement impressed me at the time, I could not fathom its theological insights then. I was also the first Professional Associates Coordinator of the UESI and so was part of the team in the early 70's which wrote the constitutions of the Evangelical Medical Fellowship of India (EMFI) and the Evangelical Teachers' Fellowship of India (now ETF). Putting two and two together many years later, I arrived at certain conclusions as to how the tree of the knowledge of good and evil (Gen.2:9,17) could be understood, particularly in the context of the Christian Teachers' community and the two quotations above.

I want to make three main points in this article and I trust that they will help you in your professional teachers.

Firstly, God's prohibition to eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil (Gen.2:17) should not be taken to mean that God is against knowledge in itself. Over the centuries, some Christians have held this view, but they have never been the majority. The two facts - God made us in His creative image (Gen.1:26), and that He wanted us to be stewards of His creation on His behalf (Gen.1:26.28) - should make clear to us that knowledge in itself is necessary and good and cannot be evil. We needed knowledge in order to carry out this creation commandment - please note that this is the first command-

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ment in Scripture - from God. A section of Scripture that I have often shared with Christian teachers is Prov.8:22-31. Jewish scholars have held the view that this section of Scripture is Messianic where He is personified as Wisdom. Christians can see in these verses a reflection of what we read in the New Testament in John1:1-3, Col.1:15-17 and Heb.1:3. Wisdom is the master-craftsman in the hands of God and delights in human kind because we will be given the responsibility of caring for creation.

We Christians tend to have a strong theology of redemption but rather a weak theology of creation limited to fighting the errors of evolutionism. But our entire academic pursuit, knowingly or unknowingly, is a response to the creation mandate of God in Gen.1:28. For the Christian student, it must result in considering her/his studies as part of God's calling; no Christian student should say about her/his subject, "This subject is boring, because the subject of study is God's creation; the teacher may be boring but that is a different problem!" Similarly, teachers should teach their subjects with such passion that their students will remember those subjects till the end of their lives. It goes without saying that such a commitment to teaching will provide ample opportunities for Christian teachers to share Christ casually and naturally in the staff rooms with their colleagues.

Teachers have to be learners as well. Both the Hebrew and Greek languages bear this out. The Hebrew words for teaching and learn have the same root consonants L M D used in two different verb forms of the language. (Both these forms occur in Deut.4:10). The Greek word for disciple –mathetes – comes from the root verb manthano which means 'to learn'; a disciple is one who attaches oneself to a teacher in order to be a continuous learner. If you stop learning, you start fossilizing and students do not want to listen to fossils!

Secondly, Genesis 3 introduces the tragedy that we call The Fall. We tend to think of the fall only in terms of original sin resulting from our personal acts of disobedience. While this is true in terms of our personal repentance and salvation, the tragedy that our first parents let loose is much larger than that. The sin of Adam and Eve was not one of simple disobedience; they did not apparently realize that their status in the garden of Eden was that of vice-regents representing God in His creation, not very different from that of the Viceroy in New Delhi before 15th August 1947, who represented the King /Queen who ruled from London. By listening to the serpent's suggestion in Genesis 3:5, they arrogate to themselves the autonomy to set standards of good and evil of their own independent of God; in other words, their disobedience sets them off as rebels from God at the head of a cosmic rebellion. In so doing, they drag the whole of creation down with them. This bigger picture is what Paul paints in Romans 8:19-22, where creation is groaning as in the pains of childbirth, the scene borrowed from what God tells the woman in Genesis 3:16a. What God tells the man in

Genesis 3:17-19 is equally important: he will put in 100 units of work, but he will reap only 50 units of fruit and the rest is wasted energy in toil and sweat, thorns and thistles, [Please remember that work is part of the pre-Fall commandment of God in Genesis 2:15; this is important because some Christians find their work so exhausting that they draw the conclusion that it is part of the curse of God!] This wastage of energy is what we call in physics and engineering as entropy, resulting from the second law of thermodynamics that our disobedience sets off.

Now. I can make the connection with the quotation from the concentration camp survivor at the beginning of the article. Knowledge is functionally good and morally neutral, but in the hands of fallen humans, it can be deadly. Every forward step in knowledge offers a moral choice to us as to whether we will use it for good or for ill. Nuclear energy can be used for nuclear medicine or nuclear weapons. Whether we will always use the knowledge for good apart from the help of Almighty God is the big guestion that most of our human race does not even think about. What Sir C V Raman told us at our convocation was also part of the same issue; he diagnosed the problem correctly but did not provide the answer!

What can Christian teachers do? I have always wanted to be a teacher, but never managed to be one! My professors at IIT, wanted me to complete my PhD and join the staff, but God had different ideas for my life. My suggestion in this section will

therefore have to be only theoretical: I will be grateful for practical inputs. One of the lessons I have learned after many years in Apologetics is NOT to rush ahead with the answer [in Christ] till the question is fully appreciated. We can probably give examples how gadgets like smart phones can be very useful, but prove a great danger as people get enslaved to them. Every subject under the sun that God created has these upsides and down sides because of human rebellion and it will be a great idea to let students come up with their own diagnoses and treatments.


Thirdly, we shall look at the motivation for us to pursue this approach. While our friends from other faiths would generally agree with our findings so far, they may not agree with the cause that the Bible identifies as the root of the problem. God also provides the only sure motivation why we need to persist with these struggles, so exhausting they are at times. We normally look at precious promises that God gives to us from His Word. But what I have seen rarely is the promise that is held out to us in the last two chapters of the Bible. I have wondered why so much of our theology begins only with the Fall (Genesis 3) and ends prematurely, with the final judgment in the lake of fire(Revelation 20). Without the first two and last two chapters of the Bible, what we have to offer is unconnected with the reality that we deal with and the subjects that we teach. Why does the Bible end with the new heavens and the new earth (Rev.21:1)? God is making all things new (Rev.21:5).

In the new creation, we shall continue the reign (Rev.22:5) that we began in Genesis 1:26,28. This obviously means that we shall continue to study in the new creation which will obviously have a new technology (Rev.21:16-21), a new meteorology (Rev.21:23), a new botany (Rev.22:2) and a new zoology (Is.11:6-9;65:17,25)!

The physicality of the new creation is completely lost on most of us only because we have not seriously studied the physical resurrection of Jesus. We will readily agree that Jesus, after His resurrection, was not a ghost. But what was the physical reality to which His resurrected body belonged to which our bodies will be raised as well at His coming again (Phil.3:20, 21)? If we are good detectives examining and comparing the resurrections of Lazarus and of the Lord Jesus, we will come to some striking physical conclusions. Before Lazarus is called out, Jesus has to have the stone at the mouth of the grave rolled away (John 11:39); after Lazarus comes out, Jesus asks the people to remove the grave clothes so that he could move about (John 11:44). On the other hand, the stone at the mouth of the grave of Jesus is rolled away not to let Him out because the angel tells the women that He has already risen (Matt.28:2-5)! Peter and John, who go to the tomb of Jesus, find the grave-clothes lying undisturbed keimai in Greek - in the same position as the body, but the body seems to have evaporated without disturbing the clothes; the cloth around His head that was placed on a stone is seen rolled up - entulisso in Greek -, still

retaining the shape of the head so that John believes (John 20:5-8)! Theoretical physics can easily demonstrate that bodies of higher physical dimensions than our own 3 dimensions will not be obstructed by bodies of lower dimensions. All miracles in the Bible are reversible miracles and are subject to the second law of thermodynamics; the resurrection of Jesus is the only irreversible miracle that violates this law inside of the present universe! Lazarus comes back to this life and would have died again; Jesus, by His resurrection, inaugurates the new creation where there will be no more death. The resurrected physical body of Jesus as well as the new heavens and the new earth will belong to those dimensions where all the realities that I have mentioned in the previous paragraph will exist and which we will have the privilege of working on and studying about! Is this not enough of a motivation to struggle through our present life of teaching, invigilating and marking papers?

May the Lord give us grace to persevere in this life so that in the new creation, we will be only taking part of the tree of life whose leaves are for the healing of the nations (Rev.22:2)!



Zooming into GEN Z



Game Plan for Gen Y Teachers

It was a super sunny summer morning. Like most days, Steffi had to scurry through her morning chores at home – cooking, cleaning, getting the kids ready for school and then dash to work. Only when she felt dizzy while kick-starting her bike, did she realize she had forgotten to have her breakfast. But she couldn't go back, as she had to be in her class within the next 20 minutes. She had to make sure her worksheets are ready to be handed over to the students before class.

As always, Steffi was in class to welcome her students with a smile and a warm greeting. A few of them were cheerful, but many looked worried or disturbed. Once her students settled down, Steffi gathered all her might and started her lesson, a notoriously difficult one. In a couple of minutes, she heard the girl in the last

bench sobbing uncontrollably. Steffi had no option but to step aside from the class before things go out of hand, and ask her what happened. The girl told her about how she was going through severe emotional harassment and cyber bullying. Only two days ago, Steffi had counselled a boy who was down with anxiety, depression and eating disorders caused by excessive online interactions with "friends". As she was contemplating over these issues that were plaguing her students, she was jolted by another teacher who said some of her students had been caught shooting a video on school campus. When encountered, they revealed that they wanted to post it online on a video platform in a bid to become "popular".

Just like Steffi, scores of teachers today are battling with these kind of

21st century challenges that are impacting their students. Apart from the ill effects of technology addiction, widespread sexual harassment, economic instability, drug abuse, violence, bullying, drug abuse and global warming are other burning issues faced by this generation of students known as Gen Z or iGen. Due to these new found difficulties, as teachers, we find ourselves disturbed, disheartened or burnt out quite often.

This article is intended to explore a few crucial questions and seek answers based on the enlightening Word of God.

- What makes Gen Z so different from the previous generations?
- How can Gen Y teachers use their potential to shape the lives of Gen 7 students?
- As teachers who are followers of Christ, how can we rise above the present day challenges? And how can we help students to love and fear God, and depart from evil?

Decoding Gen Z

The rise of Gen Z (born between the mid-1990s and the mid-2000s) has created massive ripples that the world is still grappling with. It has impacted every field in the world, including education. It would be helpful to explore the key characteristics of Gen Zand what makes them different from the previous generations.

 The Gen Z cohort is highly tech savvy and cannot imagine the world without mobile devices,

- internet or social media. These "digital natives" have grown up with the knowledge that they can connect with anyone around the world at a moment's notice, and through assorted social media networks. For them, electronics, a luxury of their parents, has always been a necessity for living in the modern world.
- They seek validation and acceptance through social media and many of their important conversations in life take place there. Over use of the internet, access to inappropriate information and connections with strangers are some of the critical areas of concern for parents and teachers.
- They are witnessing drastic changes in family structures.
 "Untraditional" or diverse family structures and gender fluidity are becoming the norm of the day.
- They never feel safe in the world they were born into. The horror of 9/11 and the frequent events of terrorism and violence, including incidents of shooting in schools, has created a deep seated fear and trauma in the young minds.
- They are said to be the loneliest generation so far, in spite of the countless ways of "connecting" with people.
- They absorb tons of new information every day and spend several hours a day on social media or searching the internet for information. According to recent statistics, 44% of teenagers use computers to do their homework. Furthermore, 48% of them watch how-to videos that relate to schooling.
- They have a short attention span

- of 8-seconds and tend to multitask most of the time.
- They do not revere or submit to authority, with respect to superiority in age or position. They seek to have their own space and freedom to make their own decisions.
- They are independent, innovative, collaborative and globally aware.

Dealing with Gen Z – Game Planer Strategies for Gen Y Teachers

An inevitable generational shift is seen in the schools of today, across the globe. As most of the Baby Boom teachers (between 55 to 76 years of age) are retired, the teaching community of today comprises those who are Gen X (between 40 to 55 years) or Gen Y also known as Millennials (26 to 40 years). We know that each generation has their own DNA that is shaped by the beliefs, values and circumstances of their time. In this section, I would like to discuss some strategies for Gen Y teachers in dealing with Gen Z students!

Recent studies reveal that Gen Y teachers are creative, tech savvy and are keen to make a difference in the lives of their students and society. Like Baby Boomers and Gen X, Gen Y teachers also give importance to moral values and are closely connected to family and the community. They possess capabilities to equip students with the 21st century skills that are needed to excel in the global marketplace and foster peace and harmony in today's chaotic world.

On the other hand, we also see that Gen Y teachers are not immune to workplace issues. Anger, frustration and worry become constant companions when students disregard the teacher and go in the wrong direction. When this happens, the teacher also has to bear the brunt of academic non-performance along with emotional, behavioural and mental health problems.

The following are some of the strategies that will help us in finding fulfilment at work while dealing with Gen 7.

#1 Be Assured of our Calling to Teach

As Millennials, we are known to be more career oriented than our preceding generations. Most of the time, the work we do, overshadows our whole identity. We crave to find happiness and fulfilment in our work place, and seek recognition from superiors and peers for our personal gratification. Unfortunately, young professionals today are highly vulnerable to get swayed by selfworth, rewards and accomplishments.

It is only when we have the conviction that we have been "called" to teach, and when we place God at the centre of our lives, teaching becomes much more than a profession or much more than a job. Teaching as a calling transcends these immediate objectives; it is based on the assurance that God has commissioned us to fulfil His purpose of serving young people and minister-

ing to them, through teaching. It makes us aware that children are made in the image of God and that He cares for every tiny detail of every child.

1 Thessalonians 2:4 says, "Do you work heartily as for the Lord rather than for men?". When we engrain this deep in our hearts, we begin to love unconditionally, serve joyfully, overcome others' short comings with patience, and reflect the attributes of Christ in our thoughts, deeds and words. This is crucial for us, as we face innumerable situations which tempt us to yell at students or make rash decisions when we find our patience being tested every passing minute! It is amazing that we can call upon God whenever we face trouble and that the One who called us is faithful to help us!

Action Points

- Remind ourselves every day of God's calling to shape the lives of young people.
- Avoid getting burnt out by nourishing our physical, mental, emotional and spiritual selves.

#2 Be an Imitable Role Model

The world around us is brimming with temptations and addictions that enslave people. Walking in the ways of the world is seen as prudent, while leading a godly life is often ridiculed. However, we as teachers, need to always remember that our lives are on display before highly impressionable and susceptible young people.

We may be able to dash out eloquent lectures or provide solid advice, but if we don't practise what we profess, we are doomed! In other words, we need to walk the talk, not just talk the talk! Apostle Paul in his letter to the Corinthians, beautifully puts it, "Follow my example, as I follow the example of Christ" (1 Corinthians 11:1).

As those who have been called according to God's plan, we have the responsibility to set the best example of godly living, we possibly can. This does not mean we are responsible for the behaviour of others; but, if we do not serve as the role model we should, we will be held accountable to God for our failure to be a good example.

Action Points

- Spend time every day in selfexamining our thoughts, words and actions and their impact on our students and others.
- Seek genuine feedback about the characteristics we reflect and use it to work towards self-improvement, with God's help.

#3 Be Reliant on Jesus, the Master Teacher

Millennials have the reputation of being a "self-reliant generation" with an inherent desire for freedom and liberalization. Very often, we are tempted to trust our own skills and abilities in order to attain success. However, as those who serve God, we need to transition from being selfreliant to God-reliant.

When God calls us to fulfil His purpose through our work. He gives us the grace and strength to excel in it. What we need to do is to completely and constantly rely on Jesus, who is our Master Teacher. our ultimate provider. As the religious leader Thomas S. Monson explicates, "In the home, the school, or the house of God, there is one teacher whose life overshadows all others. He taught of life and death, of duty and destiny. He lived not to be served, but to serve; not to receive, but to give; not to save his life, but to sacrifice it for others...I speak of the Master Teacher, Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the Saviour and Redeemer of all mankind."

Action Points

 Ensure a close relationship with God, through prayer and reading

- of God's Word.
- Learn to be led by the Spirit of God in all situations, and allow Him to rule over our lives by denying ourselves.

When we make it our utmost priority to honour God through our work, He uses us to transform the lives of not only our students, but also the people around us far more than we can ever imagine!







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
