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"THE BECOMING OF A TEACHER"

In the early eighties, two events shaped my mind and my educational pursuit towards teaching as my profession. It was during my college days at Loyola, Chennai, "Graduate seminar" was a mandatory exercise, a vital assessment parameter in our curriculum. We had to prepare well in advance to present a technical seminar in front of a packed audience. To my great surprise, my presentation was adjudged as the

best seminar. I didn't ignore that experience as a common occurrence. I sensed the teaching talent in me. I was asked to handle a series of Bible study talks consecutively in a leadership training conference held at Chennai by EU way back in 1982 which gave an assuring conviction that I should groom myself as a teacher. Needless to say, I saw such fervour to teach, in my mother, who was a known as a strict science

teacher who spent a lot of her time in preparing visual aids and charts to teach the students in 70's. As I complete nearly 30 years of teaching in higher educational institutes, I can say that teaching is more than a profession, it's a "calling". If we sense teaching as a calling, the recipes are different to be a successful teacher. However, if it is construed as a profession, the role can be different.

Teacher quality is an important measure in determining the role of the teacher and gains in student achievement. Maximizing the quantity of instructional time, handling classroom events, teaching at a steady pace, maintaining clear direction in lessons; having a command of various teaching methods, knowing when and how to apply each method; knowledge of different forms and purposes of formative and summative assessments, structuring of learning objectives and the lesson process, lesson planning and evaluation, dealing with heterogeneous learning groups in the classroom, having knowledge of the sources of student cognitive, motivational, and emotional heterogeneity and supporting and fostering individual learning progress by having knowledge of various cognitive and motivational learning processes are key to the role and success of teachers.

The present challenge to any teacher in a higher education institution is to deal with the **DISTRACTED MIND SET** of the Students. Typically, college students unlock their phones 50 times a day using them for close to $4\frac{1}{2}$ hours out

of every 24-hour cycle. Put another way, they check their phones every 15 minutes — all day long (and sometimes all night) — and they look at them for about five minutes each time. Teenagers are almost always attempting to multitask, even when they know fully well that they cannot do so effectively. When teenagers have their phones taken away, they become highly anxious (and visibly agitated within just a few minutes). Waves of technology keep crashing upon us and it has become a paramount task to hold the attention span of the students. The only way to hold them captive is to maximize our teaching abilities and to guide the students through experiential learn-

The other challenge that teachers in the higher education institutes face is the **DEMANDING INSTITUT-IONAL DEADLINES** set by the Government sector. The higher education sector is always fueled by ever growing demand for capabilities





and competencies and has to respond in novel ways to meet this demand. Higher education, research and development, innovation plays a vital role in supporting social interconnection and interrelation, economic development and global competitiveness. Hence the very task of setting up of accreditation systems and bodies at national and international level to rank and recognize Universities and Institutions for

meeting the minimum acceptable standards through inspection and assessment has taken top priority amongst the national policy makers as Education takes a centre stage in today's world. An accreditation puts to the test the relationship of an institution and its academic body. On one hand, it looks to improve the curriculum of its faculty; on the other hand, it demands higher accountability from them. This requires a higher commitment from professionals who work both as faculty and provide services to the private or public sector. At the same time, as long as institutions look for synergies. a larger amount of teaching faculty is encouraged to increase their level of research, and a larger amount of research faculty is encouraged to go into the classroom. This involves an important investment in internal qualification programs for teachers and researchers. Some teachers may find that this improvement process threatens their teaching style and freedom to innovate. The concern arises due to increased

standardization and homogeneity of classes as part of the accreditation of classroom learning indicators. It is common for teachers to include new learning while preparing for their classes and to seek to add value to their disciplines. Their apprehension, therefore, is that the accreditation process will limit this ability to innovate. Faced with these challenges, it is essential for institutions to intelligently disseminate and raise awareness among teachers on the reasons for accreditation, as well as the internal improvements it will involve both inside and outside the classroom.

Being a teacher, even if you cannot have influence in deciding the curriculum, the way you choose to deliver the course can make all the difference. Also, pursuing research and publishing papers greatly influence your career trajectory over time. Academic merit metrics are being changed by the day and for a successful transition from being an associate to a senior position would mean you need PhDs and doctoral dissertations to show. The current system we follow sure lacks the edge when it comes to prepare the student for a life after college. Many industry experts are accusing our educational

system to be substandard when it comes to preparing students for a job. Corporate leaders are holding back and being picky on placements. Besides, students are greatly misinformed about why they are entering higher education in the first place. The most common and obvious objective is to get a job. But though employment capabilities are 'a' goal, it's definitely not the 'only' one- research, entrepreneurship, or even for the sake to learn and innovate. So ultimately, it falls in the hands of a teacher to better prepare their students for employment or further research.

Being a teacher is one the most revered job on earth. But it can be equally demanding. Though there are expectations that we should deliver and some stereotypes that we are bound to face with every now and then, the role of teacher is crucial and has several dimensions across the field of education.

What the teacher is, is more important than what he teaches.

Accordingly, our magazine 'chalk and chai' is published with articles touching the following areas in the life of a Christian Teacher. The Knowledge (Head), The Character (heart), The skills (Hand) and the Reward (Heaven). So, in this short article, let us consider some vital truths about the development of knowledge (Head).

Different Professions are called with different titles. The cinema is called the 'entertainment industry' and hotel management as 'Hospitality Industry'. In this way, the Teaching Profession can be called 'Knowledge Industry'. For those who are involved in this 'Industry', it is essential to develop their own knowledge, as they are in a position

to impart knowledge to the younger ones. That is why the saying goes 'once a Teacher, ever a learner'.

I) Why should a Teacher develop his / her knowledge?

Let us consider a few important reasons for a Teacher to develop his / her knowledge.

a) Because he / she is the disciple of the great master Teacher Jesus

Every Christian Teacher is a true disciple of the great master Teacher-the greatest 'Guru' that the humanity has ever seen. The followers of Jesus Christ are all called as His 'disciples'. Ponder the words of our Lord Jesus, 'Come and learn from me' (Matthew 11:29). The great Jewish Teacher Nicodemus called Jesus 'a Teacher from God' and Jesus rightly taught him heavenly

things in the night when he met Him secretly (John 3:2). And Jesus called Nicodemus also a 'Teacher' (John 3:10).

b) Because of the rapid growth of knowledge

Today we all know that the human knowledge is increasing at an unimaginable speed. Even the Bible prophesied about it long ago (Daniel 12:5). At this point of human history, if those who are called to be in the 'Knowledge industry' i.e. Teaching Profession, fail to ever update their knowledge in different areas through different means, they would certainly lag behind or become a laughing stock before their students.

c) Because learning makes the Teacher grow

When a Teacher keeps developing his / her knowledge always, along with his / her knowledge, he / she also grows. Someone asked a Teacher with 20 years of experience in the profession, "Do you an experience of 20 fresh growing years or 20 xerox copies of the first year of your profession?" It is a pathetic scene to see many teachers rattling the same stories and illustrations they used in their beginning years of teaching even after 10 or 15 years without realizing the growth of knowledge and information of their students and the outside world. Some school teachers, they say, simply take the Xerox copies of their first year 'notes of lesson' and submit them every year to their authorities. What a shame! The great Tamil Sage Thiruvalluvar mentioned in his immortal work 'Thirukkural' that every time you know

something new, you discover how ignorant you were so far.

d) Because learning makes the teacher confident before his / her students

When you are updated in your knowledge as a Teacher, you can boldly face your class and respond to your wards confidently. There is another term used for 'Teacher' these days, which is 'co-learner'. You can join your students in their learning process and that would make you one with your students, which would ultimately make the teaching learning process a lively, pleasant experience for both parties.

e) Because it sets the Teacher as a role model and motivator to the students

When the teacher proves himself/herself as a person who ever develops his / her knowledge, he / she becomes a role model to the students motivating them to follow his / her example. Then, the Teacher need not advise / exhort his / her wards to learn as they will be automatically be encouraged to follow his / her footsteps.

II. How to develop knowledge?

In this modern era of multiple growth of knowledge and advanced technologies, it's needless to say, in what ways a teacher can develop his / her knowledge today. Apart from reading valuable / relevant books, they can always avail other sources of information such as internet. We should also not forget that we gain a lot of knowledge by interacting with the right people.

III. Books - a special word of advice

As we have mentioned that 'Books' (in whatever form they may be, printed or on-line) are primary sources of our knowledge, Teachers can take the following advice as a guidance to their learning of books. Teachers can classify their reading under these 3 categories.

1) Spiritual books:

Spend quality time reading the Scripture and other Spiritual books, which would make you a 'Godly Teacher' with high spiritual values.

3) General knowledge books:

It is not enough for a teacher, especially in this modern era, to confine his / her knowledge to his / her own field. A Teacher should always know what is happening around the world which he /she can gain by regularly reading newspapers and other general knowledge materials.

Prof. Dr. Manasseh Pasupuleti

Prof. Dr. Manasseh Pasupuleti, was born on 16/09/1949 in Secunderabad to P.N. Joseph & Krupavaram Joseph. He completed his schooling from SPG Boys' High School, Graduation & PG from OU evening College. He was awarded Ph.D. in English from Kakatiya University, Ph.D. in Church History from SHIATS University, Allahabad. He was awarded Doctor of Letters (D.Litt.) in Religions by Transworld Ministries, Kuwait. He was formerly Editor of TheMessage of Life (which had circulation in 62 countries) from 1974 to 1977. He was Chairman, Department of English in Loyola Academy from 1977 to 1980. He was *Principal* of JJ Degree College of Arts and Science from 1994 to 1998. From 2009 to 2012 he was the **Principal** of St. Paul's Study and Research Centre (a Degree and Post-graduate College under SHIATS University, Allahabad, established under Sec. 3 of UGC Act 1956). He was the Principal and General Director of Immanuel Business School (MBA College) under JNTU, Hyderabad and Immanuel Biblical Seminary under ATA (Asian Theological Association, Bangalore) from 2012 to 2018.

Dr. P. Manasseh **established** Gamaliel Printing and Publishing House in 1984. He was a **Resource Person** for two Universities and a few Autonomous Colleges and was an **Examiner** for some Academic bodies. He presented several **Research Papers** in National and International Seminars and regularly contributed articles to reputed magazines. He was on the **Boards of** Scientific Research, Academic,

- 7) Culturally Relevant Ministry.


After his By-Pass surgery, he recommitted his time and talent to write commentaries in Telugu.

Mr. Eappen John

I had a professor during my undergraduate studies who was awarded a gold medal in Physics. He was brilliant indeed with a unique capacity to solve any question coming from students. But he would come to the class, take attendance and without wasting anytime turn towards the black board to write a question and solve it, talking to himself about the theory and application, scribbling all over the board for about 15 to 20 minutes. Only when there was no place left on the board would he turn around towards the class in search of a duster and quite often found hardly anybody in the class! Students would use the back door exit unable to bear the boredom. This professor was certainly a highly knowledgeable person with poor skills of teaching. He was certainly a self-disciplined teacher with integrity of character and

good content at disposal and yet with poor competencies on teaching methodology essentially required to communicate appropriately. The situation sometimes became an irony to the prestigious medal he received. This example is quite conclusive that a teacher with only head knowledge and no teaching skills could be lifeless and wearisome and likewise teachers with only teaching skills and no knowledge of the subject could be like bathing without water. Content is as essential as the process of learning to be effective. One without the other is like computer hardware without software.

There are three domains of learning and an excellent teacher will use all three domains of learning adequately and effectively. The three domains of learning are cognitive, affective and psychomotor. Cognitive

domain deals with thinking and the intellectual side of learning; affective domain deals with emotion, feelings and therefore includes objectives relating to attitude, motivation, and values; whereas the psychomotor domain deals with physical or kinesthetic and focuses on actions and motor skills that require physical coordination. Learning takes place in all three domains but excellent teachers would plan their lessons by combining all three domains to make learning multidimensional and also to provide well-rounded learning experiences. The diversity of domains helps the teacher to make the class interesting, purposeful and cater to the diverse learning needs of the students.

Traditionally, cognitive domain is the most commonly used (dominated by lecture method) and it's true that content delivery of the subject is necessary for teachers as teaching and learning activity cannot evolve in a vacuum. Appropriate dissemination of the knowledge of a teacher or content of the subject is very important in education for that is what helps teachers develop a perspective of the world around their students and enables them in making decisions. And yet the space for the process of learning is non-negotiable. The need for adequate balance is what I am trying to explicate. Passing of excess content in the class may not be profitable as the student will not get a chance to process and assimilate the content. For example, when too much current passes through an electric wire, beyond its holding capacity, we call it overloading and the wires get heated leading to

delivery of content or head knowledge without an opportunity to reflect, process, understand, assimilate and apply could be distressful and may lead to learning fatigue. Teachers need to go to the class with sufficient content or knowledge and yet they need not dump it all on the students. They need to use the content appropriately as and when necessary; or rather I would prefer to call it as the use of minimum content or obligatory content in the class. Having adequate knowledge of the subject is definitely a necessary condition for teachers to possess in their teaching profession but not a sufficient condition to become an excellent teacher. The equitable use of multiple components of all three domains appropriately creates a sufficient condition. providing potential for a teacher to be excellent in his/her profession. For example, if I want to travel from Hyderabad to Chennai by train to attend an ETF conference, having a ticket is a necessary condition but if I have a ticket only up to Vijayawada, then, that is an insufficient condition to reach Chennai by train. So a teacher needs to deliver more than just content, they certainly need various competencies to teach or the methodology that can engage the students appropriately.


Keeping this dimension in mind, I asked the following question during a teacher's workshop: What knowledge do teachers have? Very quickly most of them invariably answered, "the subject knowledge", while few said teaching methodology knowledge, student management knowledge

and so on. Incidentally, the subject knowledge frequently appears as the most favourite of all. But it is a proven fact that teachers need more than the subject knowledge alone while dealing with human beings. If we look carefully at how Jesus taught, He was well beyond the cognitive sphere of learning domain. We find Him as a great teacher who taught His disciples not overloading them with just head knowledge but with practical learning experiences (Luke 9:2) and by using demonstrations (John 9:1-7). He taught them by giving examples (Lk 11:1-2) and by using contemporary events (Lk 13:1-3). He encouraged asking questions and He answered the questions they asked (Mt 13:10-11) although they were simple. He taught by correcting mistakes and misunderstandings (Luke 9:52-56) and by explaining in greater detail (Matthew 13:18). The context of His teaching was people's homes, in fields, on the boat, in the temple, by the well, on mountain tops, in valleys and everywhere He went. There is motivation, relationship building, physical activity and dissemination of hard truths, all seen simultaneously in the cross-section of His teaching endeavour.

Creating this kind of a balanced teaching environment needs to be the aim of a teacher. Many students would testify that they have experienced an overwhelming cont-ent in the classroom so much so that it is like one way traffic overloading information onto the learners. There is no argument over the matter that content is needed in the teaching-learning scenario but the concern is about excess content delivery where

obligatory content is about emphasizing the process of learning over excessive content delivery. It is about letting interaction take place over a task by listening to diverse voices. Obligatory content is about knowing or planning what and how to facilitate learning beforehand. It is about having adequate understanding about the subject and also about additional material on the subject. Apart from the content, wholistic teaching process looks into who the students are and finds their learning needs. So, getting to know the students in the class and their learning backgrounds, their hopes, expectations and interests and their cultural heritage is desirable. Obligatory content is not limited to the knowledge of subject matter but includes experiences and pedago gical/andragogical practices used appropriately to make the knowledge received applicable in the world around.

In conclusion, the call for teachers is to build in and assimilate teachinglearning competencies and other capabilities as the situation demands during this New Year. The creative tension between content and process are all important prerequisites for effective teaching. Only when the teachers are effective holistic educators can we expect the students and emerging leaders entrusted to them care to become effective holistic citizens. So, the need to orient the faculty to focus on learning new competencies not just primarily on teaching is imperative. They need to recognize that more reflective and interactive approaches such as small group discussions,



interviews, forums, case studies, role plays, field trips, visuals, debates and so on have been consistently found to result in a far greater level of learning. The need to encourage the faculty to seek a holistic multi-dimensional approach to learning alone can lead on the path to excellence in our schools and colleges. So, may you experience God's presence and encouragement during this New Year in reflecting and identifying your teaching professional needs and find avenues to build the required competencies.


