In one of the memorial services, one of God's servants lamented, "If we have more Bibles in the school, there would be less guns in the hands of deranged youth."

A dichotomy between

academics and values

Nowadays, there is a dichotomy forced upon young minds. Academics is separate and moral values are separate. In an academic setting, the teachings about moral values and purpose of life have taken a backseat due the advancement of science and technology. Due to the vested interest of a few intellectuals, the schools have become

like ships without their moorings. They are adrift in an ocean perturbed by storms which rage for a lifetime.

In a tough new climate, a question arises to the intriguing mind. Is it possible to teach moral values inside schools anymore? Can we possibly inculcate the values espoused by the Kingdom of Heaven; the values given by our blessed Lord Jesus Christ inside a school along with its rigid curriculum?

Newton's Laws of Motion and Kingdom Principles

I am teaching physics for first year undergraduate engineering students. I deal with the basics of physics that are applicable to various engineering disciplines. In this adventure, by the enablement of God and His grace, I try to introduce the Kingdom of Heaven

principles in a novel way. Let me give you few examples.

Isaac Newton is known as the Father of Modern Physics. His book entitled "Philosophiæ Naturalis Principia Mathematica (Latin for Mathematical Principles of Natural Philosophy), was published in the year 1687. It contains Newton's three laws of motion. There is an excellent correlation between his fundamental laws and our personal life, I would say to my students.

Newton's First Law

It is known as the Law of Inertia. It states that if a body is at rest or at motion with uniform speed in a straight line, it will continue to do so unless until an external force acts upon it. Inertia is defined as the inability of a body to change its state of rest or of uniform motion. The more massive a body is, the more inertia it has.

In life, a person in sin continues to be in sin unless and until he is stopped by an external force, a metaphysical force since sin is also a metaphysical entity. This force is what I call as God, I would

gently point out. I would further say, "When a person is unable to do good, when a person continues to commit error after error, he needs a helping hand to stop his activities and change his course. He needs a bigger help to change his direction and take an about turn. God is a universal metaphysics force who can be felt and can be experienced in times of trouble. Mankind is in serious trouble, the trouble of inability to do good and inability to stop committing sins. He needs a Saviour. He needs a force to change his inertia of sinfulness." This was precisely understood by Oscar Wilde who lived a life of debauchery. He realized his sinful condition on his death bed and exclaimed to his friend, "Call for a pastor. Only Christ is big enough to save me!!".

Newton's Second Law

It is one the most important laws in all of physics", according to Encyclopedia Britannica. It states that the time rate of change of the momentum of a body is equal to the force applied on it. The momentum is equal in both magnitude and direction to the force. It is equal to the product of its mass and its velocity.



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Consider two bodies with mass m_1 (lighter body) and m_2 (heavier body). Let the same quantity of force be applied on them. Which body will have more acceleration? Yes, you guessed it correct. The body with lighter mass will have more momentum for the same amount of force than the heavier body.

I would say "In life, God gives all of us equal opportunities and an equal amount of force. He is an impartial and a just God. I would point out that if a person has no additional packages on his pack, he will have more acceleration for the same amount of force. Be light footed in your walk with God; Don't carry additional burdens." Nate Saint, the missionary pilot to Aucas, said, "When life's flight is over, and we unload our cargo at the other end, the fellow who got rid of unnecessary weight will have the most valuable cargo to present the Lord."

One of the implications of Second Law of Motion is this: If a body is not accelerated, there is no net force acting on it. Applying this important conclusion to our spiritual life, I would say, "If you feel no improvement in your spiritual life, you are not allowing God's force to act upon you." Extending further, I would say, "The more time you spend at the feet of the Lord Jesus Christ, the more force you would feel. The more force you feel, the more you would carry out for His glory."

Newton's Third Law violated!!

We will now move on to **Newton's Third Law**. For every action, there is an equal and opposite reaction (equal in magnitude and opposite in direction). This fundamental law in physics has been proved to be right in all places so many times and in so many circum stances. But there is a notable exception for this law. Only once in the history of the universe, this law has been violated completely and it has a profound effect on the history of human race.

Yes, on the Cross of Calvary, this Law broke down. The entire evil of the world was thrown on Jesus Christ and it did not bounce back. Instead, the love of God was flowing freely from the place of extreme suffering. What was the action? The transgressions and iniquities of the world was placed on the Lamb of God. What was the reaction? The blameless Son of God accepted calmly all the evils and paid the price with His pure blood and His life on our behalf.

Can the laws of physics be violated? Yes, they can be, and one solid proof is the Cross of Calvary. Newton's Third Law absolutely fails before the eternal Love of God which was exhibited and explicitly explained by JESUS CHRIST.

The laws of physics can be subtly given as a support for Kingdom princi ples in contemporary issues also. The story of magnetism is the story of ancient civilizations. The effects of magnetism have been observed for centuries. One of the fundamental laws in magnetism is:- Like poles repel each other and unlike poles attract each other. Whenever I handle the magical subject of magnetism inside class, I would always say, "In today's world, this law is violated. Like poles are attracting like poles and the governments and the courts of the world are subscribing to this fancy notion of human beings. More interestingly, some north poles are attracting both north and south poles. Some poles are attracting multiple opposite poles. Another fascinating observation in this world of fantasy is

this: Some poles willfully change their polarity. I hope that you understand what I am trying to say."


"Yes, I am talking about the issue of LGBT", I would say. In a way, like poles attracting like poles can be equated with lesbians and gays. A pole attracting both kinds of pole can be equated with bisexuals and pole changing nature of human beings can be equated with few human beings wantonly changing their gender and becoming transgenders. I would then gently say, "God loves sinners. He hates sin." I have taken this line from an unlikely source, 'The Calvin and Hobbes' cartoon. I would further add, "Can you imagine materials chang ing their nature? What would happen if conductors suddenly became insul ators? We would then be forced to change our power transmission lines. As we are changing our power transmission lines, we are again noticing a change in the behaviour of materials. Will it not cause chaos?"

"God created Adam and Eve and constituted the first family. If He had meant otherwise, He would have creat ed Adam and Adam or Eve and another Eve. God wants order and disci pline in His universe", I would sum up.

God gives the wisdom

When we want to address contem porary issues, we can ask for heavenly wisdom that comes from above which is pure and above all understanding. God will show us a way to move forward and gently bring up Kingdom principles inside the classroom even though the entire world may be up and against moral principles. Let us ask for our good Lord Jesus Christ's wisdom and may He guide us with His Holy Spirit. Let the name of our Lord alone be glorified. Amen!





into the School System

The essence of Kingdom values and morals is Christlike servanthood and Godly Love; looking out for occasions to serve Him using our God given skillsets and talents for the extension of His Kingdom. As teachers, we are presented with the humble opportunity to educate the children in our country. But sometimes, we have to venture into unknown territories where facilities are not up to par or sometimes there are absolutely no facilities available to even seat the children, let alone educate them. But taking after the example of servanthood that the Lord Jesus Christ set before us, we can forge ahead knowing that the Lord is with us as we take that step forward. He is Jehovah Jireh whose thoughts and ways are way beyond our scale of thinking and doing.

Here is the genesis of the Good Samaritan Schools and how the Hand of the Lord was upon us as we struggled, persevered and pushed through and witnessed the extension of our territory establishing Christian schools that today help educate the underprivileged children, especially amongst the tribals.

How I was presented with the opportunity to educate:

I was a professor in Tamil Nadu and taught at St. Mary's College, Tuticorin handling classes right up to post graduate level. When my husband, N. Emil Jebasingh took charge of Trans World Radio, our family moved to Delhi. Initially it was a big cultural and climatic shock. When our son turned one, I joined Jawaharlal Nehru University and completed my M.Phil. degree in English and Linguistics. One day, Bishop Nirmal Minz of North East Gossener Evangelical Lutheran Church came to see my husband regarding Trans World Radio

Gospel broadcasts in his Kurux language. My husband talked to him about the importance of giving follow-up literature to them. The Bishop sadly said that they did not have a writing system to write their language. My husband called me and asked me if I could develop a writing system for the Kurux anguage. I told him that it would not be possible for me to do that. But then the Lord kept speaking to me, and I enrolled my self for Ph.D. to develop a writing system for the Kurux language spoken by the Oraon tribal people group in the erstwhile state of Bihar. It took me 8 years to complete my M.Phil. and Ph.D. The Lord helped me in developing the script, as I fasted and prayed month after month. The script is based on our natural sound system which also comes through in the Indian writing systems.

Children come to our home:

When I was waiting for Viva Voce, a little child knocked at my door begging. I had compassion for him and regularly fed him. One day he came with more than 20 children which put me off. I asked them, "Why did you come?" A little girl holding a child on her side said, "Bhook lag rahihai!" which meant "we are hungry". But I got angry. I said Idid not come to Delhi to feeda whole lot of begging children and shut the door and walked in. As I took each step towards my room, the Lord was speaking to me in the voice of the little girl. "We are hungry, we are hungry, we are hungry." It banged in my head like lightening, criscrossing my brain. By the time I reached my bedroom I was crying profusely. I threw up my hands and fell on my knees asking Him, "Lord, what do you want me to do?" He simply said, "Feed them. They are hungry." He showed me the hunger of the world for the living bread and I saw the Lord hanging on the cross saying I am thirsty.

I waited for the children to come back. The little boy came again after some days fearful of the angry face he had seen. I called him in and told him in the meagre Hindi that I knew, that he should not be begging. If only he could learn, he would earn his own living. He agreed. I came to an understanding with Mohammad Dilshad. "You learn for half an hour with me, and then I will give you hot breakfast."Every morning he came and I started teaching him the alphabets in my own garage in the apartment. Then I gave him a hot breakfast. More slum parents brought their children and pleaded with me to enrol their children too in the "School". I was wary and told them there is no school here, that this was just my garage and I wanted to teach only Dilshad. They were in tears and told me that no other school would take them and I gave in. I put them in the garage and when my husband left for work and children for school, I taught them. I went with my son to the market to get a synthetic rolled sheet for a black board. Once one child was absent for two days. His sister revealed that his father tied his legs together with a rope and hung him upside down in the hut for a whole day. My heart ached. I walked with the group of children into the slum. Their huts were made of tin sheets with polythene sheet for roofs. Some sick children were covered with flies, their parents had gone early for work in other houses. I allowed the children to come into my garage and the veranda was soon filled with slum children and a few voluntary teachers. One day when there was an accident, my husband advised me to close it down. He gave me 3 days and went on a journey. All 3 days I

neither took water nor any food. I was calling upon the Lord in tears. I told the Lord, "You only asked me to do this work. Now my husband is asking me to close it down. He is a man of God. How can Your will and his will be contradictory? What should I do now?" He gave me the verse, Ephesians 5:22. "Wives, Obey your husbands as you obey the Lord." It puzzled me. That night the flight did not come on time. I was on my knees. I was exhausted and could not pray. I asked the Lord, "Please you Holy Spirit pray. I will be kneeling down." I received a phone call at 3 in the morning. The flight was caught in a storm and had belly landing in another airport. When he came back, he told me to continue the work. Praise the Lord.

New Beginnings: School Set-up begins in a slum Toilet Complex

We went as a team to the slum commissioner and requested him to give us a space in the slum where we could put a tent and help these needy children to learn. He agreed to give the room in the Toilet Complex built for the people. I was devastated; how can decent women go to a toilet facility to work? As I was looking at the commissioner, that scene vanished and I saw the manger scene. The Lord was again speaking. "If I, the God of the universe can come down into a manger to save you, will you refuse to go into a toilet facility to help me save the children?" I shook my head and agreed. The day we opened the room, the smell hit us hard and we stepped back. We erected a few tents in the campus conducted school for 600 children in morning and noon shifts. We did not mind the filth and dirt, but worked in the sweet fragrance of Jesus. Once a Senator from the USvisited us. He went back and told the 3rd graders of a

Christian Academy school to pray for children having their school in a toilet facility and that they would have a proper school. They started praying faithfully. In another instance, a team from International Cooperating Ministries visited Delhi. They asked my husband to help see my work as one of the team was the father of a third grader. They asked me what I wanted. One among them said, "A School, what else." We worked in the Toilet facility for 13 years and had 600 children every day in morning and noon shifts. They demolished the slum and the Toilet Complex.

We went to Madanpur Khader where they were relocated and started school in their half-built rooms and on the streets and half-built rooms for 2 years.

Rising up to the next level: Establishing Schools under the Department of Education

I applied to the Department of Education and since there was no reply from their end. I went with a few Board Members. The head clerk had our file right in front of him. He said that he would not process the file as we would never be able to pay the standard salaries. We did not move. He looked up. Asked if we are Christians. Asked us to wait till 5 pm. He came to us and said that he too was a Christian and started helping us, preparing all the necessary files. The files started moving. When it came to Delhi Development Authority, the Lord gave grace us in the eyes of people and I was taken to the highest officials by IAS officers. The officer had commented asking what this puny woman would do. I responded saying that, "this puny woman will do nothing. It is the God who stands in front of her

who will accomplish everything." After much effort, Good Samaritan School, aSenior Secondary School, was established in Jasola, New Delhi in 2005 to admit the children for higher classes. By then, they had already completed the 6th class syllabus on the streets in the relocation colony. The children just came in and occupied the classrooms. We could educate hundreds and hundreds of slum children who are now in very good positions. Some of them have opted to work with The Good Samaritansand are a great support. In course of time, centres to educate underprivileged children were established in Madanpur Khader, Dakshinpuri and Issapur. WE were walking on miracles.

Establishing Schools in Bastar:

In 2006.I visited one of our staff in Delhi who had moved to be with her parents in Bastar. Chhattisgarh.I requested to be taken to the tribal areas. We were there for 4 days. On the first day, we packed our food and other things and went in a jeep. First, we met the Block Development Officer in Darbha. He welcomed us and challenged us to work in a difficult village. KudumGothra is a village where outside people cannot go and even electricity lines would be torn down by them. After much hesitation, we started. When we reached, we saw two heads on the hills. When we waved, they disappeared. We climbed the hill. No one could be seen. All huts were dark and empty. Then asking the men to stay back. I walked up alone. Again, I saw two girls, but they ran like gazelles and vanished. We decided to go back. The Secretary of the block came and took us in. The women and children came from a hut and were taking something from a leaf cup. We

started singing a Hindi song clapping our hands thinking they would understand. Suddenly, we were surrounded by men with bows and arrows, all pointing at us. We froze. Then slowly, I raised up my hand and motioned for them to come in. They jumped the fence and came very close still pointing the arrows at us. With signs we asked them to sit, and again, using signs told them we would teach them to read and write. The second day, we went to see another village head man. He was going to a wedding and asked us to come with him. On the way, we saw many groups of people walking in that direction. When we reached the venue, we were stunned to be inside thousands of Bison Horn Madia people dancing. The center ring had headmen wearing a head gear of Bison Horns and beads. The second round was of drummers. Then others joined as they came. They were dancing fast and a woman pulled me in. We saw the bride and the groom separately wrapped up in thick sheets as they should not see each other before the wedding. Soon we took leave and came to the village. When we took a photo, the headman insisted that his cow should be in. They used the cows only to plough and not to milk. Milk was for the calf only. On the third day, we had to cross a steep ravine. On the other side was a hut. Going through 3 doors, we came to a clean room with a cross on a table. In awe, we fell on our knees. On the fourth day I was talking to the team, as to who were willing to go to teach these people. The couple who escorted us offered to go.

We brought some of the uneducated people from Madia tribe, for no one had gone beyond Class 5. We prepared Primers in their own mother tongue.

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
Under the trees or in huts, we introduced Mother Tongue Based Multi Lingual Education (MTB-MLE) for the tribal children, initially teaching in their own mother tongue as they did not understand Hindi. Good Samaritan Schools were established in the tribal villages of Bhejripadar, BhelwaBhata and Chhindawada. The first batch of 10th pass children came out in the year 2018. They all have come up in flying colours thro ugh English medium schools.

The latest addition is Good Samari tan School in Badi Munda, Kandhamal, Odisha with just 28 tribal children. The schools are in different stages of development.

It is a big challenge to establish sch ools for underprivileged children. But God had been our help and sustained us throughout these years, gave us good people to work with and gave us people to help out. So, I cast this challenge net to all my fellow teachers. Let us fish out opportunities to venture into new and unknown territories using the channel of education to infuse into the children of our nation, not just academics but also, the love of Christ for them and the hope and peace they will find even in the lowest of moments they are confronted with.

When Jesus took off His outer clothing and wrapped a towel around His waist to wash the feet of His disciple, it was such a radical act of service. As it says in John 13:4,5, Jesus set the example, let us follow in His footsteps.

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DAR-UL-FAZL CHILDREN'S HOME – RAINBOW SCHOOL



Those who trust in the Lord are like Mount Zion, which cannot be shaken but endures forever. As the mountains surround Jerusalem so the Lord surrounds His people both now and forevermore. Psalm 125:1-2

The Rainbow School is located in Manali, Village Shuru, Himachal Pradesh, surrounded by the snowcapped mighty Himalayan mountains. With the help and grace of God, the School has completed 30 years. It was initially started for Schooling the Children of the "Dar-UI-Fazl Children's Home".

Dar-UI-Fazl means 'House of Grace'. It is an Urdu-Arabic word. The Home was started on the 20thof October 1982 in Srinagar, Kashmir. It was founded by four missionaries of the Zoram Evangelical Fellowship (ZEF), Aizawl, Mizoram. These were Ms. Rev. J. Romawii, Mr. Chawnglianthuama, his wife, Mrs. Lalringliani and Ms. H. Lalngurliani. This Children's Home was birthed due to the vision these four friends to look after and provide for poor and needy children, and to instill the love and grace of our Lord Jesus in them.

The Home was shifted to Manali, Himachal Pradesh in 1990 due to all the political disturbances there which forced us all to adjust in a rented and congested building. We experienced a lot of highs and lows together. One of the biggest problems we faced was the education of our children, as it was not possible to send all them to other schools due to financial constraints, children never being to school before, being overaged to start school and unacceptable to other schools etc. So, the Home's own School "Rainbow School" was started. been to impart the love of Jesus Christ, to prepare Children to be honest and responsible citizens and to enable them to face the world and to make a difference in the society. It has been our desire that the School isa source of education and integrity for the wider community. Apart from the Children in the Home, we have children coming as day-scholars from the neighboring villages since education is a channel to reach out to these Children and the community.

The vision and aim of the School has

The School had a very humble beginning. There was a time when we didn't have a School building. Classes were taken wherever possible like in verandahs, corridors of our Home, and under tree shades etc. We even had to share blackboards between classes; textbooks were available only for teachers; one teacher had to take more than one class at a time!!! Later the School was made out of rejected wood from sawmill, tarpaulin and used tin sheets. All through these times, God has been good and faithful to us and taught us to trust and rely on Him. Today, Dar-UI-Fazl Children's Home and the Rainbow School have all the basic facilities. We have beautiful buildings with a playground and this is our permanent place. Looking back, I remember that, despite the lack of facilities and all our struggles, the teachers and students were happy, excited and in high spirits. I have many wonderful countless memories of God's amazing blessings and His miracles of those days. The students of those times have become successful adults spirit ually and physically, and are settled in various strata of different Societies.

Rainbow School is a small school with a maximum strength of 200 students, with classes from LKG to Std VIII. Our priority is to impart education to the poor, the needy and the underprivileged Children.

It is our joy to help these Children from all backgrounds and to give them an opportunity, love and care, with the hope for the best, imparting ideal moral values and most importantly the saving grace of our Lord Jesus Christ in them.

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I am from Mizoram and grew up in a Christian family and community. But I truly received Jesus as my Lord and personal Saviour in 1990 and I joined as one of the staff in this ministry in April 1991.

I was part of this Home even before joining as a staff, as one of the founders is my aunt, and I was with them since September 1989. Shifa: Healing for the Community

The school is situated in Chunnabhata, lime kilns in the city of Dehradun in Northern India. The school works with street children who are mostly involved in rag-picking.

Shifa began as a small Kingdom-seed among marginalized communities in the year 2008. As Jesus showed us, the Kingdom of God does not come with great pomp and show but begins with a seed which slowly transforms the world. It starts with insignificant individuals and spreads to include the whole commun ity. We try to reflect and demonstrate Kingdom values through God's love in Shifa School. Our teachers are not afraid to hold a broom as well as a Chalk. We endeavor to serve the community in every possible way. Every day our teachers visit the community and build relations with them, pray for the family members, share the gospel, exercise their faith by praying for the sick and the demon possessed.

What began as a children's club with 10 to 15 children, today has over 115 children and 8 teachers. There were many times we thought we could not continue but every time the Lord provided for all our needs supernatur ally.

Below are two testimonies of the transformative power of God's Kingdom:

Priyanka: She is one of the very first students at Shifa from the year 2008-2009. We still have vivid memories of her on the streets of Dehradun as a rag-



picker. She was brought to Shifa by her older brother along with two of her younger siblings- Ganesh and Rajesh. From the start, it was clear that she was a bright person and would have done well.She had been in a different situation. Shifa provided her that safe and empowering environment to grow and flourish.

After she finished class VII with us, we helped her to continue her education through the Government approved Distance Learning programme initially and later, in a full time school. On 31st July,2020, she warmed our hearts when she showed her Class 12th results. She had secured first division. She made us proud.



Kiran: She is also among the first students at Shifa. She is now married and has a 1 year old daughter. She has been attending our Women Empowerment



Project for almost a year. During the first two months of Lockdown everything was closed, but recently these ladies have been making cotton washable face mask for free distribution. (Pic: At a Christmas programme and now receiving certificate of completion at the WEP).



During this Lockdown, I along with my team of teachers decided to enter the slum community where the school is located, taking as much precaution as was possible, while following all the rules of social distancing and saniti zation. The teachers and I were commit ted to provide education and nurture the slum children. It was not possible to do it online as none of the children had access to smart phones or a computer, and most parents of our children are illiterate and hence, this was a very arduous task. Being physically present was the only option. The children were called in small groups. They were handed over

Textbooks and notes books and were guided and tutored.

Thy Kingdom Come:

It must be said that the teacher have done a commendable job in surmount ing the present unprecedented situat ion, not excluding their willingness to enter a slum every day. The Kingdom value of selflessness is tangibly displayed.

We hope and expect to normalize the school as much as possible in the coming year. Most of our children come from dysfunctional and abusive environments and for us to provide a safe haven in the community is vital.

Genesis 25:21 says "And Isaac prayed to the LORD for his wife, because she was barren. And the LORD granted his prayer, and Rebekah, his wife conceived." Here we see how powerful and effective each of our prayers can be, especially when they are in alignment with God's plan and purposes for His Kingdom on earth.

In the brokenness and direness of this world, our prayers and ministries are ushering in a Kingdom of joy peace and righteousness. Shifa has endeavoured to do that. We thank the Lord that He is using us amongst these slum community children to release God's Kingdom hope and power to restore broken lives.

Just like our Saviour, Jesus Christ, was born in a stable in a manger, St Stephen's English Medium School was born in a Cowshed one evening at 5 pm on 25th July 1998 with 5 students from the Selamba village and 3 teachers including me. The school was started with a vision to uplift the local Vasava Tribal Comm unity in and around the Sagbara Taluk of the Narmada District in Gujarat state of India by the sincere support and vision of the Navjeevan Seva Mandal (A Voluntary Social Service Organisation) Manage ment. The local people also felt the need and played a supportive role. God granted us favour in the eyes of a few Government Officers but it cannot be denied that there were many others who reviled this initiative considering the locality. And ours was the only English Medium School in a radius of about 100 km. Ever since, it has been a humble walk of faith.

During the day, the hostel hall was partitioned with plywood and used as classrooms. During the night, the hall was used as the Shanti Sadan Hostel. The students staying in the hostel are children of believers who hail from underprivileged communities situated in the remote villages in and around the Satpuda Hills in Gujarat. In spite of the extreme weather conditions, the classes went on, sometimes even under the natural roof, the Sky and shade of the

Today, after 21 years of God's faithfulness, there are 662 students from Lower Kindergarten to Standard XII of which, 200 students stay on-campus and 400 + students come from the nearby villages. There are 26 teaching staff, 5 non-teaching staff, 14 classrooms, 5 lab rooms and 1 staff room. With the motto "Learn to Serve", we have over 350



Alumni, who are serving the society and are a blessing to their family and community. The locals are so happy that their children can converse well in the English language. Although most of our students are not from Christian back grounds, they are eager to learn about the love of Christ apart from academics. We train and encourage our students to excel in Co-curricular and Extra-curri cular activities like Sports, Art, Innovat ion, Reading, Music, etc. Our students have competed at State Level Sports, Science Exhibitions and Speech Comp etitions too.

As we are situated in a rural locality and most of our students are from underprivileged background, we face financial crisis. But our Almighty Jehovah Jireh has always provided and helped us to meet our needs even when we recently faced the problem of paying salary to our teachers.




