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FROM THE **GENERAL SECRETARY'S** DESK

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#### Dear readers of Chalk and Chai,

I praise God for His grace that was sufficient for all of us amidst the pandemic situation due to Covid19 during the year 2020 and wish you all God's blessings grace and protection to abide with you in this New Year. The book of Esther is one of my favourites for two reasons: our country India is mentioned and my maiden name is Esther as well. The historical novel begins with the king Xerxes who ruled over 127 provinces stretching from India to Cush with his roval throne in the citadel of Susa. It is written that in the third year of his reign he gave a banquet for all his nobles and officials and the military leaders of Persia and Media, the princes, and the nobles of the provinces were present. For a full 180 days he displayed the vast wealth of his kingdom and the splendour and glory of his majesty.

In a general context and in the Old Testament, 'Kingdom' is a word that mostly refers to a piece of land or territories that is ruled by a king or a queen, but also brings to mind the power, wealth and vastness of the one who reigns. In the New Testament, the phrase Kingdom of God or Kingdom of Heaven occurs frequently and used by Jesus Christ in the first three Gospels. Jesus made it clear that things in the kingdom were quite different than things in the world. Jesus had come to earth to bring the kingdom of God to men. For Christian believers, in the light of the word of God, the word Kingdom implies the spiritual realm over which God reigns as king, or the fulfilment of God's will on earth.

The situation around the globe continues to remind us that the end times are near, as we await the second coming of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. In this scenario, let us remember that as Christian educators and teachers, we are called to serve as Kingdom people on this earth and the four issues of Chalk and Chai this year are focussed on kingdom values. I would like to share four attributes of Kingdom people.

#### The Kingdom of God is a Personal Experience

The knowledge of this kingdom is not programmed within us .*The kingdom of* 

God is a present reality that requires one's response. When we believe that Jesus' first coming was to preach "the gospel of the kingdom of God" (Mark 1:14-15) and pay the penalty for mankind's sins and His second coming for the establishment of the Kingdom of God here on earth (Heb. 9:28), the Kingdom of God sprouts from within our hearts. We experience God the Father has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love (Col.1:13) and we start committing our lives to God and begin living as a different community to follow His instruction. Unlike the physical kingdoms which have outward expressions like land or armies or money or earthly power, the Kingdom of God comes from inside out. "..... the kingdom of God is within you" (Luke 17:20-21). For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit (Romans 14:17). In spite of our human weaknesses, the Holy Spirit "of power and of love and of a sound mind" (2 Tim.1:7)

When prayer becomes the engine of the Kingdom of God, it will be spread out powerfully as a chain reaction in a nuclear fission. gives us the ability to live by God's laws and desire to seek His Kingdom first. "But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you" (Mathew 6:33).

### The kingdom of God comes through prayer.

The Lord's Prayer was taught by Jesus Himself to His disciples. Down the history, it has been recited or sung in churches, institutions, families and every child in a Christian home is guite familiar with it. Many times for many years we could have been mechanically reciting that but when we observe this prayer closely, we find it's not a self oriented or selfish prayer but it has a wider perspective. It is a prayer from God's perspective altogether and focussed on God's desire when we pray. Addressing the eternal God as our Father, we are taught to Ask first for God's concerns: "Hallowed be Your name; Your Kingdom Come: Your will be done on earth as it is in Heaven" and then followed with our concerns and others' concerns ending with Adoration. God is able to bring in His kingdom without me, and He can. But He desires that we pray for the kingdom to come to show that His rule and reign in our lives and in our world is dependent upon our prayers. This is revolutionary in its self, but true. When we pray, "Your kingdom come," we are inviting the King, Jesus Christ, to move into our lives and the lives of others and breathe His Holy Spirit into us and them and we are praying for new life and eternal life. When we believe that the Kingdom of God is a reign of God over heaven and earth, we are praying for God's reign to come - a reign that isn't from this world and implies God's reign is above heaven and earth. As believers. we are called to pray with faith for the unconquered territories, citadels of resistance that must give way to the loving rule of Jesus Christ. Though we have learned what the Bible says about the kingdom of God, when we pray "Your kingdom come," with our very soul, it is the power of God which is literally changing the world. For a fruitful life and for Jesus to be made known across the earth, as a Christian, praying for God's Kingdom should be our focus. The kingdom will come through prayer itself.

#### The Kingdom of God

#### involves Proclamation

The Kingdom of God is powerful but it is opposed as there are two kingdoms at work in the world. I am reminded about Newton's third law of motion, "For every action (force) in nature there is an equal and opposite reaction. Let us recall what Paul says in Ephesians 6:12. "For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places." The kingdom of God comes to destroy the kingdom of Satan.

Jesus set an example for us by preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God and the establishment of the Kingdom of God. He showed goodness and grace and demonstrated the events that point to the Kingdom of God's power. He healed the sick and cast out demons. He fed the hungry and even raised the dead. Jesus defeats death on the cross through the power of His resurrection to prove God reigns over all things. As Kingdom people, we are called to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ and His teachings with all boldness and without hindrance (Mat.24:14) and manifest His power through our lives.

#### The Kingdom of God is Progressive and powerful

"Progression" is a beautiful word which implies the act of forward or onward movement by passing successfully from one member of a series to the next in succession or sequence. At Pentecost, the people of God were supernaturally empowered by Jesus to move across the earth and pour out the gospel of Jesus Christ. We could witness, how men and women, young and old, meek and the bold, rich and poor all over the world by some means become kingdom people and the progression continues. A progressive wave is a wave which travels forward continuously in a medium in the same direction without the change in its amplitude.

It all begins with the kingdom of God within an individual and like a progressive wave move forward without losing its significance and flavour . When prayer becomes the engine of the Kingdom of God, it will be spread out powerfully as a chain reaction in a nuclear fission.

The four themes of the chalk and Chai for this year: Kingdom and Home,

New Year greetings and blessings to you in Jesus' Name, our King and Lord. Thank you for staying faithful as kingdom children and growing in the Lord during this difficult season. It has been an amazing adventurous experience for all of us since the pandemic (corona virus) started. We as kingdom ambassadors of Christ know that God is sovereign and accomplishes his eternal purposes through every calamity. We lost many lives. Our world has changed in many ways, and we learned new ways to adjust our lives, including conducting churches, marriages, funerals, businesses, and education on all levels.

Kingdom of God is a fascinating subject for me. My latest book is about *Kingdom Leadership*. I was so excited when asked to write about Kingdom Education (KE) and the Home. For healthier family, church, school and community, we must learn and disseminate kingdom principles to all people, especially to our children and youth by being faithful and responsible kingdom teachers. I am confident that this year's Kingdom theme will be a transforming experience for you as you meditate and apply the messages in your area of influence. Let us examine the definition of KE, Biblical premises and why it is so needed.

#### Definition

Before we delve into KE, let us see what "Kingdom of God" is. The Kingdom of God or Kingdom of heaven is the rule or reign of God in all aspects of our life. In other words, Jesus reigns as king and thus we joyfully and fearfully submit every facet of our life to his lordship, in turn, all are drawn to him and advance his kingdom.

Kingdom education is the process of receiving or giving the edicts (instruction /decrees) of King Jesus and his kingdom values. KE produces matured disciples so that they will live intentionally and effectively for kingdom agenda in their individual fields of influence for God's glory.

This definition has many elements. A. It is a process of learning, a commitment to learn is essential. B. Learning the instructions given by God in the Bible. We must believe the Word of God is infallible and powerful. C. We must respectfully understand and obey the commands. D. The purpose of kingdom education is life transformation (growth /maturity). E. Our audience is the saints of God (our children/believers). F. Intentional living in order to influence others to Christ. G. Doing God's agenda-God's priorities must be our priority in all we do. H. The Glory of God- is the main goal of kingdom education.

Kingdom education begins at home. Parents must faithfully instruct their children. "Train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old, he will not depart from it" (Prov.22:6). They must also model kingdom values, creating a conducive environment for learning. Then, their spiritual maturity, love for Christ and passion for his missions will impact our churches, schools, and workplaces. It is paramount to have kingdom minded teachers, and pastors supplementing the kingdom education, along with parents as the primary teachers.

#### **Kingdom Education Examples**

My friend, who is a godly and brilliant leader in the marketplace here in Chicago, shared his experience about how his parents instructed him, and his brother, in kingdom values. Their parents, who worked in the Gulf as an engineer and teacher, modeled kingdom values at home through prayer, Bible study, participating in church activities, giving generously to the Lord's work, and entertaining God's people, especially pastors, evangelists and missionaries. This made a huge impact in their lives. Both sons finished engineering. Wherever they went, they made an impact through godly living and engaging in the community with Christ's love. My friend graduated from Moody, worked for Inter-varsity Press, and is now a senior leader with a US company. He and his wife are passing the kingdom values to their child at home as well actively involved in local church activities and mission work through Reaching Indians Ministries International (RIMI).

His brother and wife are influential in Chicago through their evangelistic efforts, serving in the local church, and supporting missionary efforts. Did this happen without paying a price? Not at all. Their parents believed in kingdom education and they intentionally passed it on to their progeny.

From our own testimony we can share that teaching Kingdom values began at our home too with our daughter Maryann an only child. By the grace of God, very early on in her life, we were able to give good biblical education, and allowed her to travel with us for mission work. When she was 10, we sent her alone to Nagpur, India, to serve at the orphanage and travel to the villages and cities.

She is an elementary school teacher and specialized in STEM-Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. She is so passionate in her profession and made such an impact on her students. This experience in her life, developed a passion for kids, and thus enrolled at Trinity International University for educational training. She is now living in the inner city of Chicago, by faith and vision, to serve the marginalized with love and compassion. She is also writing her own book, and is involved with Urban Reformers, an advocacy agency for injustice and equality. These illustrations presented above reflect six essential biblical premises for us to have a deeper commitment and an example to follow for KE.

#### **Biblical Premises for Kingdom Education**

#### 1. The infallibility of the Word of God

Kingdom education without the Bible is useless. Parents and teachers must believe the Bible as the inerrant Word of God, and it does not make false or misleading statements on any topic whatsoever. It is life-transforming and powerful (Psalm 12:6; Matthew 5:18; John 17:17; 2 Tim.2:16-17; Hebrews 4:12-13; 2 Peter 1:21)

#### 2. Kingdom education must begin at home

It is the primary responsibility of parents to instructing our children and youth in biblical values. Children are God's homework assignment to parents (Deut. 6:4-9, 22:18-21; Ps. 78:1-7, 127:3; Prov. 22.6; Mal.2:13-16; Matt.28:18-20; Eph.6:4). Unfortunately, today, parents neglect this prime responsibility and expect the church or Christian school to assume this duty for them. It is a wrong notion.

#### 3. The purpose of kingdom education is growth and maturity

The Bible tells us that God has appointed apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers to *equip* (*prepare/develop*) the saints for the work of ministry/service. Moral and spiritual development with a right biblical world view are important for our children to be effective and godly leaders. Thus, we must intentionally equip the saints (children, youth) to love God with their whole hearts, minds, and souls, and love their neighbors so that they will be a vibrant witness for Christ everywhere (Eph.4:11-16; Matt. 12:30-31; Col.1:9-10; 2 Peter 1:5-8; Heb.5:12-14; 1 Peter 2:1-25; 1 Cor. 11:1).

#### 4. The goal of Kingdom education is the glory of God

The goal of KE is to exalt the name of God and spread his great name. We involve in KE is not for our benefit or recognition or reward. (2 Cor. 10:31; Eph.3:20-21; 2 Peter 3:18; 2 Peter 1:3).

5. Teachers must seriously assume their responsibility to equip the next generation Parents trust on the teachers for excellent education and that they, in cooperation with parents, will teach children to be able to discern right and wrong. Teachers must consider this is an awesome mission from God and thus effectively equip them to be influential leaders all spheres of life (Ex. 18:21; 1 Sam. 1:27-28, 3:1-10; Matt.18:6, 19:13-14; Mark 10:13-16; Luke 18:15-17).

#### 6. A modeled life is imperative for effective kingdom education

Our children and youth watch our lives as parents and teachers. Learning is not always content learning but observation of real-life practice also. Today, hypocrisy is on the rise in every field. So, we must walk the talk before our children and students for the KE to be receptive and effective (1 Thess. 1:6; Titus 2:7; 1 Cor. 8:9; Heb. 13;7; 1 Cor. 4:16; 1 Cor. 11:1; 1 Peter 2:21).

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#### Why KE is so needed?

Today we live in a very sophisticated world. People's priorities are more on money, fame, and other things, than on spiritual or eternal things. In homes, both parents are working and thus are unable to find time for Biblical education. So, they are confronted with many pressures, both internally and externally. Because of social media and other entertainment demands, families have difficulty finding time for KE. Many homes today have no disciplined prayer or bible study. Children are always busy for school projects, tuition, and sports.

We have a new generation unable to discern right and wrong. They are unafraid to do any heinous act. As I write this article, a *Hathras* gang rape case is being discussed everywhere. My heart is truly broken, sad and ashamed by the murder of an innocent young Dalit girl. Her family was locked up and the police burned her body.

Too many people, including spiritual gurus and leaders, are holy outside and ugly and unholy inside. People are successful in the market place in their trade, but unable to conquer themselves. They can manage multi-million companies, but cannot run their own families.

Many churches have lost vision for intentional KE. Pastors have no clear vision or long-term plan. New Testament scholar and educator John Gresham Machen rightly stated, "The most important Christian Education institution is not the pulpit or the school, important as they are; but it is the Christian family. And that institution has to a very large extent ceased to do its work." We do not have true disciples in our churches and communities. Churches are supposed to be salt and light in our society. Unfortunately, our neighbors are not seeing the effectiveness of Christianity. Did not Gandhi say, "I love your Christ, I do not like your Christians. Your Christians are unlike your Christ." All of us who are followers of Christ need an introspection and recommitment.

KE is so vital and urgent today. Our next generation is bombarded with false teaching and secular indoctrination. So much hatred towards Christ and the kingdom principles. Kingdom principles are ridiculed and rejected by the liberal media, and thus often our young people yield to compromise the edicts of the King by peer pressure and influence of the fleeting world promises.

#### Conclusion

Today, my seven siblings and I are in the kingdom work because of the influence of my parents, especially my praying mother who passed away a few years ago. My father did not get a good biblical upbringing and thus he struggled with many issues including anger and stubbornness. However, my mother was a genuine praver warrior and loved God sincerely. She was generous to the daily workers, visiting pastors and missionaries. Often, she was persecuted because she took money from Dad's pocket without his permission to give to God's servants. Her money for medicines and oil was spent for poor people and visiting pastors. This modeled life, without any deeper theological instruction from her, impacted her children significantly. Her regular prayers with tears, reading of the Bible, teaching us from the Bible, attending church, and giving others have

impacted us to live the Kingdom life wherever God has placed us.

American Christian theologian, R.L. Dabney writes, "The education of the children for God is the most important business done on earth." Whatever curriculum you use, whether it is the Bible or any Sunday school materials, make sure students will understand their identity in Christ, and grow in the mind of Christ. As they grow in the intimacy of the king, they will understand the mystery and the mission of Christ. Then, they will be able to engage in the kingdom agenda.

Therefore, it is my prayer that all of us will do a soul searching-first as to how are we as teachers are being transformed daily by the kingdom principles; how do we teach the KE content and model our life before our own children and family, church members, and school or college students.

May the Lord continue to grant you wisdom, understanding, courage, faith, passion, creativity, and deeper commitment as you seek to glorify God by KE in your home, church, and school as an effective kingdom teacher and be a blessing to many in this New Year.



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I was abused very badly for over 14 years. I lost my mother when I was 15 months old and as I roamed the streets of Chennai, digging into trash cans, trying to find a morsel or two to quieten my grumbling stomach, do you know what would go on in my mind? Why is my family like this? How are other families happy? I don't want to live in this house. It is hopeless.

Once, at age 14, after being beaten up by my father that evening, I sat holding the window grill of my house, I cried uncontrollably saying 'Jesus will I ever get out of this house? What is going to happen to my life? I don't understand! I don't understand! I longed for a family. I could not relate when pastors and Bible teachers said that we are all a part of God's family in His Kingdom. That thought did not connect with me. I could not understand the truth that God intends all of us to be planted in and to grow up in healthy families.

No, I did not have a proper father, nor did I grow up in a proper family. But what God has made me today, is a compassionate father. What God has blessed me with is an amazing family. Twelve years ago, we began an orphanage. Within the span of 3 years, we had rescued 9 children. After about 4 years, my wife, Manju and I realized that what the children needed was not an institution, but a family. Institutions will not bring that healing and restoration into damaged lives. It was one of the toughest decisions, but the Lord helped us to dismantle the orphanage set up and slowly start building that family.

Was it easy? Definitely not. The children did not accept us as a dad and a mum for 2 years. They did not trust us. It was like there was a brick wall between us. What was happening? My eldest son recently said that he always thought that we would get fed up and leave them and that we would bring in some other staff and re-start the orphanage.

It was a tough journey but a fulfilling one. Yes, our privacy was taken away. Our days were jam-packed from 5 in the morning to 11 at night. But His grace was sufficient. I always believed in this paradigm: 'Where the Lord leads, He will provide'. In our case, the Lord provided grace, wisdom and immense emotional strength. Is this not true that when the Lord adopted us into His family, into His kingdom, it was His grace and love that surrounded us? Slowly and steadily, we started to see immense breakthroughs. The children began to receive love, care. They began to excel in their education. Today, they have grown into strong teenagers who are looking to impact the world as individuals. And another dynamic that the Lord worked out, was that our biological son has accepted all of them with such love and open hands and we are very much at peace. God's plans and purposes are way beyond our own. Did we know how exactly things were going to pan out when we started the journey? No. But we saw the Lord work things out, hold our hand to lead us step by step.

One of the kingdom principles for the home front is to see trust built with love. This needs to be the core foundation for any healing relationship inside a family. A gentle reminder that this love that you and I show, or need to show has to come from the Lord Almighty. As we humble ourselves, acknowledge and accept Him as our Saviour. It is from our position of 'the redeemed' that the Lord Almighty can use us to redeem others.

I believe this is a time, when the orphaned, neglected and abused children in India are longing for real people to really love them. This generation needs a real touch. You and I are called to love. A calling to love those who are hurting, lost and in pain. A calling to stand alongside these children, to open up our homes for these precious ones. Our own families can become that healing space for these hurting children and teenagers. I believe that anyone and everyone can love a child or a teenager and adopt them into their families. There is no qualification needed. All we need to do is to seek His face. surrender to His voice and allow Him to walk alongside us as we walk alongside these precious lives.

I will glean 6 lessons from my adoptive family journey:

- For me to believe in and acknowledge God's purposes and plans in my life was very important. His plans are always higher and His purposes always bigger. I may not see or understand it now, but I need to believe and acknowledge that He is at work. No matter what the challenges and the filth in our families may be, God is able and more than able to use our family. Let us not limit the Almighty God.
- 2. Sometimes, I thought that because of my personality and personal struggles, things would not progress in my family. But today, I have learnt to follow His leading. It might be different from what I am thinking. It could be a very different path. I just need to be ready to follow Him whole heartedly. This journey has also become my healing journey.

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- 3. To unlearn was one of my key struggles. I started parenting the children the same way my dad parented me; with authority and abuse. I was short tempered and would speak to them very sharply. I did things in a certain way and I thought I was right about it. I had to begin to intentionally see and learn new ways and unlearn the old ones. When I started doing this, it began to have a huge impact on my marriage and my parenting. I'm still learning. I have not yet arrived, but I am glad I am on this journey and that I'm not where I once was.
- 4. Times of negativity and discouragement still bother and try to derail me. In times like these, I do two things. 1. I stop feeding those thoughts. 2. I start feeding myself the Word of God. This negativity, and discouragement is one of the primary weapons the devil uses and we need to be alert to deal with it. Especially during this pandemic, I have seen so many families falling victim to this. No. I cannot become a victim. I know that HE (my Jesus) KNOWS.
- 5. Intentionally form a Circle of relationships to lean on and be encouraged in is another lesson I learnt. I am usually more comfortable being alone. But I had to learn to take support and help. Parenting was a very different ball game. But I began to share and receive in wisdom from my mentors that God had brought into my life.
- 6. Last but not the least, I learnt to dig deeper into the Word of God and learn. The time spent in prayer, worship and delving into His Word is an important key; personally, and as a family. Five days a week, every evening we as a family, meet around the family altar. There is no compromise. It takes intentional surrender to allow the Lord to work in and through us.



The generation today is hurt in the context of relationships. But they can also be healed in the context of relationships. And that healing relationship needs to come from a family. Kingdom Home is a place for Healed Relationships.

### An Ordained TEACHER



The mission of a Christian teacher needs to go beyond academics and to know why God has called you in this profession and to this classroom. He looks forward to you changing lives regardless of where you teach. God has given me a dual role as a Biology Teacher as well as a Scout & Guide trainer. In this article I'm just going to share the various situations which I was exposed to and how I was able to bring the love of God to them, how I have introduced my Jesus to my students. Scouting and Guiding gives opportunity to move with guite a lot of Students in the Adolescent age group (a puzzle for many) in and around Southern Railway. They used to come close to me during Camps and Outdoor activities and I too used to be free with them and move close to them. This attitude of a teacher turns the teacher into a friend. So, they approach me with a lot of problems, many silly, but some are very serious. I too get a chance to learn them thoroughly and able to connect this to many of their behavioural problems.

In Scouting & Guiding, what we teach them first is the Guide Promise which says " Duty to God, My Country and to help Others". These three principles concentrate on character development and here starts the spirit of God helping me to introduce the love of Jesus to them.

Always I used to start this session on Promise and law with the Sunday School chorus "Rendu Siru Kangal Devane Parkum" and then proceed by explaining

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what is our Duty to God. I used to bring the creation of God and impress upon them to Praise Him for giving everything perfect in our body. Although they are outside their own home, I make it a point to feel the camping area as their own home. So as in their home here too we give first place to God by beginning the day with prayer and ending also with prayer. These small things kindle in them to know more about Jesus and used to approach me to learn new songs and thereby to listen to a lot of new stories about Jesus. Secondly, whenever we start a camp or a journey we first pray. Initially, I used to do it and but later I passed on this chance to the students. Initially, they used to do it with a little hesitation but later on many used to come forward when we announce prayer. Similarly, during flag hoisting, one guide is to say the thought for the day. They share some Quotes, Sayings of BP etc.... One day a girl asked the camp in charge" Is there anything wrong if I say a Bible verse?". She welcomed her to do it and even in very big rallies and gatherings our school guides don't hesitate to share the Bible Verse.

We practice prayer before food, before going to bed and before doing everything. Many a time, I have noticed the Patrol leader saying a prayer during their Competitions. I always try to teach the Christian Songs for devotional song competitions appreciating the beauty of nature.

This training makes them more matured in their behaviour. Parents were very happy to see their daughters' change in behaviour and willingly sent them for camps. This change is reflected when they get back to the classrooms. Characters like sharing, loving,

tolerance, obedience etc... Even other teachers used to notice and share with me. The Guides now know how important it is to see God first in their life before they go to their routine activity. In this way, I got a lot of opportunity to share the love of God with them.

As a Christian teacher, I have followed certain principles which were quite helpful to approach the children so that as a teacher I can be closer to them, which has helped me to harvest many souls for God, a way to build His Kingdom in heaven. I would like to share it with you all. Mathew 13:24 clearly says those who are like seeds sown on good soil will build the Kingdom of God.

#### 1. A Christian teacher should have a strong sense of mission:

The Teacher should be ready first to listen to the child, understand the problem of the child and we should be ready to go beyond their routine activities and should be ready to spend some time with their children so that we can understand them then we can focus our mind in solving their problem. Scouting and Guiding gives a lot of activities which can be turned into an opportunity by a Christian Teacher to understand the Girl.

#### 2. Strive for excellence

To have a greater impact we should know to respect our students. One way to do that is by pursuing excellence in all what we do even in a greater danger. We should know how to tackle the situation and to help the child to come out of that crisis. Teaching them the Scout Guide syllabus thoroughly gives a lot of importance to apply this in real life situations brilliantly. Learning First Aid, Directions, Use of Compass, Disaster

Management Etc.. makes them excel in the society.

#### 3. Love our students:

Love is the most powerful force on the earth and the one that can make the biggest difference in the minds of the students. The mere thought that they are loved by everyone is a boon to be smart. Even if any of the students feels they are alone and no one is there to love them, the teacher can fill the gap by showing how God loves her. This support will surely protect her from getting connected with the wrong people. The feeling that "I have a God who loves me so much" makes them very happy. In return, they too will start loving God our Saviour. So, we should be the demonstrators of genuine love.

4. We should teach for the heart that is not just an outward behaviour but whatever we are talking and we are doing must go into the heart of the student and create a sense of security. The only way to understand them is you have to create an impact which will definitely change the attitude and thinking in the heart of the student "a good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth good and evil man out of evil treasure of his heart brings forth evil". Thus, we should be more attached to the students so that they will be free to come and share their problems.

#### 5.Be humble and real:

Genuine humility and real faith inspire respect in students which in turn provides an amazing opportunity to influence them. We should always try to give the Best and teach them how God loves humble Personality. James 4:10. I Peter 5:6, Philippians 2: 3-11, I Peter 5:5 etc. are shown as examples. Pride goes before destruction, and a haughty spirit before fall as written in Proverb 16:18. I also used to share my testimony of How God lifted me in my career when I surrendered completely at the feet of God saying "God I am a big Zero and it is you who gave credits before it and lifted me. So, the first step is to humble ourselves before God in prayer.

#### 6. Encouraging:

Encouragement is so much more than praise, it actually means to make someone more determined, hopeful or confident. Our words and actions make our students more determined to do the best, more hopeful about their own growth and more confident about what they can accomplish.

#### 7. Develop a strong relationship with God and prayer :

Our relationship with God are the most important case to everything in our life including our working in the classroom outside the classroom whatever we do we can teach in our own path but we will only accomplish so much if you want real lasting impact that has to come from Him. He is the one that knows what our students' needs and He alone is the one that has to work in their hearts. We all know that a close relationship with God implies spending time reading. It is worth praying and thinking about His truth but this should be more than a ritual. It is really about asking God questions and listening to Him,; it is about getting to know His voice so that we can hear and distinguish it in our daily lives.

8. Wisdom and truth by thinking biblically no matter where you teach. you must always remember that what God tells us in His Word is the truth,

regardless of whether it is popular or whether anyone else agrees with it or not and that values are different than facts. This is the world's wisdom but it is wrong no matter what situation comes up, when you are with your students or whether it can be a drama practice or an outdoor camping activity, when the student comes to you if you want to lead student in the right direction, you have to start with a brief Biblical view of the situation to avoid allowing anyone to deceive oneself.

#### 9. Trust God not to be Afraid:

Teaching is stressful but this struggle should look a whole lot different for Christians than it does for non-Christians and that difference should provide a stark contrast and serve as an example, something non-believing students and colleagues will notice; something they will want. A Christian life should be marked by peace by trusting God in good times as well as bad by relying on His strength and resting in Him instead of leading to anxiety this way easier said

than done, but I think, too often we write it off as impossible, but nothing is impossible with God.

#### **10. Evidence the Fruit of the Spirit:**

The life of the teacher is a testimony. The power of such a testimony is Wow! Great. But this is not the pie-in-the sky idealism. This is what Christ wants from us. The fruit of the Spirit is Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faith, Self-control, as said in Gal:5 22-23.

I am closing with the prayer, "May God work in each of us to develop these traits, so that we can have a significant and lasting impact in our Students' hearts and lives".

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## Not a teacher but had to teach at home



At the 'ends of the earth' (Act. 1:8) people are waiting for the 'labourers' to come. The 'harvest is plentiful' (Lk. 10:2) but this kind of 'going' may call the witnesses to leave their comfort zone. There may be adventures but what drives us when we are called to the extent of facing great danger, suffering and making adjustments sometime to our traditional convictions too.

I was saved from a hostile religious family. As a result of growing up with fear and confusion in the early days of childhood, I had a foundation with a pessimistic view of life. I questioned my own existence and wanted to know the purpose of it. My religion could not answer my basic questions about life. After school, I went to college where I met students from different backgrounds and was exposed to multicultural ideologies. Despite cultural pressures, my being away from home allowed my attention in seeking the Truth. A believing student led me to the local students' Christian fellowship that was led by a college professor in his home where I heard about Jesus Christ and was encouraged to look for answers to my questions in the Bible.

When I read the Bible, I understood that Jesus Christ was different from other influential personalities of the world. I saw something special and unique in Him (Col. 2:9). Unlike others, He came into the world to give Himself to other people. His unselfish and sacrificial act on the Cross gave me hope of getting my issues addressed. I was looking for answers to many of my questions but to my surprise, He became the Answer. I inherited a new life by inviting Him to be my Lord and Saviour. I was born again, with new values that completely changed my world view (2 Cor. 5:17). No one in the world could bring happiness in my life like Him. The Lord's care was demonstrated through the fellowship

of student believers and number of professors from whom I learnt much on faith matters, got the strength to fight many life battles and began to see the need to share the good news with others.

My faith in Christ attracted a lot of opposition from my family members (2 Tim. 3:12). In the early 1990s, I had to leave my home town followed by, lifethreatening circumstances - not just for my safety, but also for those dear ones who mentored me because my family started bothering them too. With the help of believing friends and my mentors from my college days, I managed to continue in my faith journey. During that period, I sensed God's call to reach the people of my own former faith background not in India but in Central Asia. I mean to say that there are a large number of peoples' groups that are open to gospel after breaking away from the USSR and have not yet been reached for a long time.

The place where I was sent to had completely different ideologies and values. I began my cross-cultural mission journey with shock-aftershock. The information given during orientation was helpful in preparing myself mentally, but the ground reality was surprisingly bitter and taking a toll on my body regularly. I was not at all prepared for that kind of adventure. I wondered if the change from one region to another is so difficult for me. how much more was it for the Son of God moving from the Heavenly realm to Earth (Jn 1:14). However, His grace proved to be sufficient in learning a difficult new language, eating strange food, adjusting to extreme weather

conditions and above all adapting to a life style that conflicted with my culture while wrestling with the local ideologies.

Lot of stories to tell, but at this point, it is worth mentioning a bit about my marriage with a person of the land. Yes, it was a cross cultural marriage without calculating the cost and risks. I say that because I began to feel the pain when the time came for our third culture kid had to start his school. Because of our circumstances and the issues with growing hostility in the land, we were not prepared to send our son to the local school; not only for the reason that the medium of instruction was in the native language but also for the educational ideologies that we strongly disagreed with. So, we were very particular about English education with democratic values. A verv few schools were offering what we wanted but they were very expensive. We were left with no other option but to try educating our son ourselves at home.

Implementing this decision at home was not easy because we've been seeing our son at home all the time whereas all children in the neighbourhood were attending regular school of some kind. My wife began to cry as he didn't have the privilege of going to school. But other cross-cultural workers from the west who were already involved in home school learning encouraged us, guided us and helped us to get some basic school materials to begin the home schooling. The class began with short worship, memory verses and a short devotion every day. No exam, no evaluation and no datelines but

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somehow the systematic impartation of the knowledge happened. As parents, we could be around with him and we had an opportunity to learn many new things while being engaged with education of our son. It was a fun time for us as well. More than anything, we were blessed to have the Kingdom values becoming part of his daily curriculum.

While our son did well with the home school learning, we could also schedule our ministry with greater flexibility. Sometimes, when we had to travel far and for many days, we carried all his books and his learning was not interrupted. This exposure and experience enabled him to adjust with variety of new locations for his learning environment. Earlier, we were not very happy about home school learning of our son but looking back, we were happy to realise that the school followed him wherever he went. During very short trips when it was not worth spending for the family, I had to be away and sometimes it was quite a pressurizing situation for his learning, but as he grew older, he was left to do his lessons by himself just with my facilitation whether I am at home or not.

However, home school learning restricted his exposure to the secular world and we observed that he was deprived of connecting to the children of his age. He spent most of his time only with us and could connect only with some children through the fellowship and other adults who also had only kingdom impact on him. However, there was a crisis back at home which compelled us to return to my native place and our stay got prolonged. In that scenario, after much consultation with our mission board and consideration, after 7 years of his home school learning, we admitted our son in an international boarding school last year where he found it quite difficult to cope up with the corporate learning experience and also socializing with values that he brought into the school.

To our surprise, even that was interrupted due to the C-19 pandemic and we're happy to have him back at home but doing the online classes by the same school and not the curriculum of our choice. We are not sure about his further education will be. Handling his online classes is not stressful to us as we have experienced a similar atmosphere before except for the workload of higher classes. I'm sure with online classes all over, every parent must be feeling the same way we've been feeling while doing the home school for 7 years.

In spite of the home school commitment that kept me around the lessons during the day time, we've seen the following fruits of our labour from evening ministry and the weekends as scheduled to suit to the education.

- Number of fellowships planted are now fully equipped and growing under the native leadership.
- Short-term summer crusades run almost every year with overseas volunteers that got many to repent.
- Local young workers are equipped to reach people in their own

subculture and crossing the borders.

- An underground mission infrastructure has been developed to provide a base for the future work.
- Serving and supporting other workers in the network even with other organizations.
- Developing business ventures that can be run by believing communities for financial sustenance.
- Humanitarian work that includes caring for orphans and single women.
- An independent, nationally led students' mission movement with native workers on board.
- Regular counselling ministry to broken families and rehabilitation of young people suffering from issues.

There have been pressures and a number of instances to prompt us to leave the field for various reasons but with His help I continued to fight the good fight (2 Tim. 4:7-8).

At present, I am separated from the community due to C-19 and in my absence, the members in the body need a lot of encouragement. Due to a

lot of security issues, the region is becoming more sensitive to the good news and there have been a lot of restrictions implemented to the operation of the national workers. Many foreign workers had to leave the place due to conflicts with the change of policies designed specifically to curb the efforts. At present, the primary focus is to keep equipping the potential native workers in the field and if possible, to consider intensive training programs when away from the field. Facilitating systematic resourceful programs for them every year in either ways has become an inevitable timely need. We prayerfully hope that with such exposure, the trainees may get back to their communities to witness full-time or part time. I believe that by the time we achieve the goal, our son will be in the university. Appreciating the involvement of the readers of this article and other scattered members as enabled.

Home School Learning has become norm of education for every one now but with one main difference. Not all will prioritize the Kingdom Education with beginning of every lesson with the Word of God and have the children taste the goodness of Him before any other knowledge impartation. Kingdom Education at home was a blessing not only to our family but also to the extension of His Kingdom on this earth.
