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FROM THE **GENERAL SECRETARY'S** DESK



Dear readers of Chalk and Chai,

In the series of Kingdom Education or Christian Education, while the previous issues of Chalk and Chai focussed on Kingdom Education and Home and Kingdom Education and School, this issue of Chalk and Chai focuses on 'Kingdom Education and Church'.

The word *church* originated from the Greek term, "ekklesia" meaning "a called-out assembly." There is another term "kūrikón" in Greek which also refers to the church meaning "dedicated to the Lord." It is interesting to know that there are many titles and names for Church in the Bible. Church is the

Assembly of upright, Assembly of saints, Body of Christ, Bride of Christ, City of the Living God, Holy city; Holy Hill, House of God, Pillar and ground of Truth and so on and so forth. All these titles help us to understand that the Kingdom of God is not just the church but any local church is the vessel through which God brings His Kingdom to earth. By looking at the life of Jesus, the formation of the Early Church, and the entire Bible, we find "education" as a major theme. As God's reign is over all things, the church is meant to be a way for others to see life under the Kingdom.

Dr. Keith Springer, Professor or Educational Ministries, Indiana Wesleyan University emphasises that,

Christian Education is founded on the Teachings of Jesus.

Christian Education is focussed on the Spiritual Nurture of Children.

Christian Education is concerned with the total needs of individuals and groups and

Christian Education is a significant part of a well-balanced church ministry.

A well-balanced church will emphasize on each of the areas of ministry mentioned in the passage Acts 2:42-47, 51: evangelism, discipleship or teaching, fellowship, worship, and service. If a church fails to place an emphasis on any of these areas, it is unbalanced.

Through the legacy of the Church, we understand that the Christian Church played an important role in the field of education. These Churches became great centres of scholarship, art, literature and religious studies. While the Greeks and Romans only educated the elites, the Christian Church, valuing every human being equally, sought to educate everyone.

I would like to list a few in the time line of Education and Church:

The first Church champion of education was Augustine, the Bishop of Hippo (AD 354-430). The philosophy of education in the West is founded on Augustine's teachings - God is a rational being; not only the human soul but also the human mind are made in the image of God; God created humanity to be able to understand and govern creation. Upon these foundations of faith in God, the West built a cohesive culture based on logic, language and rational knowledge.

As a part of the Reformation, Martin Luther, in 1520 made an impassioned plea to the German Aristocracy. His "open letter to the Christian nobility." said, "I believe that there is no work more worthy of pope or emperor than a thorough reform of the universities." Others, including John Knox and John Amos Comenius joined Luther in universalizing education with the goal of an educated civil society. It was the Church, through the educational ministry, that united Europe under one world-view and produced history's first educated continent.

It was this culture of people educated by the Church that established the foundations of the nation-state, parliaments, democracy, commerce, banking, and higher education. Friars founded the educational institutions like the internationally renowned Cambridge and Oxford Universities which were built by the Church. And in nascent America, the first 123 colleges and universities - including Harvard, Princeton and Yale - were founded, funded and flourished as educational ministries of the Christian church. But leaping forward, to today's situation, we find the Church has basically forfeited its influence in education and has been relegated to the margins. The Administration is promoting chaos where we need order. Due to varied reasons the Kingdom education in many educational institutions, run by Churches and Christian organisations, is losing its flavour.

But remember that the Bible also portrays us as the Temple of the Living God (1 Cor. 3:16;2 Cor. 6:16). God dwells in us. We need to remember to do the things the church did when it was founded after the Holy Spirit was given. As Christian Educators, we, as ekklesia and kūrikón have to step into today's Chaos.

We are the Church.

- O Vineyard (Jer. 12:10) to be pruned.
- O Branch of God's planting (Isa. 60:21) to sow the seed of Truth in the lives of the young people.
- Flock of God (Eze. 34:15,1 Pet. 5;20) to obey the Shepherd.
- O Congregation of the poor (Ps. 74:19) to identify with the poor and needy.
- To bring others to fold of Christ (John 10:16).
- O God's building, as we labour together with God (1 Cor. 3:9) to build others.
- Family in heaven and earth (Eph. 3:15) to grow as a family of God.

ETF being a National Inter-denominational professional organisation encourages Christian Educators and denominations who have established schools and colleges to share their

testimony in Chalk and Chai. "Relevance of church in educating the community around" in relation to Mizoram and its context by Dr. L. N. Tluanga is quite challenging and motivating. The article, "Teacher - God's Craftsman" by Mrs. Vinni Thomas is very encouraging - every Christian teacher is blessed with many skills to work with and teach others as they strive to make in their students a dwelling place for God.

I would like to close with a popular song that will help us realize we have to move forward and upward as a Church in imparting Kingdom Education.

Relevance of Church in educating the community around

I feel much privileged to be requested by our General Secretary to write an article for the next issue of Chalk and Chai on the above topic. My writing will be mostly in relation to Mizoram and its context.

1. Formal Education in Mizoram was started by the Christian missionaries

The Mizo tribe/ people were regarded as ferocious head-hunters and the first Christian missionaries came during the last decade of the 19th century only. It was in the month of February 1898 that the first formal primary school was opened by the Welsh Presbyterian missionary, Rev D. E. Jones.

"On 15th February 1898, in celebration of his twenty-eighth birthday, Mr Jones opened a school on the verandah of his own house located in an area now known as Mission Veng in Aijal. *This was the first school of formal education in Mizoram which continued, grew and developed into a full fledged properly recognized school.*" (Ref. Report of Mizoram Education Reforms Commission, July 2010 p. 22). Earlier, two Baptist missionaries, had come to Mizoram in 1894 and introduced the Mizo alphabets using the Roman script in

line with the English alphabets but making necessary additions and subtractions.

2. Education was under the Church for many years

Let me continue with another relevant quotation from the above Report: "In February 1904, the Chief Commissioner of Assam, Sir Bonfyld Fuller, visited Aijal and inspected the School run by the Welsh missionaries. He was so impressed and delighted that he decided on the spot that the Government school for the military children established in 1893 should be handed over to the Missions with effect from 1st April 1904; and he appointed Rev Edwin Rowlands, as the first Hon-orary Inspector of Schools, for the whole of Lushai Hills. This was a momentous decision. From that year onwards, till the taking over of the schools by the District Council, Christian Missions were the official agencies of education among the Lushais for about 50 years" (ibid. p. 22). During this period, there was tremendous growth under the missionaries; so much so that by around 1950 all villages in Mizoram had their own Primary schools, some selected villages had Middle school also and all the

teachers were Church workers who were free from any form of corruption or dereliction of duties. With the taking over of education by the District Council and by the Assam and Mizoram Governments later, the standard of education in Mizoram appeared to decline slowly but surely, causing concern among parents and Church leaders. But the process was irreversible. However, in terms of number of schools, facilities and increase in the number of teachers, there continued to be tremendous growth mostly in quantitative terms which was, sadly, not matched by growth in qualitative terms in spite of increase in teacher training facilities and opportunities and many other technical growth and improvements.

Another factor contributing to the apparent decline in the quality of general school education was the popular trend to go for the 'so called English-medium' education at the elementary level, mostly at the turn of the century in the new millennium, leading many parents to go for this kind of education despite high fees charged by such private schools, neglecting the free education offered by the Government schools. In fact, parents cannot be blamed as the Govt schools were illequipped to provide quality education because of teachers' lethargy and lack of control by the Government machinery a sad state of affairs.

Till today, contribution of the Church in the maintenance of school education standard still very significant

In this respect also, the Church has come forward to open its own 'English-

Medium schools' with a difference under the control of local Church leaders in many villages. This has helped, to a great extent, to reverse the decline in the standard of education in Mizoram at the school level and the Synod Education Board has played a significant role in this respect through expert guidance and monetary assistance and also actual practical actions.

It may be pointed out here that, the first Middle school opened by the Welsh missionaries in the year 1907, handed over to the Assam Government in 1952, continuing under the Govt of Mizoram from 1972 to 2020, has been handed over back to the Mizoram Presbyterian Church Synod with mutual agreement on May 22, 2020. This is a very significant recent development in the field of school education in Mizoram. The name of this school, in Mizo, is SIKULPUI. It is not easy to find an equivalent word for this in English - it means the first/ formost/original and leading school of all.



4. Education remains an effective indirect means of evangelism in all the mission fields of the Church

It is generally said that the Mizo church is a mission church from its infancy. Evangelists and missionaries were sent out within a few years of the founding of the church by the missionaries. In fact, guite a number of church members went out on their own to Tripura, Manipur, Assam and even to Burma/Myanmar to preach the gospel in their own mother tongue to the ethnic Mizos there. Evangelical awakening occurred during the late 1950's and early 1960's which, although hampered by the Mizoram disturbances (1966-86), did not die down; so the Church continued to carry the gospel torch by forming a strong mission body bearing the name Synod Mission Board. At present, there are 17 mission fields - 2 inside Mizoram, 7 in the North-East region and 8 in Central India. Education remains in mission, an effective indirect evangelism tool so much so that in these 17 fields, we have 16 Primary, 9 Middle and 4 High schools manned by more than 900 evangelist teachers, both male and female.

Mizoram Presbyterian Church succeeded in opening Mizoram Christian College after several futile attempts

The threefold ministry of our Lord was *teaching*, *preaching* and *healing*. This is brought out clearly in Bible verses

like Matthew 4:23 & 9:35. In the ETF also. we emphasize the fact that our Lord Jesus was Master Teacher and teacher par excellence, and that of all his many titles, teacher was the most common and that he himself accepted this title as we read in John 13:13. As already pointed out above, the church in Mizoram has been giving importance and priority to education from the beginning; and in fact, the first College, called Aijal College was started in 1958 under the leadership of the missionaries. The Presbyterian Church Synod resolved to open a secular college (a fullfledged Theological College already in existence) in the year 1995; but for some reasons this could not be implemented for a number of years. At last, we have succeeded in actually opening and running the Mizoram Christian College (MCC) with effect from this new session; and providentially, the first Principal of MCC is the first President of ETF. Mizoram started in 1988 namely, Rev Dr Lalchungnunga, who served for many years as Principal of Serampore College – in fact, the longest serving Indian Principal of this prestigious college. It is our prayer that the Lord will be pleased to use this new MCC as a centre for ETF ministry and witness. ETF has been in existence in Mizoram since 1988 as stated above. We would appreciate the prayer support of the readers for Mizoram ETF to grow from strength to strength.





Leader, mentor, coach and builder are some of the titles of a teacher. Is a teacher a craftsman/crafts woman as well? According to Exodus 31: 1–11 and Exodus 35: 30-35, a young man by name Bezalel chosen by God as master craftsman to build the Tabernacle was given the 'ability to teach' (NIV). The Message Bible says, 'And He's (Yahweh has) also made him (Bezalel) a Teacher!!'.

The word 'Teacher' in this context draws our attention. Who was Bezalel? What was his profession before he was hand-picked by Yahweh to fulfill His purpose? Why did He choose him for the vast monumental project of making 'The Tabernacle'? Where did he get the training on craftsmanship? He would not have received it in the wilderness. Was he a skilled craftsman while making bricks to build the pyramid or the cities for the King of Egypt? We don't know.

Perhaps the skill set he had acquired in Egypt was suffice to serve the earthly king. But to construct Yahweh's dwelling place, 'The Tabernacle', according to His Instructions, Bezalel needed the anointing of the Spirit of God. The instructions were highly detailed, descriptive, included different types of materials, involved accurate measures and a wide range of workmanship.

When Yahweh finished presenting the blue-print of His dwelling place to Moses, whom I suppose was deeply troubled about how to go about raising the magnificent project (Moses was an amazing leader but not a craftsman), He said "See, I have personally chosen Bezalel son of Uri, son of Hur of the tribe of Judah. I have filled him with the Spirit of God, giving him skill and knowledge and expertise in every kind of craft.....he is an all-around craftsman. t only that, but I've given him Oholiab, son of Ahisamach of the tribe of Dan, to work with him. And to all who have an aptitude for crafts I've given the skills to make all the things I've commanded you: the Tent of Meeting, the Chest of The Testimony and its Atonement-Cover, all the implements for the Tent, the Table

and its implements, the pure Lamp stand and all its implements, the Altar of Incense, the Altar of Whole-Burnt-Offering and all its implements, the Washbasin and its base, the official vestments, the holy vestments for Aaron the priest and his sons in their priestly duties, the anointing oil, and the aromatic incense for the Holy Place—they'll make everything just the way I've commanded you" (Exodus 31:2-11; The Message)

We understand that God called Bezalel by name, filled him with the Spirit of God (the first person in the Bible about whom it is said as 'filled with the Spirit of God'!!), filled him with skills, ability and knowledge in all kinds of crafts to make artistic designs of Gold, Silver and Bronze, to cut and set Stones, to work in Wood and to engage in all kinds of craftsmanship. Over and above all these skills, he was a teacher to his fellow men and women too (Exodus 35:34).

Bezalel was thus a 'Craftsman' and a 'Teacher'. Craft is a skill or set of skills learned through experience. According to Johnson (1), every teacher is a craftsman or craftswoman as teaching involves knowing, planning, doing and reflecting. The duties of a teacher include performance in the classroom, engagement with learners, motivating students, designing novel assessments for students of different learning styles and abilities and evaluating. A Christian teacher does all these things as well as looks for opportunities to take students to Christ, mentoring and following them up as well.

Bezalel was given the exceptional skills to work with Gold, Silver, Bronze, Stone and Wood. The Message version says, 'They can make anything and design anything' (Exodus 35:35). As teachers, we have developed skills to teach students of different abilities and nature: brilliant, goal-driven, focused and disciplined (gold), a liitle lesser

qualities than the above mentioned (silver), hard noise makers who need to be brought to the track (bronze), who have a closed mindset(stones) and also who are soft and tender yet tough to make them shine (wood). We also have acquired skills to navigate through tough times, flexible to adopt quickly to changes and discernment to interact with parents, colleagues, leaders and the authorities of the organization.

Bezalel was gifted and filled with the Spirit of God to teach, lead and guide a large number of people to build the 'Tent of Meeting' where the presence of the God of the Universe dwelt among His people in the wilderness. It was also a place where the Israelites offered sacrifices and assembled as a community to listen to the voice of God and celebrated festivals. Like Bezalel, Christian teachers strive to make in their students a dwelling place for God.

We can say that every Christian teacher is a Bezalel, called by name, filled with the Spirit of God and with skills to do all kinds of work as craftsman, designer and embroiderer. Lord Jesus has endowed the believing teachers with wisdom to understand His instructions, discernment to solve many kinds of problems and multidimensional skills (Plan, Organize, Teach, Engage, Counsel and Mentor) to help learners not only to acquire knowledge, develop skills to face life's challenges and succeed but also to live a victorious Christian life.

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
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A Tribute to


