The hot summer this year indeed hit us hard. Hope the months in the next guarter of the year - July to September will be better months with good sunshine and less heat. I praise God for His faithfulness and grace that sustained all of us all these days and pray that God will enable us to continue serving Him faithfully. This year we have been focussing on Education and Creation, Education and Fall. Education and Redemption. and Education and Restoration. The theme of this issue is, "Education and Redemption". Under this theme, Dr. Vijay Chalagala in his article, addresses the Prevailing Issues in India's Teaching Community through Innovative Educational Programs." Mrs. Anita Lazarus in her article, emphasises the influence of Christian teacher is to bring redemption rather than a change in the lives of people. I would like to highlight a few reasons why Biblical values of redeeming time should be explicit in Christian Education.

Payment modes like Google Pay and Phone Pay have become more popular and convenient these days. Scratching for some surprises to avail of gift cards or rewards is an added attraction of using such payments. To claim a reward, we get the reward only when we redeem our gift card or promo code within a stipulated time. Otherwise, the time is expired to redeem the rewards.

Redeeming time is guite important in our day-to-day life. In Ephesians 5:15-17, Paul instructs, "See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord is". Other translations say, "Making the most of every opportunity" (NIV) or "making the most of your time" (NASB). Colossians 4:5 expresses something similar: "Walk in wisdom toward outsiders, making the best use of time." The Greek word translated as "redeeming" or "making the best use of" is *exagorazo*. Strong's Definition explains it as, "to buy up (ransom) or to rescue from loss (improve opportunity). We also see this word in Galatians 3:13 and 4:5 where it refers to Christ's redemption of us. So what

does it mean for us to redeem the time? Most simply, "redeeming the time" refers to stewarding our time in a way that glorifies God.

Time is Swift

Science and technology have advanced to detect changes taking place in the smallest time unit measured in zepto seconds (**10**²⁰ **seconds**) and units of time shorter than it is a yoctosecond and Planck time. Job too compares the rapid passage of time to the lightning-like movements of a weaver's shuttle. He says, "My days are swifter than a weaver's shuttle". In James 4:14, we read, "Why, you do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes".

Time has Limit

Each of us has a limited amount of time on this earth and none of us know how much of it we are allotted. Some years back, I came across an interesting article in a magazine. "My name is TIME. Right now I'm on the move measuring out your life. Men wait for me, submit to me, fear me but no one can stop me except God. God is the one who is in control of me. I'm running out and most men think that I'm on the move forever but I am not. When I stop and come to my end, you will go with me into eternity."

Time is Credit

One of the devotions in Our Daily Bread highlighted this wonderful thought. If we have a bank account that credits 86400\$ each morning, that carried over the balance from day to day and every evening cancelled whatever part of that amount we have failed to use, What would we do? Won't we draw out every cent? We have such a bank and its name is TIME. Every morning the Lord credits us with 86000 seconds and at night rules off as a loss whatever of this treasure you and I have failed to invest to a good purpose There is no going back. There is no drawing against tomorrow. We must live in the present on today's deposit. The tragedy is that we are working today by worrying about tomorrow and regretting yesterday. Someone had wisely said." Anxiety does not empty tomorrow; it empties today of its strength." Nothing drains our emotions and steals away our peace like borrowed troubles. God has made no provision in His plan to give us strength to bear the load of imagined burden which might come tomorrow. Yet His strength is sufficient for us one day at a time to finish the task set before us. This is what King Solomon in the book of Proverbs writes, "Be therefore not anxious about tomorrow for tomorrow will be anxious for the things of itself".

Time used for the Best

When God says we should be "redeeming the time," He wants us to live in constant awareness of that ticking clock and make the most of the time we have. Only God knows how much time each of us has on this earth to make decisions that will impact eternity (Psalm 139:16).

Jesus was diligent about keeping to His mission. Distractions were as prevalent then as they are now, but He let none of them deter Him from preaching and teaching God's Word(Luke 4:43). Though He spent only 33 years on this earth, Jesus changed the world forever because He redeemed the time. He taught His disciples the necessity of redeeming the time."We must work the works of him who sent me while it is day; night is coming when no one can work" (John 9:4).

Paul in his letter admonishes. "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth. (2 Timothy 2:15)

We can learn to redeem time by becoming **conscious** of the fact that we may not have another day. I am reminded of the song "Live Like You Were Dying" by Tim McGraw which is about redeeming the time. As Christians, we should live like we were dving and pursue all God has given us to do while we have time

She was pushed into the circle, clutching at her clothes, her eyes downcast; tears streaked her cheeks. When she looked up she only saw eyes of accusers, glaring with hate at her sinful lifestyle of prostitution. Her eyes darted sideways, desperate for a way out from the circle of pointing fingers. Insensitively they straightened her cowering figure to stand up, but her head remained bowed, before their eyes. That's how they brought her to Jesus. It was early morning, (John 8:2¹) as Jesus prepared to teach in the synagogue courts.

It was also the dawn of a new teaching and lifestyle to humanity. The New Covenant of Grace, announced God's heart of compassion; which focused on grace over punishment; to save, rather than condemn. (John 3:17)

Where does this fit into God's bigger narrative of Creation? Let's consider the four Acts in which creation unfolds:

God's Big Narrative.

In Act 1. Creation unfolds in all perfection & beauty, with the Image of God buried deep within the hearts and emotions of Adam and Eve: plus interaction between God and His people: as well as horizontally among people. In Act 2: The Fall from God's favour through disobedience, brought a dramatic and seemingly irreversible destruction of the beauty and perfection of creation. Its symbols are brokenness, pain, alienation. Act 3 presents Redemption won through Jesus' death and resurrection: resurrection with the possibility of a new creation (2Cor.5:17) till the next and last act of God's narrative is in place. Its symbols: Grace, freedom from bondage as a gateway into the wholeness and beauty of a new creation: for all families, from every ethnic group, tribe, and language, as well as every period of history. Its symbols: hope. In Act 4, full Restoration anticipates a glorious conclusion to God's story of creation, in which His Perfect Kingdom comes down to earth from heaven (Rev 22: 1-5). Its symbols will be:

The *joy* of continuously worshipping in God's presence; a place from which all sorrow, alienation and pain are banish*ed*. (*Workbook*: Beyond Duct Tape-Shari Thomas and Tami Resch Pg 27 Publishers Parakaleo)

Jesus is the chief actor in the last two Acts of God's narrative! He enters human history as a 1st century Jewish carpenter's 'son' who lived in Galilee. As an adult he becomes a rabbi with the single aim of redeeming the relationship between God and His people, in preparation for the final restoration of Gods rule on earth.

How does the story of the woman caught in adultery fit into Act 3 of God's narrative, in which Jesus initiates redemption? Let's consider Jesus' unmatched way of educating both the bystanders as well as the woman herself in the new and more complete interpretation of existing laws. Instead of laws, it shone a light on the heart of God.

Before both the accusers and accused, the record says " ... he said unto them, he that is without sin among you, let him first cast a stone at her." (John 8:7). Jesus in his inimitable way shifts the scene to the vertical plane, bringing the Mosaic Law into the context of God's story in its current phase of redemption (Matt. 5:21-22). Jesus took them straight to the Supreme Court where God, the Chief Justice presides, in which, all that Moses taught is not negated, but superseded by the authority of the Chief Justice, who requires a transformation of their hearts in keeping with redemption. The accusers understood that they stood at the same base line in God's sight as the woman, but their allegiance to the old as well as the personal pride that comes from self-righteousness held them back from embracing the new. Then Jesus proceeds to teach about the horizontal dimension: to re-establish the vertical link to a God of Grace and forgiveness. that would restore the dignity of the Image of God in the woman. He also teaches horizontally to prise the woman's accusers out of their mind-set of judgement and condemnation, challenging them to leave self-righteousness, to show grace and mercy to the woman instead, as she was forgiven by the highest legal authority in creation. It was a new perspective of God's heart to the sinner.

One by one they dropped the stones of judgement and slunk away as they realised no condemnation is final before the Throne of Grace.

The **woman** on the other hand catches a glimpse of mercy, grace and compassion extended towards her, which changes her at the core; something impossible under the old law. She is absolved of her past and told gently to go and change her lifestyle. The tarnished image of God is redeemed in her, through a second chance that restored the original image imprinted in her heart.

How do our stories as educators, fit the season of Redemption in the big tapestry God is weaving?

Let's trace teaching and learning through the first two Acts of God's tapestry.

In the creation phase, all teaching and learning came to Adam and Eve through their intimate connection with their Creator God. Satan's deceptive reasoning that led to their disobedience, changed this, and they entered the Falleffect. They exerted autonomy, and chose to trust their own reason rather than God's instruction. In human history too post-fall, the search for knowledge originated as a preserve of elite religious groups (through the monks in Europe and through gurus & pundits in India). Their focus was to learn about God. With the Enlightenment in the1700 and 1800 s; the focus of learning shifted from God, to the admiration of human beings and the wonder of their abilities. This cut the teaching-learning process loose from its God-centered focus, setting it adrift in a human centered world. In today's postmodern, post Christian world, the emphasis on knowledge, reason and human abilities, continues to accelerate the drift

To say that education and learning is expanding very rapidly today, would be an understatement, as all barriers of speed, scope, access and systems are broken, through the internet and AI. This has resulted in the proliferation of knowledge and information, but it is 'headless' content adrift from the God whose *mind* and *character* is the template for all knowledge! It reduces knowledge to mere information that lacks moral tethers, direction or character. Those who limit education to subject content, are beheading it, as they pass on knowledge, without passing on mind and intention of the God in whom that knowledge originated.

Let us re-consider this quote:

'Without an education that writes God's word upon human hearts, the voice of the brainwashed mob becomes the voice of the devil." (The Third Education Revolution- Pg 33)

Change or Redemption?

Change is easy. Educational content continues to change repeatedly with every wind of thought, culture and society. The question is: How can teaching and learning be redeemed to anchor vertically on the Truth and experience of God? This is the only focus with the power to radically alter at the core, a person or a system of education. It holds the potential for permanent change in a person, group, or nation. In this day of drift. education must works to redeem the forgotten Imprint of God's Character in the heart of His people, (The Third Education Revolution-Pgs.40, 41) so that they outwork it horizontally in relationships and the quality of their work.

Born to influence:

God is the most influential person in the universe. The godly teacher made in His Image, likewise influences learning as well as classroom culture. Like Daniel, this comes from the daily time one spends soaking in God's Word, allowing it, along with prayer, to shape one and be enabled by the Holy Spirit's presence.

Influencing culture:

The teacher demonstrates a classroom 'culture' that students can admire, embrace and follow. It becomes an invisible hidden curriculum that the students absorb and imitate. They only care about learning when they perceive they themselves are being cared for first.

Above reproach:

Of course the quality of our work also speaks louder than words. Like Daniel (Dan 6:4) who was neither corrupt nor negligent, rather, a person of integrity and competence. Who we are at the core of our being will influence the quality of our work. In this way, others glimpse in

us, as they did in Daniel, the God of excellence whom we serve.

Prepared to respond with Grace:

The subject content taught is prescribed by the textbook. However Christian teachers need to be clear about the Biblical World View and how it links to God, the source of the subject being taught. Being sure of this prepares them for **questions** about *choice* and different beliefs. Answers involving *God's intelligent design* in nature as well as *His perfect Blueprints* for relationships can then be presented when asked for, with gentleness, respect (1 Peter 3:15-17) and clarity.



Conclusion:

In conclusion then, let's consider Nehemiah's challenge to the returning exiles: "....Come, let us rebuild the wall of Jerusalem, and we will no longer be in disgrace." A city without walls was vulnerable to marauders; so is teaching and learning without boundaries that protect, contain and give it direction. When the next generation is not nurtured to know the source of the knowledge and information they learn, It endangers God's legacy. Teachers, arise and build!
